Registration, Labeling, Inspection, and Sale of Commercial Fertilizers; 1929

REPORT OF THE CHEMIST

L. D. HAIGH

The registration, labeling, inspection, and sale of commercial fertilizers in Missouri is by State law under the administration of the Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station, F. B. Mumford, Columbia, Missouri.

The Chemist of the Experiment Station is charged with the duty of analyzing the samples of fertilizer obtained in the work of inspection and reporting upon the same. The present report includes the results of analysis on the samples collected in the fall season of 1929, while the analysis of the spring collected samples are reported in Bulletin 276. This report also presents summaries of the entire year's analyses as regards valuations, deficiencies, legal violations, kinds and quantities of fertilizer used in the state by counties, etc.

This report aims to be a manual of instruction for fertilizer users of the state setting forth much interesting and valuable information as it pertains to the situation in Missouri. A careful reading of these reports is recommended to all who desire to know how to judge fertilizer on the basis of its composition which is the true index of its value.

INSPECTION

Samples obtained in the work of inspection in the spring numbered 113. Twenty-seven towns in 18 counties were visited at this time. During the fall season 141 towns in 62 counties were visited and 367 samples were collected. Besides visiting dealers in the towns, stocks of fertilizers were inspected in cars on sidings and in the farmers' barns out in the country where it had been hauled after having been unloaded at the shipping point.

The work of inspection includes the listing of all brands found in order to determine if same are registered; the examination of all containers to see that same carry complete and legible labels setting forth the required information; also that each container carries the registration tag or label bearing the signature of the Director of the Agricultural Experiment Station as provided by the Missouri State Fertilizer Law. The inspector also obtains samples of all the different brands found in order that these may be analyzed and reported upon by the chemist. All discrepancies found are reported to the Director and are also published in this report as a guide to the fertilizer buyer.

NEW ANALYSES RECOMMENDED

The brands of fertilizer now being used in the State are practically all classed as high grade, carrying as they do more than 14 units of plant food. The Experiment Station is now recommending the use of brands carrying not less than 20 units of plant food as shown by the following list.

Superphosphate-----	0-20-0
Ground Bone Fertilizer-----	Bone Meal (all analyses)
Mixed Fertilizer-----	4-12-4
Mixed Fertilizer-----	2-14-4
Mixed Fertilizer-----	2-12-6
Mixed Fertilizer-----	4-10-6
Mixed Fertilizer-----	0-14-6
Mixed Fertilizer-----	6-8-6

Sixteen per cent superphosphate may be used in place of the 20 per cent superphosphate if more convenient to obtain. However the 20 per cent material is a more economical purchase, since the selling price represents a lower cost per unit of phosphoric acid.

It is interesting to note in this connection the rapid increase in the use of 20 per cent superphosphate. In 1924 samples of both 16 and 20 per cent superphosphate were collected by the inspectors. Samples of the 20 per cent material numbered only about 12 per cent of the total. However in the present year (1929) the samples of 20 per cent amount to between 53 and 54 of the total samples obtained. Some 18 per cent superphosphate is sold but the amount is small compared with the others. Some 24 per cent and 45 per cent superphosphate are now being offered for sale in the State. Thus the tendency continues toward the use of the brands of higher analyses.

REGISTRATIONS

The first step in meeting the requirements of the law in selling fertilizer in Missouri is to register all brands to be offered for sale with the Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station. Purchasers of fertilizers are urged to buy only registered fertilizers. For the guidance of buyers the names of all manufacturers who offer registered fertilizers for sale are listed in Table 7 pages 41 to 53.

It is becoming more nearly the rule year by year to list fertilizer brands by figure formulae instead of word names. As an example take the brands 4-12-4. The first figure stands for the percentages of nitrogen in the fertilizer, the second figure for the percentage of available phosphoric acid, and the third for the percentage of potash (water soluble). If word names are used in Table 7, the figure formula can easily be read from the guaranteed amount of plant food in the columns at the right.

The use of "ammonia" as a plant food unit has been discontinued. The former use of ammonia in the figure formula has been explained in the preceding report.*

LABELS AND TAGS

Besides registration, the Missouri Fertilizer Law requires (1) Labels to be placed on all packages showing brand name, guaranteed analysis and name and address of manufacturer, and (2) Registration tags or labels furnished by the Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station, which certify to the fact of registration, are to be placed and retained on all packages until sold to the consumer.

