Bill Smith came through with victories in the 100 yard dash and broad jump, and added a tie for second in the high jump to take high scoring honors with 12 points. rank Minini won his two favorevents, the shot put and discus, thout any trouble.
San Jose's victory was clean cut as they swept two events, the two mile in which Dick Knox and Irving Smith trailed Eustace Rojas to the tape in 10:34.6, and the discus which Minini won at 134 feet O'Connor and Lawton Hay. In five other events, the 440 yard dash, 100 yard dash, 880 yard run, the shot put, and broad jump, the Spartans placed one two.
