#### TOWN WARRANT

To Robert Peterson, Constable in the Town of Bowerbank, in the County of Piscataquis, GREETINGS:

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT

#### COMMENTS

Re: Audit of Accounts — Town of Bowerbank February 2, 1946, to February 1, 1947

#### Cash

A detail examination of all cash receipts and bank deposits indicated that the cash recorded as received had been accounted for properly and promptly deposited in the bank.

Cash on deposit and subject to check at the Merrill Trust Company on February 28, 1947, plus a later deposit, reconciled with the cash balance as reflected by the records of the treasurer.

#### Accounts Receivable

The items in this account are due from other municipalities for the care of poor and from the State for bear bounties.

#### Taxes Receivable

The examination made of the records of the collector and assessors indicated that they were in agreement. The total 1946 tax commitment was accounted for in full by cash and discounts allowed for the early payment of taxes.

The tax lien and deed accounts remain the same as the previous year.

#### Surplus

At the end of the year under examination, the records indicated that the town had a surplus of \$2,107.20. Of this amount, \$1,129.90 represents appropriation balances carried forward to the 1947 municipal year, leaving \$977.30 not appropriated for any specific purpose. The increase in surplus over the previous year was due to unexpended balances lapsed and other unappropriated revenue.

#### Trust Funds

The savings books representing investment of the cemetery perpetual care and the ministerial and school funds were examined and it was noted that interest earned and withdrawals had not been entered for several years.

The interest received on the bond investments of the ministerial and school fund was applied to the school account. The bonds were not examined, but the treasurer advised that they were in possession of Attorney Francis C. Peaks of Dover-Foxcroft.

As the interest on the bonds is received direct from New York City, they apparently are not coupon bonds.

#### General

The examination made of paid bills and payrolls indicated that, with few exceptions, all were on file.

The excise tax collections were verified by examination of the copies of receipts retained by the collector.

Corporate surety bonds were furnished by the tax collector and the treasurer and these bonds appeared to be adequate.
