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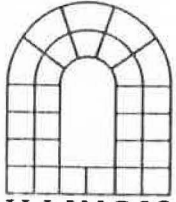

BLOOMINGTON, ILL.--Illinois Wesleyan University faculty Barbara Hedlund, Mark Hansen and William West will present a recital at 8 p.m. Sunday, Feb. 10, in Westbrook Auditorium of Presser Hall.

The program, which will be open free to the public, also will be presented at 7:30 p.m. Feb. 8 in Dvorak Auditorium at Eastern Illinois University.

Presented in memoriam to cellist Samuel E. Mayes (1917-1990), the program will include "Sonata No. 1, Op. 5" by Beethoven, "Fantasia Concertante, Opus 256" by Czerny and "Sonata in g minor, Opus 19" by Rachmaninoff.

Hedlund is principal cellist for the Springfield-Bloomington Symphony, the Champaign-Urbana Symphony, Illinois Chamber Orchestra and Peoria Opera Orchestra. She is founder, director and soloist for the String Society in Champaign as well as soloist and coordinator for the Wesleyan Chamber Players and Camerata Chamber Orchestra. She has been teaching at Wesleyan five years.

Hansen has performed extensively throughout the United States and abroad. He has been an adjudicator for many competitions and is the author of an article on "The Catalan School of Pedalling." He is in his second year at Wesleyan.

West, a member of the faculty since 1982, was a Young Artist Winner at West Virginia University in 1980 where he was an honor graduate. He also received a Presser Scholarship in 1980. He has extensive experience in piano accompanying, in competition and performance.

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
