Tunnel Job Gets Underway

The Forest Park-Kingshighway intersection will never be the same again. An east-west tunnel is being built under Kingshighway as part of the future Forest Park Parkway, approved by St. Louisans in the 1955 bond issue.

The four-lane project will extend west from Compton avenue and Market street to the St. Louis County line on Millbrook boulevard. Target date for highway completion: some time in 1962.

Construction workers are now in stage one of a five-stage project to build the tunnel as well as a ramp extending 500 feet east from Kingshighway onto Forest Park avenue.

Kingshighway traffic now uses the two east lanes of the boulevard while bulldozers, cranes, and heavy trucks excavate and sink pilings on the west side of Kingshighway.

Under "first stage" construction are side walls for the tunnel and supports for the bridge and sidewalks over it. The first stage should be completed in six to nine months, construction officials estimate. Here is what's going to happen in following stages:

Stage 2: East side of Kingshighway will be excavated, walls built, and the road completed over the underpass so traffic can move both ways on Kingshighway again.

Stage 3: All traffic on the south side of Forest Park avenue will be diverted to the north side of the street. Center parking strip will be torn out all the way to Euclid and a 500-foot ramp onto Forest Park will be built.

Stage 4: Traffic will still use north side of Forest Park avenue. Supporting walls will be completed on south side of ramp. Emergency traffic lane will permit ambulance access to the hospital.

Stage 5: Traffic on Forest Park to be diverted to south side of present avenue. North side wall will be completed and project will be turned over to city for paving.

Dirt from excavation work will fill in the new highway bed west of the intersection so that a bridge over the nearby Frisco railroad tracks can be completed some time within the next two years.

Construction officials estimate that the underpass and ramp work will be completed in 600 working days or in about two years. Future issues of 216 will report construction progress on the intersection and ramp and also on other work projects in the immediate neighborhood.

\$564,518 Grant Supports Medical Care Research Center

A \$564,518 grant from the U.S. Public Health Service has been awarded to Jewish Hospital and Washington University Social Science Institute, to support studies conducted by a joint Medical Care Research Center. This grant covers a five-year period.

Dr. David Littauer, executive director of Jewish Hospital, is co-investigator of the project with Dr. Nicholas J. Demerath, director of the Social Science Institute of the university.

The purpose of the award is to enable studies that will improve existing methods, or evolve new methods, of organizing and providing patient care at the lowest possible cost.

Specialists from a variety of fields will be brought together to work as a multi-disciplinary team in creating new knowledge in the organization and distribution of hospital and other health services.

Project directors for specific studies will be: Dr. Alvin W. Gouldner, chairman of the university's department of sociology-anthropology; Dr. Gerald Nadler, chairman, department of industrial engineering; Dr. Burton Weisbrod, assistant professor of economics; Dr. Jay Goldman, assistant professor of industrial engineering; David A. Gee, associate director, Jewish Hospital, and Dr. Albert F. Wessen, assistant professor of sociology and psychiatry at the university and medical sociologist at Jewish Hospital. Dr. Wessen is acting executive director of the center.

These persons, in addition to Drs. Littauer and Demerath, serve

as the center's steering committee and will study all research ideas presented.

Local consultants to the project will include Dr. Frank R. Bradley, director of Barnes Hospital and of

Ellen Steinberg Psychiatric Unit Gets New Play Therapy Room

A new play therapy room is being added to the present quarters of the Ellen Steinberg Department of Child Psychiatry on the north

side of the hospital's third floor.

Visitors to the hospital will notice scaffolding on the 3rd floor construction area immediately east of the present child psychiatry quarters as they enter the hospital by Forest Park ambulance entrance.

The new play room will supplement the present play quarters which are too small. The room will be 49 feet by 83 feet, according to construction officials. Exterior walls will match the existing brick walls of the building.

Construction of the new addition should be completed in January or February of 1961, it has been estimated. The foreman on the project also supervised the seven million dollar remodeling and expansion program of the hospital from 1954 to 1958.

JEWISH SERVICES HELD HERE DAILY

Jewish services are being held in the first floor chapel from 12:45 to 1 p.m., seven days a week. The services are open to all Jewish persons — patients, visitors, employees, and medical and house staff members.

