The older men of La Alberca wear for ceremonial occasions a circular cape of black broadcloth. A flat collar, shaped at the outer edge in shallow, inverted scallops, covers the shoulders. This cape is worn over a cloak (anguarina) of black cloth which is lined with red flannel and fastened with a silver clasp. Neither the cape nor the cloak is hemmed at the bottom. The modern form of cape, made with an upper cape of waist length and an upstanding collar, is worn without a cloak. Hats of black felt, leggings (polainas) of black cloth, and the traje serrano complete the costume.

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
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