The cases in which violations of the law were found are reported by the inspectors as follows:

VIOLATIONS OF THE MISSOURI FERTILIZER LAW

Violations with respect to registration.—Five sacks of Lecco Complete Grass Food manufactured by Lyman Carrier, Granger, Indiana, and 12 sacks of Sheep Manure from the Pacific Manure and Fertilizer Company, San Francisco, California, were found at the warehouse of Palmer Seed Company, St. Louis, Missouri. Neither of these brands had been registered prior to being offered for sale.

Nine sacks of Unleached Hardwood Ashes from George Stevens, Exporter, Petersborough, Ontario were stored in the warehouse of the St. Louis Seed Company, St. Louis. This material has not been registered for sale in Missouri.

A few sacks of Blood and Bone fertilizer from the Arkansas Fertilizer Company were delivered to J. H. H. Mote, Carthage. No registration was on hand for this brand.

Bone Meal Fertilizer (2-27) from Swift and Company on hand at the warehouse of the Springfield Seed Co., Springfield, had not been registered prior to sale by the manufacturer.

Violation with respect to labeling.—Five sacks of fertilizer labeled Apex Mixture from American Agricultural Chemical Company were sold to the Boone County Milling and Elevator Company of Columbia. This fertilizer proved to be 0-14-14 which indicates the label to be incorrect according to registration.

The M. F. B. F. brands of fertilizer registered and manufactured by the Floyd Plant Food Company and distributed through the State for the Missouri Farm Bureau Federation did not carry the name of the manufacturer on the label of the sacks as prescribed by law.

Anaconda Treble Superphosphate, Anaconda Copper Mining Company, Chicago, sold to the Farm Bureau Service, Moberly, regis-

tered to contain 44 per cent available phosphoric acid were labeled as containing 46 per cent available phosphoric acid. The statements in registration and on the labels should read alike.

Half and Half fertilizer, one of the common brands put out by a number of manufacturers, is a mixed fertilizer consisting as it does of approximately equal parts of acid phosphate and bone fertilizer. As such the law requires that it be registered and labeled to show the percentage of available phosphoric Acid. Some of the manufacturers have ignored this requirement when labeling the sacks of this brand and have shown only the percentage of total phosphoric acid. We have repeatedly called attention to this violation in labeling. The following firms have this year put out Half and Half fertilizer labeled wrong in the manner indicated:

About 16 sacks of a 2-10-2 fertilizer from the American Agricultural Chemical Company at the warehouse of the Boone County Milling and Elevator Company, Columbia bore the brand name "Special Fertilizer." This is not the name as registered for this mixture by the manufacturer.

A shipment of Raw Bone Meal from Federal Chemical Co. found at the Fortuna Elevator, Fortuna bore a label for guaranteed analysis not in agreement with registration.

The name and address of the manufacturer was omitted from the labels of certain M. F. A. fertilizers from the Floyd Plant Food Company found at Farmers Coop. Assn., Union, Farmers Exchange, Lamonte, Fortuna Elevator, Fortuna, and Farmers Exchange, Cuba.

A shipment of M. F. A. 2-16-2 Fertilizer from Floyd Plant Food Company to Farmers Exchange, Branson bore labels in which the guaranteed analysis figures were so blurred as to be scarcely legible.

Sacks of bone meal fertilizer labeled Ground Steam Bone 1-29 from Floyd Plant Food Co. were found at the warehouse of the Farmers Coop. Assn., Eldon and at the Farmers Produce Exchange, St. James. This is not the correct label for this brand.

Small packages of Sheep Manure prepared by the Springfield Seed Company from the contents of larger sacks from the Pulverized Manure Company bore labels which were not in agreement for the registered composition of this brand.

A shipment of Darling and Company Half and Half brand made to Chas. H. Honold, Beaufort, bore labels that could not be read.

Violations with Respect to the Use of Registration Tags.—The sacks of Apex Mixture from the American Agricultural Chemical Company at the Boone County Milling and Elevator Company of Columbia, were without registration tags. Twenty-six sacks of A. A. Gilt Edge Fertilizer and 2 sacks of AA Tip Top fertilizer shipped to T. M. Renfrow, West Plains by the American Agricultural Chemical Company were without registration tags.

The Missouri Market Association of St. Joseph has on hand thirty sacks of Steam Bone Meal for which registration tags had been supplied by the manufacturer but which the dealer had failed to attach to the sacks.

