

ANNUAL TOWN WARRANT

To Sadie Uuthbertson, Constable in the town of Bowerbank, in the County of Piscataquis, Greetings:

In the name of the State of Maine you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town, qualified to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall, Monday, March 26, 1945 at 10:30 A. M., to vote on the following articles, to wit:

Article. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside over said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk.

Art. 3. To hear all reports that may legally come before said meeting.

Art. 4. To choose three Selectmen, Assessors and Overseers of the poor.

Art. 5. To choose a Town Treasurer.

Art. 6. To choose one or more School Committee.

Art. 7. To choose a Tax Collector and fix his compensation.

Art. 8. To choose all other necessary officers.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of schools.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise for salary of Superintendent of Schools.

Art. 11. To see what sum of money the town will raise for support of poor.

Art. 12. To see what sum of money the town will raise for Public Health Nurse.

Art. 13. To see what sum of money the town will raise for incidental expense, town office expense, Selectmen and other town officers.

Art. 14. To see what sum of money the town will raise for care of cemetery.

Amount raised 1944 \$10.00 Amount expended \$16.80 Recommended 1945 \$15.00 Art. 15. To see what sum of money the town will raise for insurance on town hall. Amount 1944 \$37.50

Art. 16. To see what sum of money the town will raise for snow removal.

Amount raised 1944 \$200.00 Amount expended \$335.85 Recommended 1945 \$300.00

Art. 17. To see what sum of money the town will raise, not less than \$34.00 as required by the State, for the maintenance of third class road.

Art. 18. To see if the town will raise money and what sum, for the maintenance of State and State Aid Highways, during the ensuing year, within the limits of the town, under the provisions of Sections 9, 18, 36, 37, and 38 of Chapter 28 of the Revised Statutes of 1930, which provides for the proper maintenance at the joint expense of the town and State of Highways and State Aid Highways.

Art. 19. To see what sum of money the town will raise for cutting bushes on State Aid road, in addition to the amount raised for the maintenance of such road.

Art. 20. To see if the town will vote to be included in the Forestry District for fire protection. Art. 21. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to procure a temporary loan or loans in anticipation of taxes for the purpose of paying obligations of the town; such loans to be paid during the current municipal year out of money raised during said current year by taxes.

Art. 22. To see if the town will vote to choose a budget committee for 1945.

Art. 23. To see what action the town will take on requiring anyone owing taxes or any other debt, to make some payment on such debt when receiving money from the town.

Art. 24. To see if the town will vote to fix a date when all taxes shall be due and payable.

Art. 25. To see if the town will vote to charge interest, and at what rate, on all taxes remaining unpaid after the date fixed by Art. 24.

Art. 26. To see if the town will vote to give a discount on taxes paid by a date fixed by this article, and at what percent.

Art. 27. To transact all other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session at the Town Hall at 10 A. M. for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters. You are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town by posting an attested copy of this warrant at the Town Hall and the Post Office in said town, seven days before said meeting.
