69 Employees Honored At Service Awards Tea on March 14

The 1962 Jewish Federation campaign at the hospital will be April 2 to April 13, Robert Rubright, hospital campaign director, has announced.

Morris Shenker, general chairman of the Federation campaign, is tentatively scheduled to speak at an orientation for team captains on March 30 in Steinberg Auditorium.

Quota for hospital employees is \$4,000; overall Federation quota is \$1,815,000.

In 1961, the Federation allocated \$360,000 to the hospital for teaching programs of the departments of medicine and surgery, partial support of ward patients and the Aaron Waldheim clinics and for support of the hospital's chronic disease unit and home care program.

Further details on the campaign will be announced later by Mr. Rubright and his co-chairman, Mr. Daniel M. Anzel, administrative assistant.

A Crowning Success

Clover Ball Raises \$65,000 For New Units

The Auxiliary-sponsored Clover Ball, long awaited, is over. It was a crowning, successful climax to two years of detailed planning by the ball committee.

The fund-raising affair, one of the largest such events ever given by a local hospital, raised more than \$65,000 which will be used to increase therapeutic and recreational facilities for patients and to expand treatment and office space for the professional staff on the division of adult psychiatry.

The ball marked the tenth anniversary of the Jewish Hospital Medical Center Auxiliary, one of the larger hospital auxiliaries in the United States with a present membership of nearly 3,000 members.

Some 1,000 persons attended the black-tie affair at the Khorassan Room of the Chase Hotel, January 20. Of that number 180 came as patrons, having contributed \$250 for each pair of tickets.

Lester Lanin, nationally known society orchestra leader whose group played for President Ken-

edy's inaugural ball, played for dancing under a beautiful pink gazebo which covered the dance floor. Lanin also announced the names of winners of coveted Clover Surprises.

Dr. and Mrs. Marvin E. Levin won the big prize of the evening — a round-trip for two on an Air France jetliner to Paris and a 17-day all-expenses paid Open Road tour of French provinces. The prize was given by Goldman-Meyer Travel Agency, St. Louis.

Blumenthal Gets \$50,000 Grant

Dr. Herman T. Blumenthal, Institute of Experimental Pathology director, has been awarded a two-year \$50,000 grant from the Louis D. Beaumont Foundation, Inc. to continue studies of diseases of the nervous system.

The Institute has studied nervous system diseases resulting from the body's loss of ability to recognize its own nervous tissue with the concurrent development in the body of hypersensitive or allergic reactions.

Since some nervous system diseases of this kind are believed to be inherited, the manner of inheritance will be explored through studies of cell chromosomes which carry inherited traits. In the study, human cells will be grown in tissue cultures and the minute structure of their chromosomes will be studied under the Institute's electron microscope.

If the inheritance factor can be located, it may be possible to predict in advance which persons are likely to develop certain nervous system diseases. Dr. William B. Hutton, research associate, will also be engaged in the project.

Student Nurse Dies In Auto Accident

Members of the nursing school senior class formed an honor guard at the funeral of Miss Sharon Kay Bridges, 20, a senior student killed recently in an automobile accident. The funeral was in Granite City, Illinois, home of the late Miss Bridges.

Miss Bridges, her companion, Fay Stagner, and three other persons were killed February 4 in a two-car collision

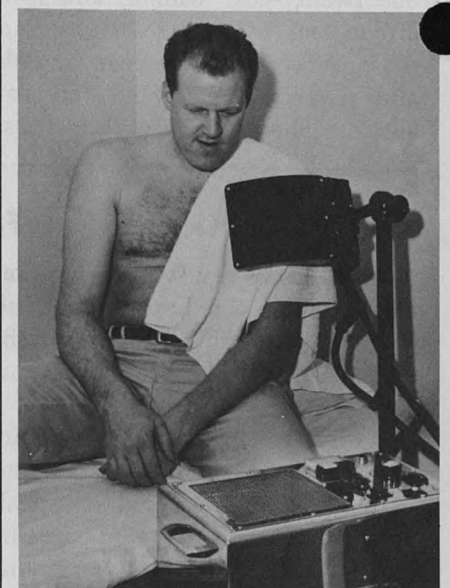
Miriam Gives Leukemia Grant

STEREO USED WITH SURGERY

Stereophonic music, beamed through headphones to patients under local or spinal anesthesia, is a great electronic boon to surgeons.