One Carload of Big Crop Fertilizer to the Star Milling Company, Mountain Grove and another to L. C. Gregory, Norwood from Armour Fertilizer Works carried the 1928 Registration Tags. Also 4 sacks of N-P.K, 9-27-9 fertilizer from the same manufacturer to Graves-Pettigrew Company, Cabool, also carried 1928 Registration Tags.

Registration tags for a shipment of Interstate Brand fertilizer from Crocker Packing Company to C. L. Spencer, Reeds, had been supplied to Mr. Spencer separately from the shipment. These had not been attached to the sacks in the warehouse.

Ten and 25 pound bags of Floyd's Garden Fertilizer from the Floyd Plant Food Company were on sale at the Producers Exchange, Truesdale, and were without registration tags. Also a part of the sacks of a shipment of M. F. A. fertilizer from the Floyd Plant Food Company to the Farmers Exchange, Lebanon were provided with the 1928 registration tags instead of those for 1929.

The goods of the following three fertilizer manufacturers mentioned above as having failed to register before placing same on sale, were necessarily without the registration tags:

Lyman Carrier, Granger, Indiana

Pacific Manure and Fertilizer Company, San Francisco, Calif.

George Stevens, Exporter, Petersborough, Ontario.

Two dozen packages of Feedem Plant Food from the Nitragin Company, Milwaukee, were on sale at the Palmer Seed Co., St. Louis without registration labels.

Fifty sacks of Bone Meal fertilizer from Swift and Company at the warehouse of Tucker Seed House, Carthage, were without registration tags.

Shipments of Darling's 16 per cent and 20 per cent Superphosphate from Darling and Company to Phil Ratliff, Neosho, bore Arkansas fertilizer tags in place of Missouri tags.

A shipment of M. F. A. 2-16-2 fertilizer from Floyd Plant Food Co. was found at the Farmers Exchange, New Cambria, without registration tags.

A supply of Floyd's Garden Fertilizer in 10 lb. sacks purchased from the Missouri Farmers Association, Springfield, was found at the Farmers Exchange, Webb City without registration tags.

A shipment of Red Steer 4-16-4 fertilizer from Swift and Company to Farmers Warehouse and Supply Company, Tina, did not carry registration tags.

A shipment of Red W. Special Bone Meal from Wilson and Co. to Boone County Milling and Elevator Co., Columbia, did not carry any registration tags.

The following dealers had resacked some of their stock of fertilizer and had failed to transfer the registration tags to the new sacks:

SOME RULES FOR BUYING FERTILIZER


To avail himself of the protection of the State Fertilizer Law, the dealer, farmer, or other user of fertilizer should observe the following rules when buying:

(1) Purchase only from companies whose brands have been registered. On pages 41 to 53 in this report will be found these companies and their brands with guaranteed analysis.

Write to the Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station for information about other companies who may want to sell you fertilizer.

(2) When you receive your shipment examine same to see that each sack carries a label showing brand name, guaranteed analysis, and name and address of manufacturer. This label should agree with the corresponding information given in the registration.

(3) Examine each sack for a registration tag in the form of a shipping tag which is white in color and reads as follows:



The above tag is used on bags weighing more than 100 pounds. When the fertilizer is sold in smaller sized bags, the legends used at the top of the tags reads as follows:—

1 to 100 lbs.

Over 10 and not over 50 lbs.

10 lbs. and under.

Fertilizer sacks not provided with above registration tags, cannot be sold without violation of the Missouri Fertilizer Law. No dealer or farmer should accept any sack of fertilizer in a purchase without a registration tag attached.

A SPECIAL WORD TO THE DEALER

In addition to the above rules the following situations will require attention: Registration tags are sometimes sent separately instead of being attached to the sacks of your shipment. These tags must be placed upon the sacks immediately in order that they may be legally offered for sale.

Again it may be necessary to resack some of the fertilizer in your warehouse because of the sacks having fallen to pieces. New sacks for this purpose may be obtained from the manufacturer. Be sure to transfer the registration tag from the old sack to the new one when filled. Registration tags must accompany every package until same is emptied out of the container for use.

The Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station will be glad to furnish on request, information regarding any point in the handling and purchase of fertilizers.

FERTILIZER IN SMALL PACKAGES


In the last few years there has been a growing demand for fertilizer in small packages. The housewife, the home gardener and others are using this material for flowers, potted plants and vegetables. These packages are found on sale at the seed dealers and florists in many forms and in many sizes of packages. Attention is called to the fact that these materials like all other fertilizers require registration, labeling, and affixing of registration tags or labels. The size of the registration tag or label depends upon the size of the package as the following paragraph from the fertilizer law indicates.

