Research Method

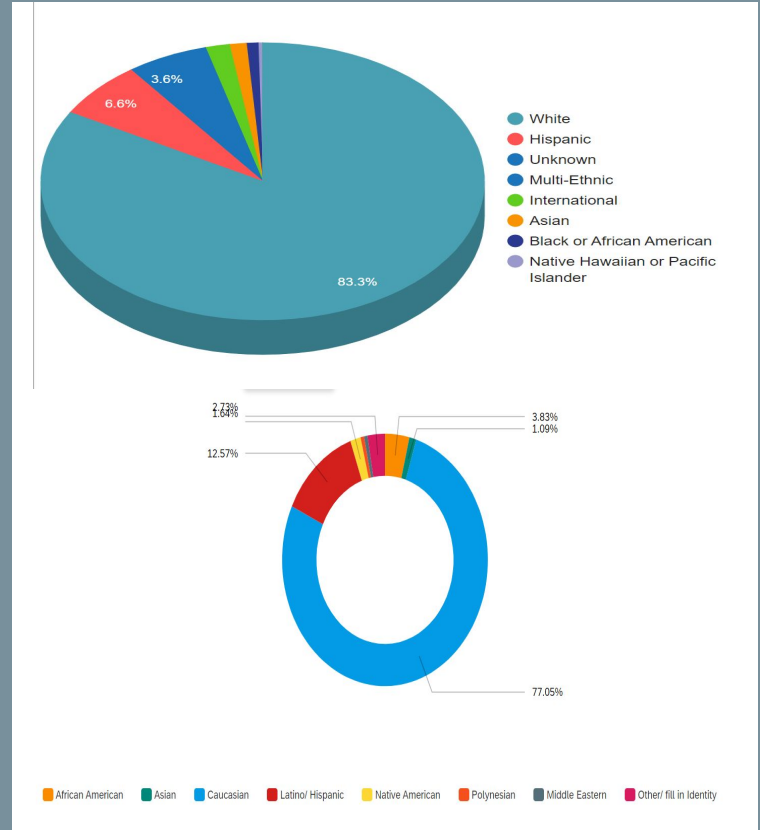


- Focused on Utah State Universities campus

Data collection

- Qualtrics to collect and analyze data.



Research Findings

- We found African American, Hispanic and Biracial students typically male did not feel respected or in the middle with the faculty here at USU like student's teachers.
- Equal opportunities as other students on campus. We found with this question unlike the one before Latinos and Hispanics, Native American and Biracial answered this one more negatively than the other Races.
- There were only two groups that voted more negatively than others through out the survey, which were Biracial students and Latinos or hispanics.
