Water Conservation Measures at SJSU

California faces a severe water shortage, and we all need to assist in conservation efforts. Fortunately, SJSU has been implementing conservation measures for some time.

Below are some historical water usage numbers or SJSU.

Year	Fresh Water (in gal.)	Recycled Water (in gal.)
2010/11	153,000,000	36,000,000
2011/12	134,000,000	50,000,000
2012/13	116,000,000	71,000,000

Here are some of the measures already implemented and some plans for the future.

Here is what we've done:

- FD&O switched to recycled water for landscape irrigation and for MLK Library toilets in 2011/12. This effort saves 65,000,000 gallons of potable water annually.
- We have implemented a dual plumbing system into three of the current construction projects; Spartan Complex, Student Union, and the Student Health Center, thereby providing recycled water for all toilets in these buildings. This will result in additional savings of potable water.
- The central plant cooling tower utilizes recycled water, saving large amounts of potable water.
- We recently installed over 400 low flow toilets, made possible via grant money. These low flow toilets use 1.5 gallons per flush rather than 7 gallons previously used, thereby reducing water usage by 80%.

Here is what we can do:

- We are exploring converting the Central Plant direct steam system to recycled water. The lease of the required equipment which would generate a savings of 6.5 million gallons annually.
- We are looking into the replacement of more toilets with low flow units.

New state regulations reduce the frequency in which state vehicles are washed. FD&O will comply with these regulations.

• Students, faculty and staff can turn off running water whenever possible, report water leaks as soon as seen, and report running toilets as soon as seen.

We considered shutting off the water fountains, however, since the water savings would be a couple of gallons a day, decided the campus would benefit more from the continued access.

It's important to note that SJSU supplies its potable water from its own well, which is 600 feet underground. As such, our water source is not impacted by the drought like other water sources. Nonetheless, we should create good habits and still strive to conserve where we can.



Sustainability Presentation to Young Cultural Ambassador's Program

On Wednesday, January 22, FD&O and the College of Engineering hosted the Young Cultural Ambassadors, a group of 80 students, 7 to 11 years of age, from China. The students were approaching the end of a 3 week visit in the US as a cultural exchange program.

Due to the increasing number of environmental issues affecting their country, the students were incredibly curious and eager to learn about the university's sustainability policies and activities. As such, Debbie Andres, our FD&O Sustainability Analyst held a presentation for the Young Ambassador's.

The vision of this exchange was to introduce sustainable practices to the next generation so that they can affect change in their country. Many of them had never heard of practices such as composting, recycling water and LED lighting. The ambassadors spent 2 hours learning about the LEED certified Martin Luther King, Jr. Library, the recycled water usage on campus, the campus cogeneration plant and the Sustainable Agriculture program through the Environmental Studies department. The ambassadors concluded their visit with a tour of MLK Library and the Environmental Studies' Sustainable Agriculture garden. The presentation was a huge success.

Accounting Services

Effective January 20, 2014, our Accounting Services Office has been reorganized. Check out the summary of our team-based structure of the <u>Accounting Services Office</u> for more information.

The team-based concept was designed to increase efficiency, improve communication and provide better customer service. We've appointed team leads to help accomplish this goal.

The Fund Team is led by Regina Villanueva. The fund team members specialize in particular funds, such as Financial Aid, Federal Work Study, Operating Funds, General Funds, Housing and Parking.

The Services Team handles bank reconciliations, investment accounts, billing and chargebacks, and is led by Juanitz Ceniza.

The Student Financials Team is led by Shirley Wen. This team is responsible for Student Financial System payments, adjustments and accounts assignment.

Additionally, we have a Plant Accounting Team, led by Trang To. With the assistance of Daisy Phan, this team handles the accounting for all of our Capital Assets.

In the next a few months, we look forward to also transitioning the Accounts Payable Unit to the Accounting Services Office.

Mileage Reimbursement Rate for 2014

The California State University standard mileage rate for business travel occurring on or after January 1, 2014 will decrease from 56.5 cents per mile to 56 cents per mile. Miles driven for moving purposes will be reimbursed at 23.5 cents per mile, decreased from 24 cents per mile.

The FTS Travel module has been updated to reflect the current mileage rate.

Spartan Bookstore Partnership

The partnership with the Spartan Bookstore, which allows students to purchase books and supplies and have those charges added to their student account, has been very successful. For the 2012-2013 academic year, the first year for the program, students purchased almost \$300,000 books and supplies. For the Fall 2013 semester alone, students purchased approximately \$267,000 in books and supplies. It appears that we are on our way to almost doubling sales. Prior to the start of this semester, students had already purchased over \$45,000 worth of books and supplies.

