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Arguments Against Romance

- Appeals to prurient interests
- Encourages women's dependence on men
- Encourages passive behavior
- Discourages feminist action

Arguments for Romance

- "Escape" from problems
- Exploration of sexuality
- Portrays strong female characters
- Reinforcement of "feminine" values

Method

- Survey distributed to 126 Missouri public libraries
- 43% response rate (as of October 1)
- Respondents:
 - 51 female, 3 male
 - Modal age category, 50-59 (35%)
 - Modal education level, MLS (46%)


Service Response

 - Basic Literacy (10)

Mean Size of Collection










Staff Comments about Romance Reading Patrons




Romance Novels are Very Popular, High Circulating Items




Romance Novels Show Women as Strong, Active Characters that Forge Their own Destinies




Romance Readers are Less Educated Than Those Who Read Other Kinds of Fiction




Romance Readers Learn Attitudes and Behaviors from Romance Novels




