The enrollment in the school at the opening in September was: Grade II, 2; Grade III, 1.

The school financial statement shows total credits of \$727.67 with expenditures of \$786.71 and an overdrawn amount of 59.04. By law the overdrawn account will be carried forward into next year's budget. The overdrawn account is the result of the town of Bedding-

ton receiving less money from the State School Fund than had been anticipa ed. The State Department of Education has ruled that because your school is operating on a half-time basis that you shall receive approximately one-half subsidy in place of the full subsidy you would receive it your school operated at full time. The above ruling was made known to us this past Summer, and therefore your Superin endent recommended to the School Committee that the best procedure was to operate on the budget as set up until another Town Meeting, even though it would from necessity produce a small overdrawn account.

Owing to the small enrollment of your school it is necessary that in your annual Town Meeting or at a special Town Meeting you vote upon an article to approve keeping the Beddington school open. Investigation shows that the present plan of operation is the most economical unless we can pay tuition to another town for your pupils and finance their conveyance, or board and room at a figure which is considerably less than you are now paying your teacher, or until such time that the S ate Department of Education refuses to grant us the special permission of operating your school on the basis of one-half time. Your School Committee and Superintendent at this time feel that the only policy is to plan to con inue under the present set-up even though we may be forced to change to a full time school later on, or if it seems more advisable at a later date to transport or board your pupils elsewhere. The budget estimales for the coming school year have been prepared with the above idea in mind. If we continue to operate according to the present set-up the amount recommended should take care of the school expenses for the year 1949-50.

As was predicted a year ago the amount will of necessi y be somewhat greater than last year. This is due to three things—no unexpended amount to carry

forward as was true last year; an overdrawn account of \$59.04; the fact that anticipated subsidy from the State will be on a one-half time basis like your school.

In closing, I wish to express my appreciation to the members of the school committee, teachers, citizens, and pupils for the cooperation they have accorded me during the year.
