"Through the Flyer Promise Scholarship program, my advisers have prepared me for success. My cohort is also my first group of friends at UD, and our relationship makes UD feel like home."

When we started the Flyer Promise Scholars program four years ago, we made a commitment to high-achieving, underserved students. With the help of institutional aid and generous private support, we promised that we would eliminate the financial barriers they faced in attending UD and support them in fulfilling their dream of a college degree. Today, of the 42 students in the first class, 40 are on the cusp of graduation. Overall, the program boasts a remarkable 99 percent retention rate.

Flyer Promise is but one shining example of how gifts open the doors of opportunity and support student success. Beyond scholarships, gifts help fund experiential learning opportunities, physical and mental health resources, or any of a number of programs that help all of our students learn and thrive.