Some services are recorded on tape; others are personally conducted by a rabbi. The services are being sponsored by the St. Louis Rabbinical Association, with Rabbi Ferdinand Isserman, Temple Israel, as coordinator.

Dr. Littauer Is President of Area Hospital Group

Dr. David Littauer, executive director, has been elected president of the Hospital Association of Metropolitan St. Louis, formerly the Greater St. Louis Hospital Council. He will serve a one-year term.

The association, among other duties, surveys available hospital facilities and analyzes future hospital requirements. Forty-three hospitals in the metropolitan area, including nearby Illinois, are members.

Other Jewish Hospital appointees to association posts are:

David A. Gee, associate director, chairman of group purchasing committee and member, employee relations committee; James O. Hepner, administrative assistant, hospital pharmacy and therapeutics committee; Robert Rubright, public relations director, public relations committee; Irwin Albrecht, controller, accounting practices committee, and Miss Marjorie H. Boulton, medical records librarian, legal liaison committee.

Mr. John M. Shoenberg, president of Jewish Hospital, is a member of the trustee committee of the association.

Patient Vote Heavy Here

Patients who were hospitalized on November 8, date of the presidential election, were aided in their efforts to obtain absentee ballots by the Public Relations Department.

Prior to the election, nearly 120 patients completed absentee ballot application letters, prepared by the department. After marking their ballots and sealing their ballot envelopes, the department assisted the patients in finding a notary public to make each envelope official.

The project had approval from both the city and county boards of election commissioners.

Dr. William Sinkler Dies

Dr. William H. Sinkler, surgeon on the courtesy staff, died in September.

Dr. Sinkler, who was also medical director of Homer G. Phillips Hospital, was 54 years old. He was a member of Jewish Hospital's staff for 3 years.

Dr. Blumenthal Back from Japan

Dr. Herman T. Blumenthal, director of the Institute of Experimental Pathology, has just returned from a three-week trip to Japan, where he delivered five lectures at the invitation of Dr. Katashi Inouye, president of the Congress of the Japanese Society of Geriatrics.

Groups addressed by Dr. Blumenthal included the Gerontological Association of Japan, and the Osaka, Nagoya and Tokyo medical associations.

the Washington University course in hospital administration; Harry Panhorst and Donald Horsh, both members of the Barnes Hospital administration and Washington University hospital administration course staffs, and Dr. C. Howe Eller, St. Louis County health commissioner.

Research persons in the center will explore medical care programs and their organization—both in hospitals and in similar community institutions.

Also to be examined will be the role of separate medical care units or programs, such as chronic disease, rehabilitation or psychiatric units, in one institution. The influence of units on each other will be studied to determine how each unit affects the over-all policies of the institution.

Other efforts will deal with methods to make medical care organizations more efficient and less expensive. Costs of patient care and factors determining costs will be studied. The design of new systems or improvement of existing methods for providing health care in the

general hospital will be considered.

Several studies are already underway at the center. They include a survey of organized home care services for the chronically ill, using the Jewish Hospital home care program as a base. Doctors Littauer, I. J. Flance, and Wessen are co-operating in this study.

Also started is an analysis of patient care components to determine if certain time-consuming activities of nurses can be replaced by simpler, more effective procedures which will release nurses for more essential tasks. Industrial engineers, psychologists, nurses, and sociologists, under the direction of Dr. Nadler, are pooling their talents on this study.

Graduate students from the social sciences, industrial engineering, hospital administration, and medicine will be part-time research assistants at the center. Frequent seminars are held to discuss research problems and results with medical care groups elsewhere. Visiting professorships may be appointed in areas related to center objectives.

Emergency Rooms, Eye Clinic, Other Areas Change Face

Construction and alterations are now in progress to improve facilities in the Emergency Rooms on the ground floor of the hospital.

The project will create a new emergency surgical room, and a combination utility and auxiliary examining room. These added facilities will provide more adequate capacity for handling peak weekend patient loads.

The emergency room waiting area has been moved across the hall from its present location. Additional waiting space is available

in the out-patient clinic waiting room, and in the eye clinic and ear, nose and throat clinic waiting areas.

The eye clinic area has been rearranged, and additional space added to the ear, nose and throat clinic to provide offices for the audiology section.

The entire project is scheduled for completion by November 30. Construction is being done solely by the hospital's maintenance department.

