The Winter Term of eight weeks opened February 23rd, with Miss Madolyn McIntyre teaching. The enrollment was as follows: 1 in the 1st grade; 1 in the 2nd grade; 2 in the 4th grade; 1 in the 5th grade; and 1 in the 6th grade.

The Spring Term of 8 weeks opened April 26th and closed June 18. The only pupil receiving credit for perfect attendance for the entire year was Laura Farnsworth.

The Fall Term of sixteen weeks opened September 6th, with Mrs. Inez Torrey teaching. The enrollment at the beginning of the term was 5 but later dropped to 3, which will undoubtedly be the attendance for the balance of the year.

Normal progress has been made in all grades during the year with regular promotions at the end of the year in June.
