Imagine how frustrating a language barrier must be for a hospital patient. A Yiddish-speaking patient, for instance, would find it most difficult to convey her thoughts, feelings and needs to a nurse and indeed to her own physician if she was unable to speak English.

As a solution to this problem Jewish Hospital has initiated the Shalom Volunteer Program as an additional response to the needs and comforts of Jewish patients.

Shalom volunteers are concerned men and women from the community interested in helping others by providing a special service—speaking Yiddish with those patients who need to converse in Yiddish. At the same time they serve as "company" for the patients they visit in the clinic, the emergency room and on patient floors each week morning. They're on the scene weekend mornings as well, and, if needed, can be reached by phone to translate for patients who are unable to communicate satisfactorily with the nursing staff and physicians. They serve in addition to Yiddish-speaking members of the staff who can't comply with all the requests.

Each Shalom volunteer distributes an information brochure, printed in English and Yiddish, to all Jewish patients upon admission. The brochure explains the new patient program as well as the many religious observances and special activities held at the Hospital for Jewish patients.

Major Gifts to Hospital by Mr. and Mrs. Roswell Messing Jr.

Mr. and Mrs. Roswell Messing Jr. have announced another major gift to The Jewish Hospital of St. Louis, according to Edward B. Greensfelder, president.

During the recent Expansion Fund effort, Mr. and Mrs. Messing pledged \$250,000 which will be recognized by naming the main entrance lobby and courtyard area in the Phase II construction program which includes the Sydney M. Shoenberg Pavilion.

Their most recent pledge of \$500,000 is made in the form of an outright gift of \$250,000 and a challenge grant of \$250,000 dependent upon the directors of the Hospital obtaining an additional \$250,000 in gifts and pledges to match the conditional portion of the gift.

"Bud and Wilma Messing have offered an exciting new impetus to our fund raising efforts," Mr. Greensfelder said. "As chairman of the Individuals Division of the Expansion Fund, Bud did an outstanding job in organizing the program. His generous commitment of time and financial support has contributed greatly to our success in obtaining more than \$9.5 million toward the expansion of facilities.

"This \$500,000 gift will greatly assist us in expanding our professional programs.

"In recognition of their generosity, we will establish an endowed Messing Professional Chair, the guidelines for which are presently being established. Endowed Chairs enable us to attract the most highly qualified physicians to develop innovative programs of patient care, education and research. Our commitment to excellence is fulfilled by the academic physicians who occupy these chairs," Mr. Greensfelder said.

"We greatly appreciate the benevolent support which Wilma and Bud Messing have provided. Their total commitment to the Hospital is a challenge to all of us who are concerned with better health care."


In 1959 he received the Citation of Merit for Outstanding Achievement and Meritorious Service in Business Administration. The award was established at the University in 1958.

MESSING EDUCATION FUND FOR NURSING

A demonstration and dedication June 7 officially opened Washington University Medical Center's new heliport. Located on the Busch Parking lot at Clayton and Newstead Avenues, the helicopter landing pad is within easy access of the Medical Center. The property was donated by Anheuser Busch, Inc., in 1971.

The Heliport service represents a vital addition to the medical center and to the health care of the community as it facilitates the transfer of critically ill and injured patients to the comprehensive emergency and medical facilities available at the Medical Center.

The ambulance, with the most sophisticated emergency equipment,

will provide transportation from the WUMC heliport to the member hospital. It will also be used to transport patients from their homes and will provide patient transfer to or from other hospitals. Priority use for the ambulance will be to serve the heliport. Barnes Hospital provides the driver for all ambulance trips while the hospital using the ambulance will provide cabin attendants.

Speaking at the dedication ceremony were Raymond E. Rowland, chairman of the Medical Center board of directors and of Barnes Hospital board of trustees, and Dr. Samuel Guze, WUMC president and Washington University vice chancellor for medical affairs.



Hospital Matches 100%, 30 Interns Appointed

Jewish Hospital again matched 100 per cent of its internship positions through the National Intern and Resident Matching Program. There were 14 straight medicine internships and seven straight surgery internships filled. In addition, residency positions in obstetrics and gynecology and pathology were filled.

Over and above the formal matching arrangements the Hospital obtained three medical interns, one surgery intern and three dental interns for a total of 30 new first year house staff positions for the year beginning July 1. The total Jewish Hospital house staff will number 107 interns, residents and clinical fellows for the coming year.

The matching program is the result of a cooperative effort on the part of medical students, medical schools and hospitals to match students with hospitals in the best possible combinations according to both students' and hospitals' preferences.

Of 7,200 United States hospitals only 10 per cent have house staff educational programs. More than 13,000 students participated in this year's matching program for the available openings which numbered over 18,000. The total matched was 10,638 which is about 57 per cent. In the St. Louis area, all the Washington University Medical Center hospitals filled their internship positions for 1973-74.

Mrs. Edna Love was the single employee who was honored for 25 years of service this year.



Bry-Dreyer Fund Supports Rehabilitation Psychologist

In September 1971, Dr. Larry Bass joined the staff of the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine as the first clinical psychologist in that area. His newly-created post is supported by the Lisa Bry-James Dreyer Memorial Fund which was established in 1970 by Mr. and Mrs. M. Erwin Bry Jr. in memory of their daughter and Mrs. Bry's brother.

Because of their interest in young people, Mr. and Mrs. Bry wanted to develop this program to benefit teenagers and young adults with counseling while in the rehabilitation program. The additional service provided by a clinical psychologist will better enable these patients to rebuild their lives psychologically as well as physically following serious injury and traumatic experiences.

As a psychologist Dr. Bass works with the rehabilitation patients and staff (1) in evaluating psychological strengths and weaknesses in patients in order to assess the need for psychotherapeutic interventions, (2) in assisting the patient in adjusting to his disability, and (3) in assisting the staff in understanding the patient's own relation to the medical and physical rehabilitation program planned for him.

Dr. Bass is part of the overall rehabilitation team. He makes contact with the patient shortly after he is admitted and follows the patient through the entire hospitalization period. Dr. Franz U. Steinberg, Director of the Department of Rehabilitation Medicine, has stressed the tremendous

benefits of having a psychologist/ counselor available at all times rather than borrowing services from other agencies and departments.

Dr. Bass sees some patients individually for counseling or psychotherapy. In addition, all patients on the rehabilitation unit are divided into two groups for weekly unit meetings. These sessions, led by Dr. Bass and the head nurse on the unit, provide opportunities for new patients to ask questions about unfamiliar procedures on the unit. The sessions are also used to answer patients' inquiries about problems related to their handicaps, social problems encountered upon discharge, self-care techniques and other related problems.

In addition to therapeutic interventions, Dr. Bass is also called upon to make psychological evaluations of patients, either utilizing an interview, administration and interpretation of tests, or both.

Dr. Bass is available for consultation with the rehabilitation staff regarding particular difficulties they may encounter in working with a patient. He provides a consultation/teaching service for student nurses, who rotate through the rehabilitation department, before their contact with the patients to help them recognize the various psychological reactions to traumatic injuries.

As of September 1972, Dr. Bass was given a joint appointment in the Department of Psychiatry where his

responsibilities have included the supervision of psychology interns and practicum students as well as teaching a course on psychological testing.

Dr. Bass completed his Ph.D. in clinical psychology at Washington University. Previously he had served a one-year internship at Mount Zion Hospital and Medical Center in San Francisco.


