### **Laboratory Safety**

EH&S has implemented an internal auditing process for the proper storage, labeling and handling of materials and wastes within the Colleges of Science, Engineering, Applied Sciences, and the Humanities and Arts. College deans, associate deans and their staff use an audit checklist to verify that laboratories, studios, shops and service centers are using best laboratory safety practices. The audits are conducted each semester and the college takes action to correct deficiencies.

The audits have identified a need for each college to better control the inventory of materials kept on hand. EH&S collaborates with the colleges to implement an inventory control system that will enable them to identify, track and reduce the inventory of outdated, unwanted, recyclable or surplus materials. The software system is expected to be available to the campus community by the end of the Fall 2013 semester.

### The IIPP - Injury and Illness Prevention Program

An effective Injury and Illness Prevention Program (IIPP) assists management to determine what hazards exist in the workplace, how to correct hazards that occur, and how to prevent them from recurring.

At SJSU, Environmental Health & Safety is responsible for the <u>Injury and Illness Prevention</u> <u>Program (PDF)</u>.

There are 8 key elements in the program:

- Identify the person or persons with authority and responsibility for implementing the program
- · Ensure that employees comply with safe and healthy work practices
- Communicate with employees on matters relating to occupational safety and health
- Identify and evaluate workplace hazards and schedule periodic inspections to identify unsafe conditions and work practices
- · Maintain procedures to investigate occupational injury or occupational illness
- Maintain procedures to correct unsafe or unhealthy conditions, work practices and work

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procedures in a timely manner based on the severity of the hazard

- · Provide training and instruction
- · Keep records of steps taken to implement and maintain the program

The IIPP applies to all San Jose State faculty, staff, students and visitors. The immediate responsibility for workplace health and safety belongs to each campus employee who performs a supervisory role. Accordingly, all faculty and staff are to ensure that safe and healthful conditions and work practices are provided and followed within the areas under their control. Members of the campus community are to cooperate fully with all aspects of the campus health and safety program.

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### **Creating Dialogue through the Evaluation Process**

In May, Human Resources introduced the new and improved MPP Evaluation Process and MPP Evaluation Form to promote the ongoing dialogue about work performance and goals. The presentation gives MPPs the tools needed to initiate and maintain ongoing workplace dialogue from establishing expectations, providing and engaging in feedback, to actively evaluating performance.

### **Benefits Open Enrollment**

The annual Benefits Open Enrollment period for SJSU employees is September 16, 2013 through October 11, 2013. All changes made during Open Enrollment will be effective January 1, 2014.

Open Enrollment is the annual opportunity to make changes to your benefit plans. During this period, you may enroll in or change a health or dental plan, add or delete dependents,

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enroll or cancel FlexCash and enroll in a Flexible Spending Account (HCRA/DCRA).

Please note that if you currently participate in either HCRA or DCRA and wish to continue for tax year 2014, you must re-enroll during Open Enrollment.

IT Services is beginning a campus-wide initiative to eliminate the need for you to remember so many passwords and to make it easier for you to access the services you need. Working with more than 25 IT departments across campus, and the Active Directory experts at Moran Technology Consulting, IT Services is striving to consolidate more than 34 independent directories into a single, robust system.

For students, the new directory will allow them to use a single username and password for everything from checking their position on course waitlists, to logging into the housing lab, to browsing the Internet.

### **Back to School Safety Reminders**

The University Police Department would like to provide you with some helpful reminders as we begin the Fall 2013 semester.

- Take a moment to program your cell phone with the University Police Department direct dial number: (408) 924-2222.
- Review your <u>MySJSU</u> account to ensure that the phone number you have listed can receive an AlertSJSU SMS text message.
- You may send an anonymous text or voicemail message regarding suspicious activity to the University Police Department any time of day or night. Text (408) 337-2919, or email SJSU@tipnow.org.
- The UPD Evening Guide Service is available to all students and employees 24 hours a
  day. A Police Service Assistant or University Police Officer will escort you up to two blocks
  off campus. Use a Blue Light phone, an elevator phone, or call (408) 924-2000 to
  request an escort.
- The Evening Shuttle is a safe alternative to walking alone at night, beyond the zone covered by the Evening Guide Service. The shuttle runs Monday-Friday, from 7:00pm to 1:00am, and you can reach the service from a blue light phone, elevator phone, or by calling dispatch at (408) 924-2000.
