Three "Need" Scenarios

- "I need a couple of articles for this course paper.
 It is not in my major area. I just need some sources!"
- "I know the paper/book/resource I need. How do I find it?"
- "I'm doing a research project in my major. I need to find a topic, research what's been done, and write a proposal. Where do I start?"



First Scenario = RooSearch

RooSearch is like Google for UMKC Libraries.

It is the search box in the middle of the UMKC Libraries homepage.

Type a few terms in the box and click the "RooSearch" button.

Let's try it out <u>right now</u>.



Second Scenario = Catalog or Database

Your choice depends on the type of resource.

Examples:

- Book? Start with Library Catalog
- Movie/Recording/Music Score? Library Catalog again
- Journal article title and/or author? Choose Databases
- Journal article specific issue and page number? Check Journal Finder

Let's try out a few of these examples <u>now</u>.



Third Scenario = Subject Databases

Subject databases:

- can give you results of extremely high relevance to your search.
- have powerful tools for both surveying a topic and refining searches
- have a learning curve in order to use effectively
- vary in interface from database to database

Individualized assistance from a librarian can improve your results and make you a better independent searcher.

Let's <u>look at a couple</u>.

UMKC Libraries has <u>interlibrary loan services</u> (ILL in librarian-speak) to obtain almost any book, conference paper, or article you need.


ILL is relatively painless, fast (24-72 hour turnaround on article requests, 7-10 days on books), and FREE for your use.

If you were not a student, paywall access can cost upwards of \$50-75 per ARTICLE for research.


