

Parkway Job Nears Finish

Through traffic on Forest Park avenue between Kingshighway boulevard and Euclid avenue is scheduled to begin by mid-October, according to the St. Louis City Traffic Bureau. Opening date of the Forest Park Parkway is still undetermined.

Drivers will be able to turn left from Kingshighway south into Forest Park avenue and make a "U" turn from east to west on Forest Park.

No signal lights or traffic meters will be installed until after a study to determine traffic flow has been made.

The construction is part of the thoroughfare leading from downtown through Forest Park and out to Millbrook in University City.

Employee Flu Shots Again Available

Flu shots will be offered to hospital employees the week of September 24 through September 28, it was announced by Daniel M. Anzel, administrative assistant. "Immunization against the influenza virus is recommended at this time for hospital employees as a preventive health measure," he said.

Second and final booster shots will be offered to employees between October 15 and October 19 at the Employee Health Service. Hours for shots will again be between noon and 2 p.m., with no appointments necessary.

It's Fair Share Time!

Nearly 80 team captains have been appointed to assist in the 1962 United Fund campaign at the hospital. The drive begins September 24 and ends October 12.

Mr. J. W. McAfee, president of Union Electric Co. and head of the United Fund professional division this year, addressed all team captains and division leaders, September 14 in Steinberg Auditorium.

The 1962 quota for hospital employees is \$8,000. "I feel that we will so far exceed this quota as to nearly match last year's record campaign total of \$12,500.," said campaign chairman Robert Rubright.

Campaign workers will emphasize the United Fair Share method of giving—one hour's pay per month over a 12-month period—in campaign talks. The Fair Share

plan is best accomplished through payroll deductions.

Campaign leaders and members of the administration will address employees in departmental rallies during the week of September 17 to 21. Pledge cards will be distributed at the rallies.

Employees will be able to keep abreast of campaign progress by studying the traditional ten foot United Fund thermometer which will be located near the Gift Gallery entrance in the main lobby.

Once each month, April through October, a light yellow truck with a sign atop it reading "We are not the dog catchers" pulls up in front of Forest Park directly across from the hospital.

Out steps a field superintendent of the Humane Society of Missouri. In the park wait youngsters from the Ellen Steinberg Division of Child Psychiatry. In portable carriers, the superintendent carries half a dozen or so six-week-old puppies for a half-hour of frolicking.

"Jewish Hospital is the only institution in St. Louis where we transport dogs away from the shelter," said superintendent Robert Brandau, a six-year Society veteran. "The only other exception is that we take the dogs to Captain 11's Showboat on KPLR-TV."

The puppy visits began in April 1961, a brainstorm of Miss Sally Pugh, hospital recreation director. "The Humane Society hasn't missed a scheduled visit since then," Miss Pugh beamed.

Do the visits pay of? "Well," said Brandau, "it is a matter of scratching each other's back; the kids like the dogs and the dogs like the kids." It sounds somewhat sensible.

Anatomy of 2 Journal Clubs

On a given night at Jewish Hospital, you will find a group of young doctors seated around a long table in one of the hospital's meeting rooms, deeply engaged in what for them is to be a life-long process — the process of learning something more about medicine.

These men are attending a Journal Club, deriving its name from the medical journals which frequently provide the material for discussion. Held primarily for residents, Journal Clubs are conducted once a month by most medical departments of the hospital, part of the program through which young physicians are given an opportunity to study and learn, to discuss their own opinions on medical situations, and to test their opinions against those of older and more experienced men in their department.

Attending such a session is well calculated to make one feel more than ever that a doctor is indeed a trustworthy haven in time of illness. At an Ob-Gyn Journal Club seven residents and a regular staff member are seated informally around a table, discussing one of two topics for the evening: Is it safe to allow a woman who has undergone a previous caesarean section to have her current baby by natural means? Leading the discussion is Dr. David Rothman, head of the department.

With penetrating directness, he asks the residents for their opinions on the evening's subject, based on study they have been asked to do since the topic was assigned. Relentlessly he probes their answers, causing them to explain each generalization, to analyze each conclusion. Gradually a philosophy emerges: in medicine, each case is unique, because each case involves a unique individual.

Upstairs in another meeting room, residents in surgery are gathered for their department's Journal Club. Here the format is different, although the aim is the same. Each has brought with him

to the meeting a few of the dozens of regularly published medical iournals. Since the number of these journals is so great that no one doctor could possibly read them all, each student has been assigned to cover certain ones and to summarize worthwhile articles they contain. Subjects range from the rate of cure in operative breast cancer to the incidence of hepatic carcinoma in sewage-exposed rain-

bow trout.

A discussion follows each summary, as members of the group evaluate the research and analyze it against their own knowledge and conclusions. Some articles are lauded, others bring opinions of dissent.

Monthly Hospital Publication Makes Its Bow

This was the headline on Volume 1, No. 1 of 216 which first appeared in June, 1952. A front page editorial described the role of the new house organ as being a paper "that will not only interpret the hospital's operations, services, policies and its role in the community, but also will strive to get together the employees and staff by giving them the opportunity to learn about each other."

The 216 of 10 years ago was an eight page varityped publication that talked hopefully about the soon-to-be-started building program, the outlying institutions such as Miriam Hospital and the Jewish Sanatorium that would one day be merged with the hospital at the Kingshighway location. It further noted that renovations were being conducted in the Medical Record Room, the Admitting Office and the Nursing Offices.

The personality of the month was Peggy Murray who was just completing 24 years at the hospital switchboard. Since that time Miss Murray has added another ten years to this goal. She may not remember that she was described in the 1952 216 as "sexless, breathless, careless Peggy."