Consolidated PeopleSoft HR System (CHRS) Coming in 2015

The CSU is upgrading and consolidating its PeopleSoft HR systems over the next two years, much like they consolidated the Finance systems a few years ago. The new database is called CHRS and San José State is currently scheduled to move to the new environment in April, 2015. There will be a lot of information coming in the next year and a half but here are a few critical items to note:

- Data from all 23 campuses, plus the Chancellor's Office, will be in one database.
- The HR database will be separate from the Student database. Systems will be put in place to keep personal data in synch.
- Security will be put in place to ensure only SJSU employees see SJSU data, with the exception of staff in the Chancellor's Office.
- Processes will change, and training and documentation will be provided to ensure a smooth transition.

Update on Compensation Increases

Unit 1 - Still in negotiation with the Chancellor's Office

Units 2, 5, 7, 9 - 1.34% increase to be applied to all eligible employees on March 1 pay warrant, retroactive to July 1, 2013

Unit 3 - Paid in December 2013

Unit 4 - Paid in December 2013

Unit 6 - 1.34% increase to be applied to all eligible employees effective July 1, 2013; no date set on when it will be applied to eligible employee salaries

Unit 8 - 4.6% increase effective January 1, 2014; no date set on when it will be applied to eligible employee salaries

MPP/C99 - 1.34% increase to be applied to all eligible employees on March 1 pay warrant, retroactive to July 1, 2013

IT Services (ITS) is working with a campus committee to identify and implement SJSU Portal technology that aligns with Vision 2017. The goal is to make it easier for SJSU students, faculty and staff to navigate teaching, learning, and administrative tasks.

Each SJSU system currently requires a separate login. The SJSU Portal will provide a single sign-on allowing access to relevant information and applications services appropriate to one's role at SJSU. Additionally, navigation will be made easier through customized and personalized views within the portal environment.

The pilot phase of the SJSU Portal will provide single sign-on to applications such as PeopleSoft, Canvas, WebEx, Google apps and other SJSU applications along with targeted personalized messaging.

Ideally, the SJSU portal will increase student engagement, making it easier for students and faculty to communicate and collaborate, find instructional resources and streamline administrative tasks.

SJSU Mobile Apps

IT Services (ITS) is working with a campus committee to identify and implement SJSU mobile applications that integrate with PeopleSoft, Canvas, Google apps, other campus information application and developed apps.

The initial focus of the mobile apps will be on personalized integrated access to PeopleSoft with direct jumps to specific areas of use (e.g. Student Enrollment (add/drops), Class schedule for students, class rosters for faculty, integration with Canvas, informational apps such as directory search, campus events, WebEx, Google apps, and others).

The Portal and Mobile initiatives will provide SJSU with strategic building blocks that support self-service across the SJSU community.

WiFi was also introduced for the first time in Campus Village and the residence halls.



Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management Software

On January 1, UPD went live with RIMS computer aided dispatch and records management software (CAD/RMS). SJSU joined 13 other CSU campuses that have installed RIMS and there are future plans to link the CSU law enforcement databases together.

RIMS CAD assists the dispatchers by interfacing with other systems such as the Department of Justice, DMV and the 9-1-1 system. Data is automatically transferred into the system eliminating the redundant entering of information. When the system is fully integrated, UPD will also be able to directly access information from other law enforcement agencies across the Bay Area through the CopLink interface. This sharing of information may help officers to solve crimes that would otherwise have gone unsolved.

RIMS allows for more extensive police records keeping and data searches than our previous legacy system. It also has allowed UPD to incorporate all of our law enforcement data systems into one system.

UPD Holiday Toy Drive Helps Local Families

For the 22nd consecutive year, the UPD organized Holiday Toy Drive provided toys and food for families in our community who are in need. Thanks to the SJSU community who generously donated toys and money, 184 families in the campus community were able to celebrate the holidays with a little more joy. Toys were handed out by Santa Claus to over 450 children. A supermarket gift certificate was also given to each family. Both the children and the adults were very thankful. Santa Claus was able to personally deliver gifts to 58 families at their homes in the surrounding neighborhood. Other families came to SJSU where they were greeted by Santa Claus with their gifts. The children watched holiday movies while they waited in line to meet Santa.
