Jewish Hospital United Fund Drive Now In Progress

Jewish Hospital's 1968 United Fund Drive is now in progress and will continue through October 18. The Hospital's goal for this year's campaign is set at \$15,912. To meet this goal employees are urged to give a fair share gift of one hour's pay per month for twelve months.

Mrs. Virginia Reisinger, R.N., chairman, and John Bacher, co-chairman, head a fifteen-member steering committee which has been meeting since July to make plans for the drive. The theme for this year's campaign is "Up,

Up and Away."

Earlier, employees received payroll enclosures, including a balloon printed with a United Fund message, alerting them to the drive. Announcements urging participation in the drive are being heard in the employees' cafeteria each day during the drive. The announcements were recorded by winners of a "mystery voice" contest conducted among employees prior to the opening of the drive. A second contest is being held to identify the owners of the "mystery voi-

ces." Winners of both contests will be announced in the next issue of the "216."

Progress of the 1968 drive is being recorded on a chart, marked by an ascending balloon, now located in the ground floor lobby.

Last year Jewish Hospital employees oversubscribed their United Fund goal by 31% with a total gift of \$14,380. The Hospital is one of 119 agencies which benefits from the Drive. In 1967 the Hospital received \$263,120 from the Fund to help care for indigent patients of all races and creeds.

The total 1968 United Fund goal for the metropolitan St. Louis area is \$12,200,000. Funds are used to aid young and old; handicapped and physically disabled; victims of fires and disasters; armed forces personnel and travelers in distress. More than 500,000 persons use United Fund agencies. These agencies provide 92% of all voluntary, rehabilitative family service and youth programs in the metropolitan area.

Funds are allocated to member agencies on the basis of carefully appraised community-wide needs. A 120-member agency relations committee, made up of volunteer citizens, reviews the community's total health, family service and youth needs, studies the function of each agency, then makes allotments based on these factors.

Insurance Policy Presented Hospital by Isaacs Family

Edward B. Greensfelder, president of Jewish Hospital, has announced a gift of \$10,000 from Mr. and Mrs. John A. Isaacs, Jr. Mr. Isaacs, an investment broker with Stifel, Nicholas and Company, made the gift in appreciation for the care which his wife, Eleanor, received during her recent stay at the Hospital, and in recognition of the long range needs of the institution.

The gift, a \$10,000 life insurance policy, was transferred to Jewish Hospital with absolute assignment.

Under the conditions established, Mr. Isaacs will continue

to pay the net premiums on the policy. The \$10,000 will constitute an endowment known as the "Eleanor M. and John A. Isaacs, Jr. Research Fund."

Mr. Greensfelder said: "We are very grateful to the Isaacs for their generosity and foresight. Many philanthropists throughout the country have chosen this excellent method of making a contribution to charitable institutions. It is similar to a bequest, but one for which the Hospital can express its appreciation during the donor's lifetime. We are hopeful that others in the community will consider this type of gift."

AHA Awards Plaque To Jewish Hospital

Jewish Hospital was among 68 hospitals in the country which were honored in Atlantic City September 16 as 50-year members of the American Hospital Association. A plaque commemorating the golden anniversary of

AHA membership was presented to Mrs. Mabel Howell, assistant director of Jewish Hospital, at the opening session of the Association's annual meeting.

The plaque calls attention to the institution's 50 years of "... dedication to community services and ... participation toward our mutual goal of providing better health care services for all the people."

Jewish Hospital became a member of the American Hospital Association the first year after it was reorganized in 1918 from an association of individual members to a hospital association. In that year, leaders in the hospital field proposed the reorganization as "... a real demonstration of the power of the organized hospitals of America to think and plan constructively ... for the future."

Barnes Hospital was the only other institution so honored in the St. Louis area.

The AHA's annual meeting is the nation's largest health care meeting. Some 15,000 hospital and health care personnel, health industry representatives and other guests attended.

Mrs. Howell was advanced to membership status in the American College of Hospital Administrators on September 15, at a convocation ceremony held in Convention Hall in Atlantic City. Mrs. Howell has been an assistant director at Jewish Hospital since January 1967. She is a graduate of Washington University School of Medicine's graduate program in hospital administration.