Section 12113—Every manufacturer, importer, or person shall pay to said Experiment Station for the labels or tags required by them under Section 12112 of the article, the sum of one-half cent for tags or labels to be attached to packages weighing ten pounds or less; the sum of one cent each for tags or labels to be attached to bags or packages weighing more than ten pounds and not more than fifty pounds; the sum of one and one-half cents for tags or labels to be attached to bags or packages weighing more than fifty pounds and not more than one hundred pounds; three cents each for tags or labels to be attached to bags or packages weighing more than one hundred pounds and not more than two hundred pounds.

Any manufacturer who has duly registered his fertilizer according to law is permitted to sell this in any size of package he may desire to use, provided proper labels are used and the registration tags or labels of the proper size are attached. As stated elsewhere this list of manufacturers and their brands may be found in Table 7 pages 41 to 53.

No package fertilizer should be purchased which does not bear the name of one of these firms on the label. If the name does not appear here write to the Missouri Agricultural Experiment Station for information.

The gummed registration label used on fertilizer packages is a white square label printed in black, in appearance like the following:



The legends which appear at the top of these labels read according to the limits of the weights of the packages for which they are used as follows:

- 10 lbs. and under
- Over 10 and not over 50 lbs.
- Over 50 and not over 100 lbs.

The presence of these tags on each package must be assured before the dealer may offer these to his customers. In placing large orders for package fertilizer packed in larger cartons the dealer will do well to insist that the manufacturer provide the labels already attached to the packages so that they are ready to be placed on sale as soon as they are received.

VALUATIONS OF PLANT FOODS

For the purpose of comparing the values of fertilizer brands as guaranteed by the manufacturer and as found on analysis, it has been customary to select a value in dollars and cents for each plant food unit. A plant food unit is one per cent per ton, or to quote from our previous report* the valuation is defined thus: "the average cost including delivery of one per cent of the plant food contained on the average in one ton of the ordinary simple carriers of this constituent when sold in the state in carload lots."

The same values for the plant food units used last year are in use in this report. Their values are as follows:

Total nitrogen-----	\$4.25
Total phosphoric acid from bone-----	1.00
Insoluble phosphoric acid from bone (when so guaranteed in registration)-----	.80
Available phosphoric acid (all sources)-----	1.40
Potash (water soluble)-----	1.05

CALCULATION OF VALUES

The guaranteed and found values of each brand analyzed can now be found by multiplying these unit plant food values by the respective guaranteed and found percentages of these plant foods in the brand in question. For example, for sample 11-43 found in Table 5, page 25, the calculations are made thus:

For the guaranteed value

2 times \$4.25 equals \$ 8.50
12 times 1.40 equals 16.80
2 times 1.05 equals 2.10

Total guaranteed value equals \$27.40

For the found value

2.09 times \$4.25 equals \$ 8.88
12.16 times 1.40 equals 17.02
2.11 times 1.05 equals 2.22

Total found value equals \$28.12

Thus the guaranteed value is found to be \$27.40 and the found value \$28.12 or \$0.72 in excess.

In like manner all samples analyzed and reported upon in Table 5 have been subjected to the same calculation. The results are found in the last two columns to the right. These values serve for comparison only and are not intended to indicate the actual selling price of the fertilizer. However, any buyer may decide which fertilizer brand is the most economical kind to buy considering its composition and its market price, by the following simple rule: The brand whose guaranteed and found value is closest to or exceeds the actual price asked per ton of the buyer, is the most economical one to purchase.

These values for each fertilizer company have been summarized in the following table showing what is the average loss on all samples which ran under the guarantee in value, and the gain or loss per ton on all the samples considered together. A study of these shows that when sufficient samples have been secured to obtain a representative average, the results nearly always indicate some excess value furnished. When all the samples of all the companies are averaged the result indicates a value of 89 cents per ton as an average excess value furnished in the state during the year 1929.

FERTILIZER SAMPLES ANALYZED

The samples collected by the inspectors during the fall season 1929, have been analyzed for the actual percentages of the plant food they are guaranteed to contain, and the results assembled in Table 5. They are arranged in the alphabetical order of the name of the manufacturer.

Certain of the figures found on analysis appearing in the table are printed in bold faced type. These figures are lower in value than the corresponding guaranteed figure, and the bold faced figure serves to call attention to a deficiency. The guaranteed analysis figure represents the minimum percentage of the plant food in question which may be expected to be present, therefore any found value below this may be considered a deficiency. The amount of the variation from the guarantee should be considered when surveying these figures. Some deviations are so small as to be negligible.