"With stereophonic music, patients are more sedate, more cooperative, more distracted," said Dr. Daniel Klaff, otolaryngologist who, along with general surgeons,

obstetricians, and plastic surgeons, has employed stereo repeatedly.

Dr. Marcy Goldstein, director of the plastic surgery division, adds his own endorsement. "Stereo music allows surgeons to discuss procedures without the patient hearing them. And, stereo's even tonal qualities soothe the patient to a point where he doesn't think about surgery."

Stereo music distracts patients by providing them with a sense of spatial relationship, Dr. Klaff said. Semi-classical music and choral music are the best types to play, he added.

Stereo music is best applied to long surgical procedures, usually more than an hour in length. The hospital Auxiliary bought the tape recorder and headphones for the hospital several months ago.

Service Award Winners

Trio Works Total of 105 Years Here

Miss Rose McClelland came to Jewish hospital in June 1926. She is presently administrative assistant for recruiting in the school of nursing.

"I wore high heels and a crepe dress on my first day at the hospital because there were no uniforms available for me. Late that evening some kind soul gave me an operating gown to put over my clothes," she recalls.

In her Jewish hospital nursing career, she has been a staff nurse, head nurse, teaching supervisor, and assistant director, school of nursing and nursing service.

They said the hospital was just opening up and it might be a valuable experience for me. I have been here ever since."

A native of Springfield, Kentucky, Miss McClelland enjoys reading historical and autobiographical books and appreciates classical music.

What changes in the nursing school have impressed her the most? "I think it is the stress we put on bedside teaching with the basic foundation in the classroom.

When I first came here there were two nursing instructors, now there are close to twenty."

"When I came here, our records were sparse and consisted mostly of temperature sheets and possibly a note or two by an attending physician," she recalled.

Secretary of the National Association of Medical Record Librarians.

Her hobbies are people, gardening, music, reading and traveling. Last year she and her brother traveled to Europe.

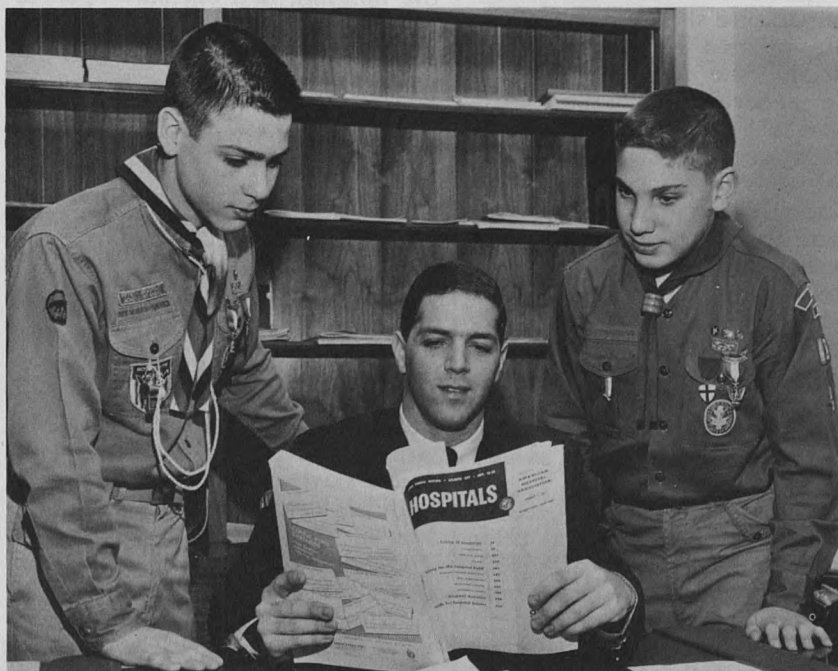

Hospital Growth Trends and New Procedures Cited

Each year, an interpretive statement accompanies the hospital's annual professional services report. The statement cites growth trends and comments on new procedures adopted in various departments of the hospital the previous year. Here are some of the highlights of the 1961 report.