The reporting staff for 216 included a number of people who are still with the hospital such as Florence Ayata (nee Hoffman), Chris Youngerman, Ida Robinson, Marjorie Boulton, Beulah Sanders and David A. Gee, 216's first editor. Other familiar names in the news were George Horne who had just been elected president of the Hospital Pharmacists Association in Greater Saint Louis, Hepple Robinson who was celebrating his 25th anniversary with the hospital and Gilford Ashmore who caught a 14 pound buffalo fish during his vacation.

The Jewish Hospital Medical Center Auxiliary announced its beginning and set a goal for 5000 members.

Medical Staff Alumni Association featured a program of what Jewish Hospital would be like in 1982 with Dr. Leo Sachar as the Eviscerated Chairman of the Disintegrating Committee. Drs. Sidney Goldenberg and Marcy A. Goldstein staged a musical production entitled "When I was an Intern or Twenty Years Ago I Worked Harder than Youse Guys".

Rodney Coe, who received his Ph.D. in sociology from Washington University in June, has become full-time project director in sociology at the Medical Care Research Center.


Dr. Coe will work on research problems in the Ellen Steinberg department of child psychiatry and on the chronic disease unit.

He's Chamber Music Man

A budding composer of chamber and symphonic orchestra music has become the first director of the endocrine diagnostic laboratory of the department of medicine. He is Dr. Miguel Ficher, a Ph.D. in chemistry from Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Violinist Ficher has conducted numerous chamber groups in Buenos Aires as well as some symphonic orchestras. Last winter he played with the St. Louis Philharmonic Orchestra.

Now, he intends to concentrate on composing. "I am working on some chamber compositions but am also interested in trying my hand at symphonies."

His father is a famous Argentinian classical composer, with six symphonies and three operas to

his credit. In 1948 he wrote Solemn Psalm, a cantata dedicated to the new state of Israeli.

Dr. Ficher is a graduate of the University of Buenos Aires and has been in the United States one year. With him are his wife, who will soon be a Ph.D. candidate in psychology at St. Louis University, and his three daughters.

"I am helping to establish an endocrine laboratory for the use of the medical staff and other hospitals in the area," Dr. Ficher said. "I am also doing research on steroids and on other hormones."

Jewish Hospital facilities far outshine those of its Buenos Aires counterpart, Ezrah Hospital, which serves a Jewish community of 400,000. "You have a beautiful building and operation here," he said.

Central Supply Revisions Save Both Time and Supplies

A new Central Supply delivery service began August 20, when remodeling of the dispensary was completed, Supervisor Vernon Bean reported recently.

The new system will save the time and labor of nurses as well as Central Supply personnel, Bean said.

Each nursing station will receive up to five days' requirements of standard items such as needles and syringes. This will eliminate many of the 54,120 trips consuming 8,700 hours which nurses logged last year obtaining supplies.

"And it won't be necessary for Central Supply to remain open twenty-four hours a day," Bean commented. "The department will be closed at night for eight or possibly twelve hours," he said, "although there always will be an oxygen technician on duty."

The delivery system is a result of one and one-half year's study by

the department of industrial engineering and Bean. The study also resulted in a complete remodeling of the department.

"Although we've lost 300 square feet of space, we actually have more workable space with the same amount of supplies," Bean remarked. "Things are much more organized, much neater, and it will be easier for employees to work around the supplies because they'll have everything at their fingertips."

Of the 1,500 items handled by Central Supply, approximately sixty per cent are disposable, that is prepackaged and sterilized, lowering labor costs. New disposable items under consideration include paper instead of linen operating room and delivery room packs.

Redesigning has brought Central Supply such new duties as the refrigeration of blood cultures and the handling of cleaning and disinfectant solutions.

Ocular Neurosis Gets "Once Over"

A relatively undiscussed concept known as "ocular neurosis" is reviewed by Dr. Alex H. Kaplan, director of the department of psychiatry and Dr. Benjamin Milder, director of the hospital's division of ophthalmology, in a two-part series on the psychologic aspects of ophthalmologic practice in recent issues of the American Journal of Ophthalmology.

Persons with recognizable ocular signs or symptoms with emotional cause factors instead of adequate physical cause may have ocular neuroses, the physicians reported. Comparing the symptoms with the examination findings can usually pinpoint the ocular neurotics, they

Blurred vision, hallucinations, and sensory disturbances such as pain, itching, burning, and headaches are often signs of ocular neurosis, the physicians wrote.

They warned that, "If the doctor dismisses the patient's problems as, 'just nerves,' he is endeavoring to make his own escape from the realities of a situation with which he is confronted."

"If symptoms of the eye are caused by psychologic reactions, one must not only look into the present circumstances which cause conflict but also into the reasons why the eye played such an important role in the psychologic development of the patient."

Emotional factors complicate rather than specifically cause eye disease, the physicians reported. Eye defects or eyeglasses may have a significant effect on the growing personality, they added.

Many persons emotionally resist wearing glasses, they explained, because glasses distort one's mental image of oneself, there is some natural hostility toward the eye doctor, and, in the case of children, there is a factor of parental rejection of glasses for his offspring.

The greatest resistance is among teen-agers, they said. "Here the growing ego strength of the patient, would-be development of a body image based on the teen-age ideals—movie and television stars and so forth—and placing a strong emphasis on beauty as a chief element, increases the resistance to spectacles."

The "largest single group of malcontents in an eye practice" are the early presbyopes, they said. In this fortyish age group, persons are first confronted with the possibility of bifocals.

"Granting the knowledge and skill of ophthalmologists, it is evident that much of spectacle acceptance depends upon how the physician can see himself, as well as how he can view the patient as a total psychologic entity."
