Annual Warrant

To George Moore, Constable in the town of Bowerbank in the County of Piscataquis: GREETINGS:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the town hall Monday, March 16, 1936 at 9.30 A.M. to vote on the following articles to wit:

- Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside over said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.
- Art. 3. To hear all reports that may legally come before said meeting.
- Art. 4. To choose three Selectmen, assessors, and overseers of the poor.
 - Art. 5. To choose a Town Treasurer.
 - Art. 6. To choose one or more School Committee
 - Art. 7. To choose a Town Auditor.
 - Art. 8. To choose a Town Agent.
- Art. 9. To choose a Tax Collector and to fix his compensation.
 - Art. 10. To choose all other necessary officers.
- Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of schools.
- Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for school books.
- Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will raise for salary of Superintendent of Schools.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of poor.
- Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Public Health Nurse.
- Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Contingent Expense.

- Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise for care of cemetery.
- Art. 18. To see if the town will raise \$500 to finish paying note and interest on same.
- Art. 19. To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid as provided in Section 20 Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930.
- Art. 20. To see what sum the town will appropriate for State Aid Road construction in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provision of Section 19, Chapter 28 Revised Statutes of 1930 or under the provisions of Section 3 Chapter 173, Public Laws of 1935.
- Art. 21. To see if the town will appropriate and raise money and what sum for the maintenance of State and State Aid highways during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Section, 9, 18, 36, 37, and 38 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, which provides for the proper maintenance at the joint expense of the town and state of highways and State Aid highways.
- Art. 22. To see what sum of money the town will raise for cutting bushes on State Aid road in addition to the amount raised for the maintenance of such road.
- Art. 23. To see if the town will raise a sum of money not less than \$44 as required by the State for the maintenance of third class road.
- Art. 24. To see what sum of money the town will raise for snow removal.
- Art. 25. To see what sum of money the town will raise for the repair of highways, and bridges.
- Art. 26. To see if the town will raise money to buy a road grader.

- Art. 27. To see if the town will raise money for cost of snow plow and adding wing to plow.
- Art. 28. To see what sum of money the town will raise for insurance on public buildings.
- Art. 29. To see if the town will raise a sum of money to have the description of the property of all tax payers put on the town books.
- Art. 30. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to hire money to pay all necessary expenses until sufficient taxes are collected.
- Art. 31. To see what action the town will take on requiring any one owing taxes or any other debt to make some payment on such debt when receiving money from the town.
- Art. 32. To see if the town will vote to fix a date when all taxes shall be due and payable.
- Art. 33. To see if the town will vote to charge interest and what rate on all taxes remaining unpaid after the date fixed by article 32.
- Art. 34. To see what sum of money the town will raise for High School Tuition.
- Art. 35. To transact all other business that may legally come before this meeting.

You are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town by posting an attested copy of this warrant at the town hall and post office in said legally come before said meeting.
