- The Network of the National Library of Medicine (NNLM) is comprised of 7
 Regional Medical Libraries, 3 Offices, and 3 Centers (ROCs), all working to
 advance the progress of health in the US by sharing information from the
 National Library of Medicine.
- Employees of the NNLM work on local and regional initiatives, as well as those at the national level. Working groups and interest groups exist for cross ROC collaboration to help further the mission of NNLM at the national level.

SEIG history and development

- Formed after many different regions of the NNLM started to host library school interns.
 - NNLM wanted to simplify, standardize, promote, and expand its work with students, especially those from underrepresented backgrounds.
 - Ad hoc group grew into a formal interest group as many areas of collaboration and knowledge sharing were identified: standardized projects and curriculum for internships, general engagement with LIS programs, and promotion of health science librarianship to students.

NNLM sponsored several students from the University of Kentucky to work with NNLM information professionals on a creative project for their alternative spring break.
