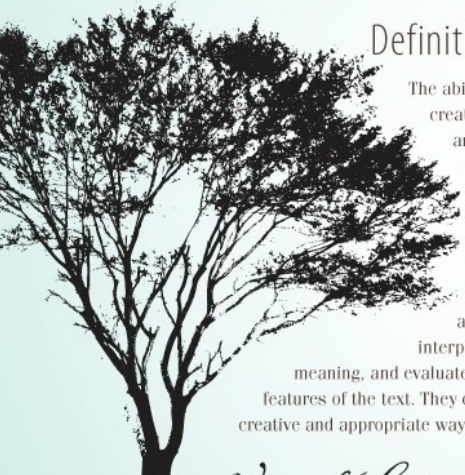

Definition

The ability to decode, interpret, create, question, challenge and evaluate texts that communicate with visual images as well as, or rather than, words. Visually literate people can read the intended meaning in a visual text such as an advertisement or a film shot, interpret the purpose and intended meaning, and evaluate the form, structure and features of the text. They can also use images in a creative and appropriate way to express meaning.

Implementing Institutional Visual Literacy, A Call to Action

In their article, *Visual Literacy, an Institutional Imperative* (2006), Susan Metros and Kristina Woolsey state:

Institutions can take three steps to accelerate the adoption of new visual literacies consistent with their goals:

1. **Multimodal fluency:** teach a basic visual design vocabulary.
2. **Design context:** Provide the places, people, and resources needed for those in the academic community to become visual producers.
3. **Visual judgment:** Develop constructive critics of visual information.



Survey

To answer this call to action, I conducted a survey designed to measure Visual Literacy knowledge amongst the UC Irvine Libraries' Reference Staff; resulting data informed my planning process for developing a training rubric for our librarians so that they will be equipped to teach and promote visual literacy on campus.

UC Irvine Librarians and Reference Staff rated the following as the most important image-based research skill...



25% of UC Irvine Reference Staff and Librarians surveyed strongly agreed that they were confident in their ability to create and manage digital images.

Methodology

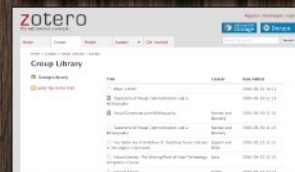
1. Root Visual Literacy in Campus Curricula through the Embedded Subject Librarian
