In recognition of his "outstanding service to the profession and distinguished contributions to public affairs," Mr. Seidman received the Institute's 1956 Annual Award.

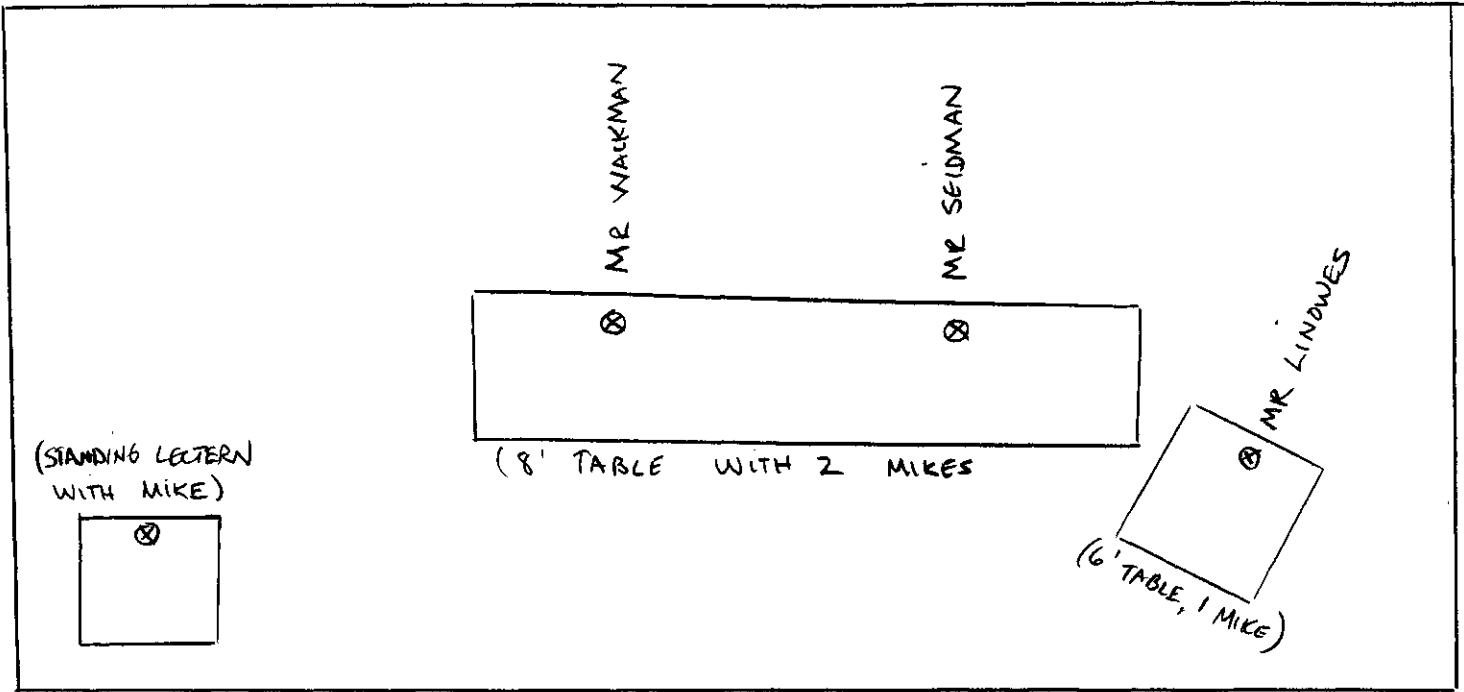
He is a past president of the New York Society of CPAs, and a past vice president of the American Accounting Association.

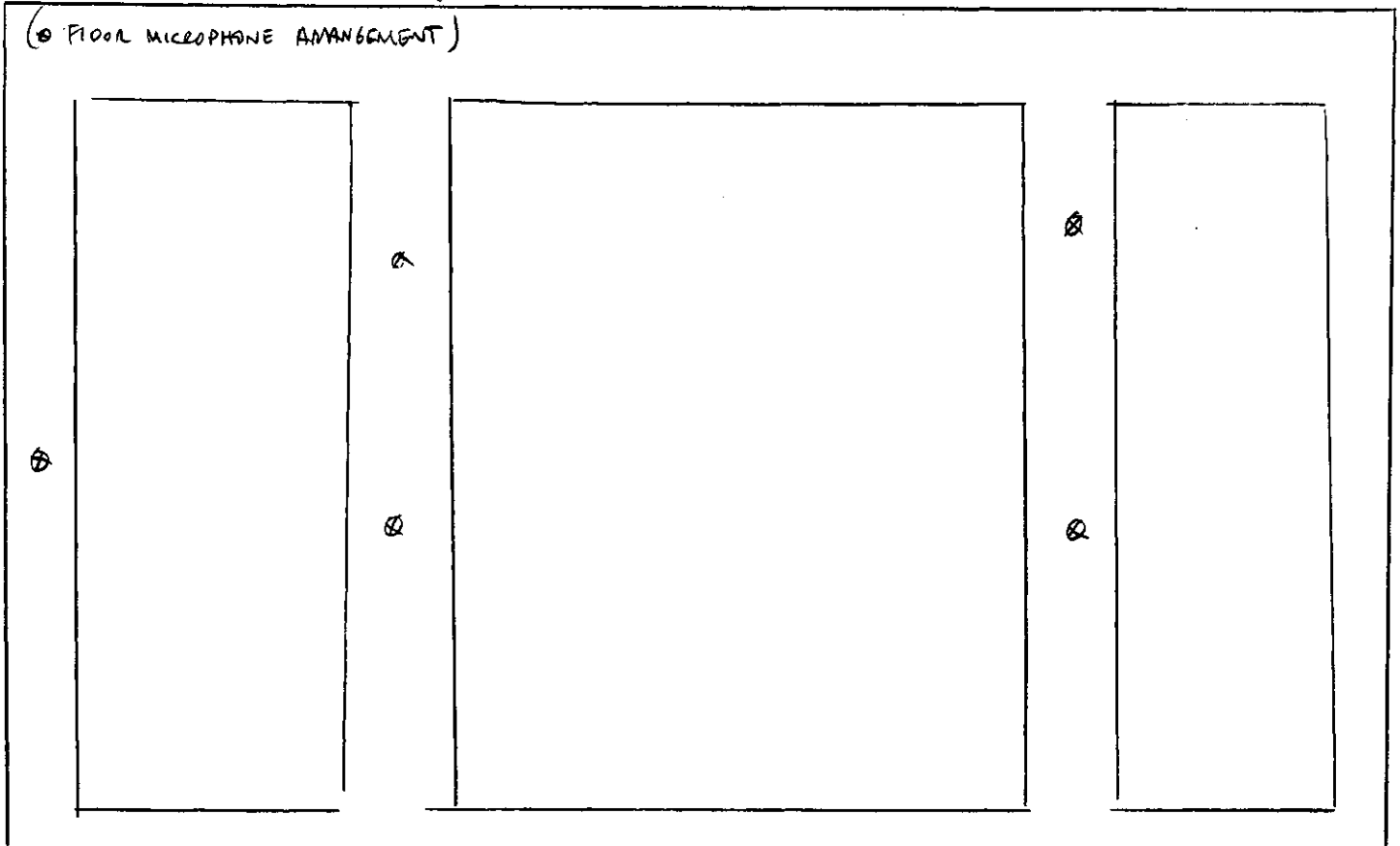
"THE STRUCTURE OF THE PROFESSION" -- BAL MASQUE/MEDALLION
