Mr. Richard K. Weil Elected Board President

The Board of Directors has elected Mr. Richard K. Weil as President of Jewish Hospital.

Mr. Weil, who has served as a vice-president of the hospital, succeeds Mr. Major B.



Einstein, who retired after seven years in the presidency.

At the same meeting, Mr. John Shoenberg was elected a vice-president to replace Mr. Weil, and Mr. Robert H. Mayer, Mrs. Maurice E. Mendle and Mr. Millard A. Waldheim were re-elected as vice-presidents.

Mr. Norman Bierman was named as secretary succeeding Mr. Henry H. Stern.

Mr. Louis Tiger was re-elected to serve as treasurer of the hospital.

Subsequent to election as Vice-President of the Board, Mr. Mayer was honored by being elected President of the Community Chest which necessitated his resigning the former

position. He was formerly President of Jewish Sanatorium and continued to head the Long Term Illness Division after the Health Plan Merger.

Dr. Pareira Appointed Director of Surgical Services

Dr. Morton D. Pareira has been appointed Director of the Division of Surgical Services and will assume his duties on May 1, 1954. Dr. Pareira, the first surgeon to hold this office on a full time basis, has been associated with the Jewish Hospital for a number of years.



He is a graduate of the Washington University School of Medicine. He interned at Jewish Hospital and received residency training in surgery at St. Louis City Hospital and Ellis Fischel Cancer Hospital. He is presently a member of the faculty in surgery at Washington University, Attending Surgeon at Homer G. Phillips Hospital, and Associate Surgeon at Jewish Hospital.

Dr. Pareira is author and co-author of a number of publications, particularly in the field of metabolism as related to surgery.

DR. SOMOGYI HONORED

On January 13, 1954 the Medical Staff expressed its appreciation of Dr. Michael Somogyi's contribution to the professional development of the hospital and the many honors he has brought our institution in the form of a testimonial banquet held at the Congress Hotel. Almost 265 guests attended, including

members of the Board of Directors and a number of Dr. Somogyi's scientific confreres. Among the latter were Dr. Philip Shaffer, formerly Professor and Chairman of the Department of Biochemistry and Dean of the School of Medicine, Washington University; Drs. Carl and Gerti Cori, Nobel Prize Winners and presently Professors of Biochemistry, School of Medicine, Washington University; Drs. George Bishop and Ethel Ronzoni Bishop of the faculty of the School of Medicine, Washington University.

Dr. E.A. Doisy, Nobel Prize Winner and Professor and Chairman of the Department of Biochemistry, School of Medicine, St. Louis University and longtime friend of Dr. Somogyi was unable to attend, but sent a message of congratulations.

Dr. J.G. Probststein acted as Toastmaster and presented Dr. Somogyi with a check as a

gift from the medical staff.

Dr. Somogyi has served as biochemist for the Jewish Hospital for over 25 years. He came to this hospital when the field of biochemistry was in its infancy and succeeded in literally bringing the facilities of the laboratory to the patient's bedside. He developed tests for the diagnosis of certain diseases, particularly pancreatitis and devoted his research to the field of the action of insulin and the treatment of the diabetic patient. In these areas of medical research he is recognized as an international authority and recently received the Ernst Bischoff award from the American Society for Clinical Chemists for his research accomplishments.

Administrative Resident Begins Duties

Mr. Robert Stone became a member of the Jewish Hospital family last month, in the capacity of Resident in Hospital Administration. Mr. Stone, who is a student of hospital administration at Columbia University in New York, will spend one year here in field training for his degree.



His duties will bring him into contact with every department of the hospital. In addition, he will be associated with suitable committees and special projects.

Mr. Stone is a native New Yorker who graduated from the City College of N.Y. and subsequently spent two years with the Army of Occupation in Europe.

His outside interests are reading, chess and listening to classical music.

Photo Service For New Born Babies Sponsored By Auxiliary

Through the efforts of the Women's Auxiliary, a photo-identification service has been set up in the nursery of Jewish Hospital. Mrs. John Isaacs, Jr., chairman of this committee, said the service was begun primarily to supply the parents with an early picture of baby.

Every new mother is shown a kit which contains one 5 x 7 photograph and six birth announcements with a wallet size picture of her baby. These can be ordered in multiple amounts.