Greensfelder Elected To WUMSAH Offices

Edward B. Greensfelder, president of Jewish Hospital, was elected vice chairman and vice president of the Washington University Medical School and Associated Hospitals board at the annual meeting of the WUMSAH board of directors in September.

Jewish Hospital has been a member of WUMSAH since 1962. The WUMSAH group is composed of the following health care facilities: Barnes Hospital, St. Louis Children's Hospital, Barnard Free Skin and Cancer Hospital, Central Institute for the Deaf and Jewish Hospital.

Dr. William H. Danforth, Chancellor of Washington University Medical School, was re-elected President.

Other officers include Edwin M. Johnston, Children's Hospital, chairman; George H. Capps, Washington University, treasurer; and Henry N. McCluney, Central Institute for the Deaf, secretary.

The WUMSAH Board explores cooperative programs among member institutions as a means of reducing costs and avoiding unnecessary duplication of services within the Medical Center Complex.

Meet Homer Fulkerson; Food Services Director

Most housewives would panic at the thought of preparing and serving 2,000 meals each day. However, that is the routine task facing Homer Fulkerson when he comes to work each day as the director of Food Services at Jewish Hospital.

Mr. Fulkerson has an impressive background in the food preparation business. He said, "I unknowingly began my career when I took a part time job in our high school cafeteria. When I started the job, my only interest was the money. I ultimately found myself so intrigued by the food preparation business that I managed to work myself through nearly every position in the cafeteria except manager."

Mr. Fulkerson has been in the food service business ever since, except for a brief tour in the armed services when, in his words, "with typical Navy ingenuity they made me a diesel mechanic."

Following graduation from Michigan State University with a degree in institutional management, he resumed his career of food preparation with work in hotels, clubs, department stores, hospitals and industrial accounts.

His association with the Tennessee Valley Authority in Sheffield, Alabama, introduced him to the assistant manager of food services, Miss Ellon Malone,

whom he found particularly interesting. After a short while they were married and the new Mrs. Fulkerson retired from her food career.

"It's really great having a wife who can understand my problems so well. She can lend a truly sympathetic ear because she has played the course."

Cleft Palate Program Is Held Jointly With C.I.D.

Twenty children from rural Missouri participated in a six weeks summer camp, from June 23 to August 2, for children with cleft palates under the joint sponsorship of The Jewish Hospital and Central Institute for the Deaf of Washington University. These are children with congenital deformities of the palate and upper lip which cause deviations in speech.

The summer camp was co-directed by Frank B. Wilson, Ph.D., director, Division of Speech Pathology at the Jewish Hospital and assistant professor of Speech Pathology at Washington University and Frank R. Kleffner, Ph.D., director, Division of Speech Pathology at Central Institute for the Deaf and professor of Speech Pathology at Washington University.

In describing the goals of the program, Dr. Wilson said, "We specifically requested patients in an age group from 10 to 17. Everybody is so busy working with the cleft palate problems of the very young, that patients in this age bracket are frequently forgotten. Many of these children have received little or at best, primitive help, with their oral facial deformities. As a result they look and sound different and they tend to be treated as an oddity in their small home communities and schools. The formal goals of the program were to improve the communicative ability of these children and to improve their physical and emotional health."

The students were housed in the children's dormitory at Central Institute for the Deaf. Under the directorship of Miss Myrna Kapustin, M.A., they enjoyed a wide range of recreational and cultural activities.

The children were evaluated by Marcy Goldstein, M.D., director of Plastic Surgery and chairman of the Cleft Palate Clinic of Jewish Hospital and L. Woodrow O'Brien, D.D.S., professor of prosthodontia and director of the Lasky Cleft Palate

Center at Washington University School of Dentistry.

After a general evaluation at the Lasky Clinic, three dentists performed dental restoration on individual children. They needed extensive work since cleft palate children frequently have poor dental health plus the fact that these children in the main come from economically underprivileged homes where high carbohydrate diets are the rule. Dr. Goldstein performed corrective surgery on three of the children.

The staff for the speech program consisted of certified speech pathologists. These clinicians were selected from the full-time personnel of Central Institute for the Deaf and The Jewish Hospital of St. Louis. They included Miss June Schwankhaus, speech pathologist for Central Institute for the Deaf, Charles Reed, Miss Sue Moore and Mrs. Nancy Younger, speech pathologists from The Jewish Hospital.