United Fund Drive Nets \$4,462

Jewish Hospital employees have attained 91% of the \$4,900 goal set for this year's United Fund drive at the hospital.

A total of \$4,462.10 was pledged by 897 persons, representing 89.7% of the hospital's employees

Robert Rubright, public relations director, is chairman of the drive. Co-chairmen assisting him were Miss Diane Schachter, personnel office receptionist, and Mrs. Shirley Winfrey, assistant to the public relations director.

In addition, there were approxi-

mately 40 team captains who made collections in the various departments and nursing divisions.

Jewish Hospital is one of 116 St. Louis agencies supported in part by United Fund monies.

The hospital is receiving \$197,500 from the United Fund this year. This money helps support patient care activities in the Aaron Waldheim Clinics, the long-term care and rehabilitation divisions, the social service department, and service patients treated on the acute divisions of the hospital.

Roof Play Area To Open Soon

2500 square feet on the seventh floor roof of the hospital will be fenced in soon for another play area for patients of the Ellen Steinberg Department of Child Psychiatry.

Construction should be completed in late November.

Dr. Naomi Grant, clinical director of the child psychiatry unit, explained the need for this additional play area:

"In recent months, the lack of play space for the children has become acute. Although Forest Park is a very short distance away, the children have to be taken out in small groups, and crossing Kings-highway with the youngsters can be quite a major undertaking.

"The open play area on the 7th floor will be easily accessible. The children can be taken there in small groups and will not have to wait for a larger group to be organized and taken outside the hospital. The area will give an opportunity for development of the children's group participation in games."

Plans Laid For Medical Center

Construction of the block-long Forest Park Medical Center is expected to begin in the next two months. The center, comprising three buildings, will occupy the north side of Forest Park avenue bounded by Euclid and Taylor avenues.

Project completion is expected in 1962; the first building will be ready for occupancy September 1, 1961.

Free parking facilities will be available for both physicians and patients.

Additional features offered at the medical center will be a doctors' club and library, a recreation area with dining facilities and lounge, a testing and chemistry laboratory, and a supervised nursery.

Rhinologists Attend Seminar Here

Twenty-five rhinologists from all over the United States attended a five-day seminar at Jewish Hospital, November 8 to 13.

The seminar was sponsored jointly by Jewish Hospital and the American Rhinologic Society. (Rhinology involves the science and diseases of the nose.)

Dr. Maurice H. Cottle, professor of otolaryngology, Chicago Medical School, lectured and presented clinical and surgical demonstrations. Dr. Daniel D. Klaff, a Jewish Hospital otolaryngologist, was seminar chairman.

Participants discussed how to rebuild the human nose through five or six different types of nasal surgery.

Prior to his appointment here, Dr. Harte was medical director of the St. Clair County (Ill.) Mental Health Center. He received psychiatric training at Veteran's Administration Hospital and Kansas Treatment Center for Children both at Topeka, Kansas.

Dr. Sumer is from Istanbul, Turkey. She received an M.D. degree from Istanbul University School of Medicine, interned at St. John's Episcopal Hospital in New York, and served a two-year residency in psychiatry at Washington University.

New Surgery Unit Here

With the opening of the recently created Department of Plastic Surgery in the Division of Surgery, Jewish Hospital's teaching program for surgical residents is being expanded.

Surgical residents spend three months on the plastic surgery service, obtaining experience in surgical treatment of burns, head-neck cancers, congenital abnormalities, and other procedures involving reconstructive and/or cosmetic surgery.

Dr. Marcy A. Goldstein is the department's director. Dr. James T. Chamness assists in running the service, and Dr. James B. Brown is senior consultant.

"We are interested only in making general surgery residents aware of the potentials of plastic surgery and teaching them the basic principles of technique," Dr. Goldstein stated. "Many times, plastic surgery overlaps into other fields. Procedures performed by the general surgeon, orthopedist, urologist, or dentist often involve some phase of the plastic surgery field," he explained.

Dr. Goldstein reports that the ultimate aim of his department is to develop a program sufficient in size to eventually obtain an AMA-approved residency in plastic surgery here.

Dr. Jay Goldman has been appointed director of industrial engineering at the hospital.