Since 1960, the department of laboratories and pathology has had an increase of 27,639 tests. "This represents an average increase of 8 per cent per year per admission which indicates the growing reliance the clinics are placing on the laboratory as an aid to diagnosis and therapy," the statement suggests.

A new fluorescence microscope, put into use by the division of microbiology and serology, "will result in considerable time saving in the diagnosing of certain bacterial and micotic infections and will materially aid in the diagnosing of syphilis," the report said. The microscope cost about \$5,000.

Surgical procedures for the correction of deafness and extraction of cataracts as well as plastic surgery were cited as three surgical specialties showing a marked increase in activity in 1961. Plastic surgery doubled its activities in 1961. It is a broad field in which congenital abnormalities are corrected, injuries to the soft tissues repaired, and skin grafting and cosmetic problems handled.

The use of fluothane, a new and potent inhalation agent, was increased significantly in 1961 in the division of anesthesiology.

In the radio-isotope laboratory, a machine called the Scintiscanner received increasing recognition. The instrument locates radioactive material in various organs and cavities of the body.

A pulmonary rehabilitation program to teach proper breathing techniques for patients with emphysema and asthma was established by the department of rehabilitation. An amputee clinic in the same department counsels patients in the use of artificial limbs. "There has been much emphasis in the areas of occupational and physical therapy in the continuing training of students as well as the institution of educational programs for interested groups," the report said.

In May 1961, a 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. day care clinic was established by the Ellen Steinberg division of child psychiatry.

Floor Manager Program Begun

Head nurses on the hospital's second floor now perform a greater number of the technically complex functions for which they were professionally trained and leave the purely administrative details of running the three stations on that floor to a newly appointed floor manager.

Mrs. Fran Stovall, who assumed her post last month, is relieving nursing service from such assignments as control, procurement, and distribution of expendable supplies and equipment from central supply; ordering of linens; checking equipment for repairs; enforcing visiting regulations; alerting the dietary department on food problems; and making rounds to check the general housekeeping of the 105-bed surgical floor.

The purpose of the program, according to Mr. Daniel M. Anzel, its developer here and administrative assistant for the hospital, is to improve patient care and possibly to save money through centralization of non-nursing functions.

The electronic machine called the Bekesy audiometer, is operated by the patient who records his responses to an auditory stimulus.

Scoring leaders among the doctors' wives included Mrs. Edith Lipsitz and Mrs. Marilyn Renard.

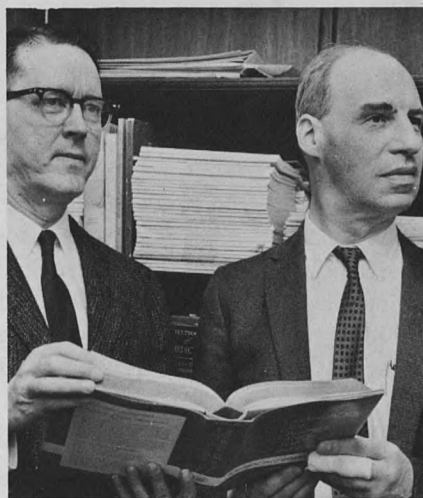

Stroke Patient Rehabilitation Is Discussed

Rehabilitation of stroke patients should begin within twenty-four hours of the onset of attack, a noted rehabilitation expert said at the recent Institution on Rehabilitation Nursing here. The sooner treatment begins, the better the chance the patient will suffer fewer deformities, he said.



The speaker was Dr. Donald L. Rose, professor of physical medicine and chairman of the department of physical medicine, University of Kansas School of Medicine.

"We formerly believed that we should not begin rehabilitative efforts until the medical condition of the patient became stabilized. But if you wait for this, the after effects will stabilize, too, and therefore, the opportunity to alter the after effects will not occur early enough."

Early rehabilitative efforts practically ensure that 92 to 95 per cent of stroke victims can be independently ambulatory at the end of a month, Dr. Rose explained.

He urged the 34 registered nurses at the February 5-9 Institute, to return to their hospitals and instruct their colleagues in the principles they learned. The Institute was sponsored by the Departments of Nursing and Rehabilitation.