The children were examined by William Brandhorst, D.D.S., who is the orthodontist for The Jewish Hospital Cleft Palate Clinic. Seven of the children were then seen for orthodontic procedures.

Ben H. Senturia, M.D., director of The Jewish Hospital Department of Otolaryngology examined the children since it is common for children with cleft palates to also have ear disorders. Dr. Senturia did extensive ear, nose and throat examinations, prescribing medication and recommending surgery where indicated. The hearing of all the children was evaluated in the Division of Audiology under the direction of David C. Shepherd, Ph.D., director of the Division, at The Jewish Hospital. Ten of the children had significant hearing loss and four were fitted with hearing aids.

Mrs. Marilyn Lamb, psychologist on the staff of The Jewish Hospital, Department of Otolaryngology, performed individual psychometric and educational evaluations on each child.

Dr. Wilson said, "We feel that this project was a most successful one since it encompassed every facet of problems which these cleft palate children face, and a very real effort was made to solve as many of these problems as possible. We want to repeat this program next year and we would like to include more children."

I. C. Middleman, M.D. Noted Surgeon Dies

Funeral services for I. C. Middleman, M.D., an associate attending surgeon at Jewish Hospital, were held September 22 at Shaare Emeth Temple in University City.

Dr. Middleman, 58 years old, died of a heart attack at his home, 9 Wendover Place in Ladue on September 20.

He was well known for his services as a physician to the St. Louis Cardinals baseball team, the St. Louis Stars soccer team and the St. Louis Zoo.

Dr. Middleman was born in St. Louis. He was a graduate of University City High School and

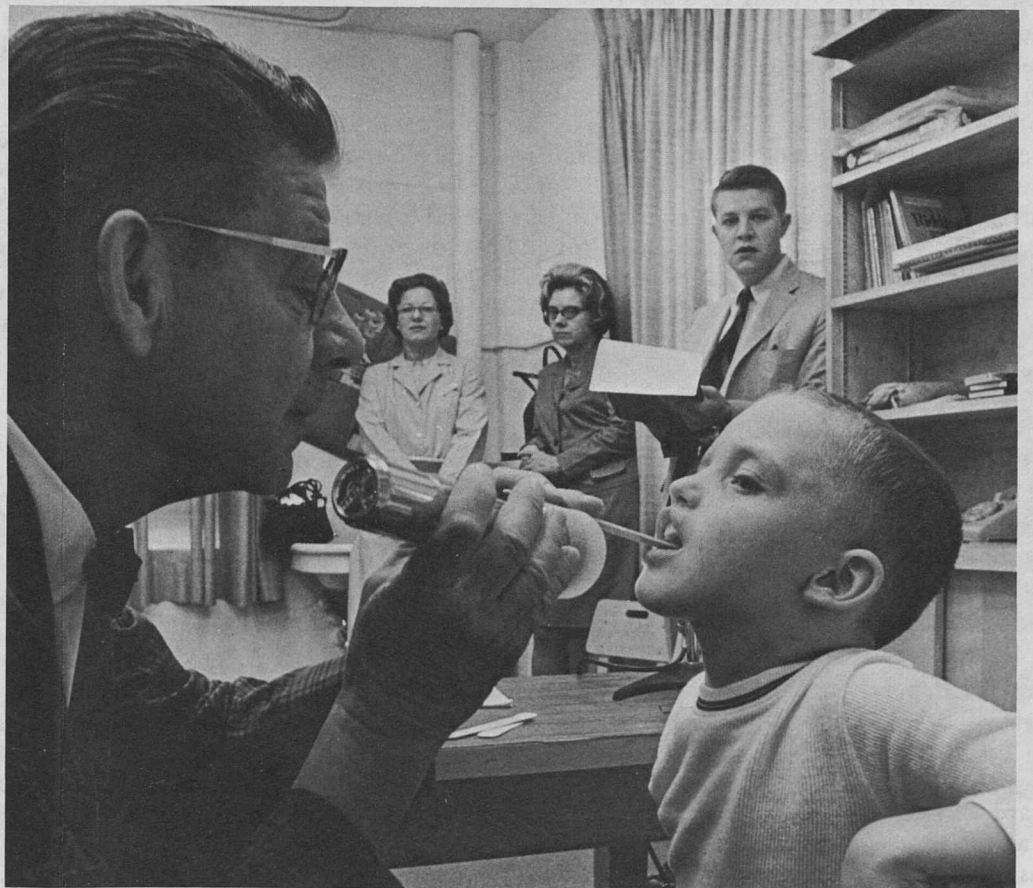
the St. Louis University Medical School, where he was an associate professor.