A native St. Louisan, Mr. Rathert is a veteran of 20 years' service with the U. S. Navy. He served as a hospital corpsman aboard ships and at various naval hospitals and training centers in the United States, and held the rank of chief hospital corpsman at the time of his discharge.



Mr. Rathert resides in Overland with his wife and two children.

His duties include supervision of nursing and secretarial personnel, scheduling of surgical cases, maintenance of records and reports, and effecting liaison between the operating department and service departments of the hospital.

Focal Infections Is Lecture Topic

George G. Stewart, D.D.S., of Temple University, Philadelphia, Pa., lectured on "Focal Infection" on Monday, November 28 at 8:30 p.m. in Steinberg Auditorium.

The subject of the lecture dealt with present-day concepts of the long-held theory that a dental focal infection (an infection centralized in a tooth) may cause reactions, such as arthritis and joint diseases in other parts of the body.

The lecture was sponsored by the Missouri Section of the American Academy of Dental Medicine. Dr. Gunter Schmidt, Jewish Hospital staff member, is president of the section.

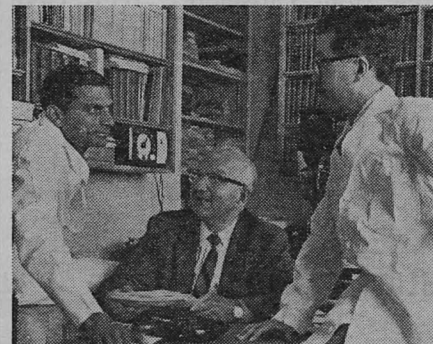
Research Staff Grows

Studies in diabetes and in diseases of the aged got a recent boost with the addition of two new researchers to the Institute of Experimental Pathology staff.

Dr. Yukimasa Hirata will work in the area of insulin immunity and the vascular diseases of diabetes with Dr. Herman T. Blumenthal, director of the Institute. Dr. Hirata, with his wife and two daughters, will be here two years.

Dr. Bhartur N. Premachandra will work with Dr. Blumenthal in exploring the function of endocrine glands among aged persons. (These glands secrete various hormones which control such bodily functions as growth, metabolism, nutrition, and blood pressure.) Dr. Premachandra comes from the University of Missouri, where he got a Ph.D. in endocrinology and was assistant professor of endocrinology.

Dr. Hirata, one of Japan's leading clinicians, is on leave as senior instructor in medicine at Kyushu Uni-

HOSPITAL STUDY GROUPS VISIT HERE



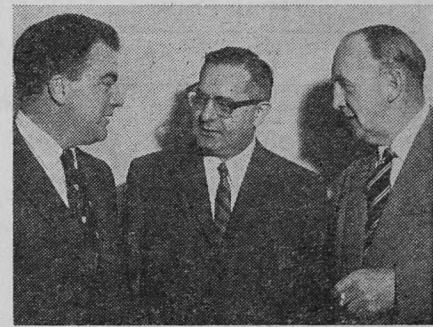

Mrs. Moore is the third hospital employee to win cash for her suggestion.

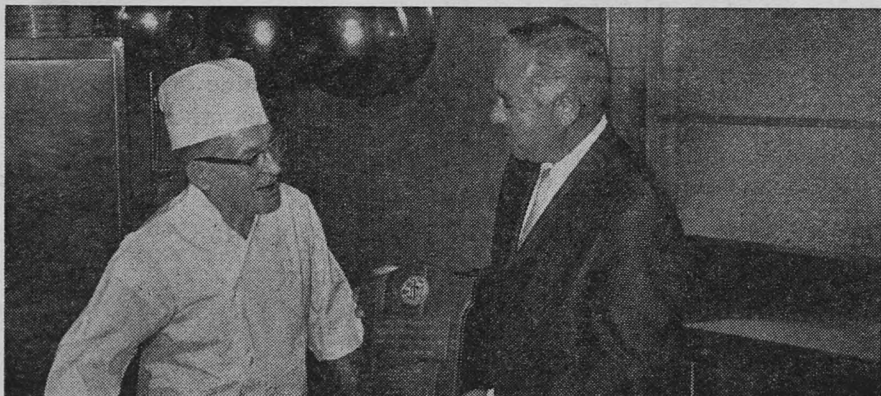
Hezekiah Norphlet, yardman, won \$10 for his suggestion about altering the location of the dumpster behind the hospital.