When baby is 24 hours old, a nurse wheels his bassinet under an automatic camera, presses a pedal and that's all there is to it. The pictures are also given to the hospital and the physicians for their records and as a secondary means of identification. An identification form is photographed with the baby to provide the necessary information.

Dr. Blumenthal To Make Presentation In London About Aging

Dr. H.T. Blumenthal, Pathologist and Director of the Division of Laboratories of the Jewish Hospital has been invited to present reports of his work on Aging at the Second International Gerontological Congress to be held in London, England during the week of July 19. Dr. Blumenthal will present two reports, one dealing with glandular aspects of aging entitled, "An Evaluation of the Role of the Pituitary in Aging Processes in the Thyroid, Parathyroid and Adrenal Glands," and the second dealing with the subject of hardening of the arteries titled, "Mechanical Factors in the Genesis of Arteriosclerosis."

This trip will receive financial support from two donors who are also supporting Dr. Blumenthal's research on Aging, Mr. Morton May, Sr., who maintains the David May-Florence G. May Research Fund and Mrs. Jack London, who maintains the Louis Monheimer Memorial Research Fund.

Divisional Patter

Medical Social Service Division

Play Therapy Room Sponsored by Ben A'kiba Aid Society

The Ben A'kiba Aid Society has agreed to sponsor the cost of construction of the Children's Play Therapy Room in the Department of Psychology in the new hospital construction, as well as assisting to maintain this department in future years.

Mrs. George Amitin, President, Mrs. Rebecca Rosenblum, Chairman of the Committee, and other representatives of the Ben A'kiba Aid Society met several times with Mr. Richard K. Weil, President, Dr. David Littauer, Executive Director, Dr. Irwin Levy, Director of the Department of Neuropsychiatry, and Dr. Blanche Sweet, Psychologist, while investigating this project.

The Children's Play Therapy Department will consist of a Psychologist's Office, an Examining Room and a special therapy room where the behavior of children can be observed by trained psychologists. The Society has voted the sum of \$10,000 for this project.

In addition, at least \$1500.00 annually will be furnished to maintain some of the activities of this Child Therapy Department.

INTEREST IN J. H.

The Ben A'kiba Aid Society was founded in 1892 by a group of community minded women inspired by the good deeds performed by Rabbi A'kiba among the poor.

One of the group's most important projects was the Ben A'kiba Home for Working Girls which they maintained for 25 years.

N.R. Society to Equip New Nursery

The Noshim Rachmonieth Mothers' and Babies' Welfare Society is sponsoring the equipping of the full-term and premature nurseries in the new construction soon to get under way at the Hospital, it was announced recently by Mrs. Sylvia Olian, President of the organization.

It is estimated that the sum of approximately \$15,000 will be required to purchase new incubators, bassinets, weighing scales and examining equipment for the nurseries. After detailed study of the hospital's proposal, the Board of the N. R. Society voted to sponsor the project.

FOUNDED 1907

The N. R. Society was founded in 1907 by a group of women under the leadership of Mrs. Ethel Pian. Their initial efforts were extended towards assisting indigent mothers whose babies were born at home; it was not until 1916 that they helped their first hospital maternity patient. Since then they have provided both pre- and post-natal care and have given needy families cribs, layettes, and everything else that is needed to insure that both mother and baby are well cared for.

They have supplied the Division of Obstetrics with a number of pieces of equipment in the past as well as to supply funds for an important research program.

Noshim Rachmonieth means Women of Mercy, a name to which the group has devoted itself.

Henry A. Friedman Elected Life Member of Board.

Henry A. Friedman has been elected a life member of the Board of Directors of the Hospital. Mr. Friedman was president of the former Board of the Jewish Hospital from 1938 to 1947, before consolidation of the hospital with the Miriam Rosa Bry Convalescent-Rehabilitation Hospital, the Jewish Sanatorium, and the Jewish Medical Social Service Bureau, three years ago into one medical center.

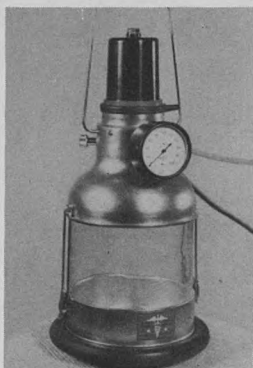