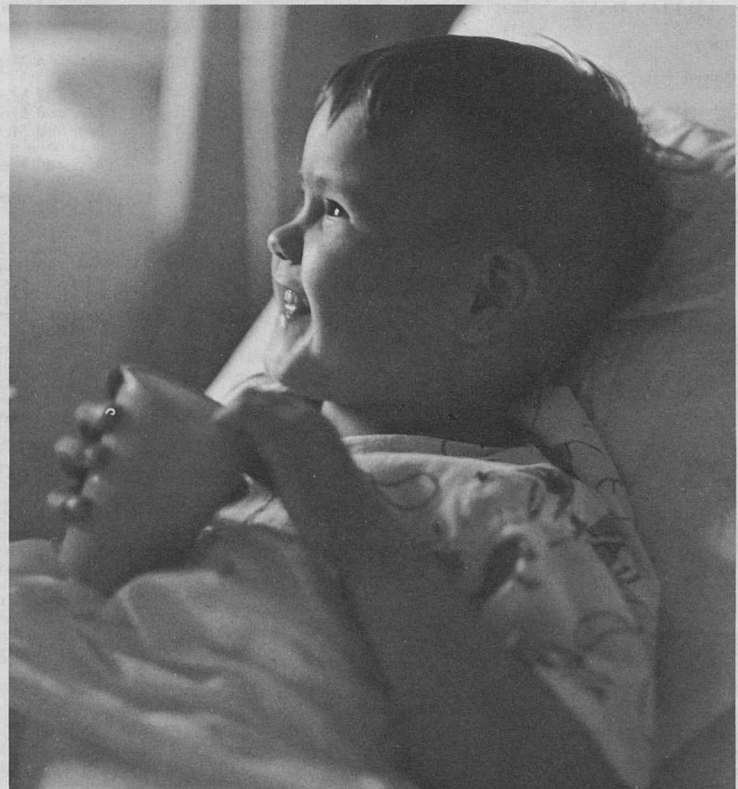

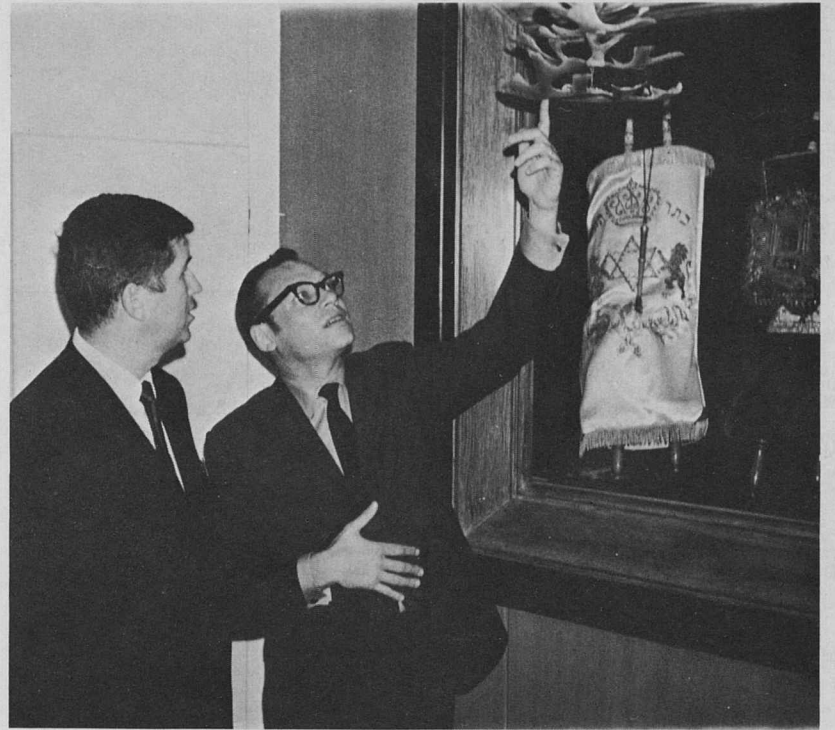