Farmers and dealers sometimes request that samples, collected by themselves and sent in, be analyzed. Unless great care be taken to obtain an average sample by taking portions from all parts of the lots, the results are not the most reliable. When samples are drawn by the regular sampling tools used by the inspector an average sample of the lot is obtained and the results are to be considered a reliable indication of the composition of the entire lot. All samples analyzed under the State Fertilizer Law must be accompanied by the following descriptive information; name and address of dealer, brand name and guaranteed analysis, name and address of manufacturer as they appear upon the label on the fertilizer sack.

ACTIVITY OF NITROGEN IN FERTILIZERS

The Missouri fertilizer law requires that the minimum total nitrogen present in a fertilizer be guaranteed. In Table 5, the first column under "Nitrogen" gives the total amount guaranteed, the second column, the total amount found. Students of agriculture now recognize clearly that the important factor about nitrogen in a fertilizer or in the soil is not necessarily the total amount present but the amount which is readily absorbed by the plant. In other words, the amount available. It is therefore essential that tests be conducted to determine the amount of chemically active nitrogen present in the fertilizer, which is an index of its availability. Nitrogen which is soluble in water, and nitrogen insoluble in water which is readily acted upon by neutral and alkaline permanganate, are both considered active.

The rules for applying these tests have been explained in previous reports and need not be repeated here.* The results of testing the fertilizers for water soluble nitrogen are given in Table 5 in the third column under Nitrogen. Most mixed fertilizers show that more than two-thirds of the nitrogen present in the fertilizer is in water soluble form. This is considered satisfactory.

As a result of testing all the samples carrying nitrogen for their quality or chemical activity, the following samples may be said to contain nitrogen of inferior quality. 11-173, 11-174, 11-175, 11-176, 11-177, 11-178, 11-179, 11-180, 11-181, 11-182, 11-217, 11-222, 11-249, 11-250, 11-251.

For careful study of all the data on nitrogen activity obtained in the work on the samples from the different manufacturers, consult Table 3.

AGRICULTURAL LIMESTONES AND OTHER MATERIALS

The practice of using crushed limestone, burnt lime and waste lime materials in agricultural practice is pretty well established in Missouri at the present time. Limestone ledges may be found in most counties in the State and it is therefore readily obtainable for use. Some of these ledges are worked on a commercial scale and can furnish carloads of crushed limestone to communities having railroad shipping points. Many groups of farmers find it more economical to quarry and crush their own stone from local ledges. It does not pay to crush stone of inferior quality hence the quality should be ascertained before labor is expended upon it.

The Experiment Station has tested stone from all parts of the state during the year 1929 and the report of these tests by counties is given in Table 6. If information is desired concerning the quality of stone found in any locality it may be obtained by addressing the Agricultural Experiment Station, Columbia, Missouri.

USE OF FERTILIZERS IN MISSOURI, 1929

Statistics on the distribution of fertilizers in Missouri both as to kind and as to area where used, are of interest to agronomists and other state workers in connection with crop reports, also to fertilizer salesmen and manufacturers.

Table 8 indicates the tonnage used in the various counties of the State as grouped into the six general divisions. Table 9 gives the tons of nitrogen, phosphoric acid from bone, available phosphoric acid and of potash consumed as fertilizer in the State in 1929. Table 10 gives the tonnage of the principal brands used in the State, from all the companies. The meaning of the classifications used in Tables 8 and 9 are stated as follows:

BONE: Steamed Bone Meal, Raw Bone Meal.

SUPERPHOSPHATE: 16, 18, 20, 24, 45 per cent.

HIGH GRADE MIXED: 20 units (includes Half and Half brands)

MEDIUM GRADE MIXED: Less than 20 units but not less than 14 units.

LOW GRADE MIXED: Less than 14 units.

MISCELLANEOUS: Potash salts, dried manure, sulphate of ammonia, nitrate of soda, sewerage residues, etc.

The above classification represents a change in the past meaning of High, Medium and Low Grade Mixed Fertilizers. On account of the steadily increasing use of mixtures of higher plant food content, the classification of high grade mixtures has been raised to include brands which contain at least 20 units, instead of 14 as heretofore. Medium is advanced from mixtures below 14 units to mixtures above 14 units and low grade now includes all brands formerly classified as medium and low grade.
