My name is Abigale Mallery and I am a painter. I was born in Memphis, TN but I have moved a bit around Tennessee and I lived in Texas for a while.

Which professors inspired you the most?

<u>Philip Jackson</u>, <u>Kariann Fuqua</u>, and <u>Brooke Alexander</u> have been my pillars. They have helped me in a million ways and I can honestly say that it is because of them that I can paint and create the way I do.

What has been your favorite class during your years here?

Honestly, all of the sculpture classes were from beginning to advanced. The processes are so fun and the sculpture area has such a good vibe.

Could you describe a favorite memory here in the department?
