

Migration in Missouri 1950-1960

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COLUMBIA, MISSOURI

Counties With Largest City 5,000 or Less

This category includes counties with a predominantly rural population. The census definition of *rural* includes all residents of towns under 2,500 and persons living in the open country and in the areas of the state outside the suburbs and metropolitan centers. The towns of from 2,500 to 5,000 have had either a small increase or a small decrease in population. Thus their influence on population change in the county has been only one of stabilizing. These towns may absorb some short-distance migration from the surrounding area, but due to lack of economic opportunities they do not act as a major pulling force. Neither do they retain the *natural increase*, with the result that counties included in this category are generally characterized by out-migration. Many of these towns are located in the southeastern Ozarks and the northeast and northwest areas of the state.

This category is represented by the largest number of counties and serves as a residual category.

In Missouri there is a large amount of diversity influencing the above generalizations. The diversity affecting migration can be reduced to three major types:

1. Counties which have armed forces bases in them. The personnel at the bases were first counted in the 1960 census. Thus, this change in procedure gives an exaggerated picture of the 1950-1960 migration. In addition, these bases present an unusual situation in and of themselves. The counties in Missouri containing such bases are Pulaski and Johnson; there are smaller bases in a few other counties with small to inconsequential effects on migration rates.

2. Counties which contain a state college (and, in one case, the state government) have had less out-migration than those counties in comparable situations. The majority of the institutions are located in cities of over 10,000 population, and these cities have shown less out-migration or more in-migration than other cities of comparable size.
3. The counties which have large lakes and have become established as recreational centers have experienced less out- or more in-migration than the surrounding counties. Camden and Taney Counties are the principal recreational counties.

APPENDIX

The migration rates presented in the following tables are for the 1950-1960 decade. These rates can be used to project expected population for future dates assuming that the present trend continues. These rates also apply to persons already born, so no assumptions are made about the birth rates in the future; however, the death rates for the 1950-1960 decade have been utilized in these projection rates. Hence, these rates should prove useful for those who are concerned with the future composition of their county or area.

It is possible that reversals of these migration patterns can occur, but, for the most part, a continuing trend in the existing patterns can be expected.
