

Sam Shepard's violent and sensual one-act play FOOL FOR LOVE will be performed at San Jose State University February 12th, 13th and 14th. This passionate drama will be staged by Master of Fine Arts director Joseph Christensen.

The explosive action in <u>Fool</u> <u>For</u> <u>Love</u> is a psychological combat between Eddie and May whose "violent emotions are constantly on the verge of going out of control." Confined in a motel room somewhere in the Southwestern desert "Eddie and May constantly bang against the walls perfectly conveying their claustrophobic sense of entrapment and the futility of their intense desire to escape." Both live in a relentless state of conflict because of their overwhelming desire for each other and their overpowering need to escape from each other.

Many of Shepard's obsessions evolve from the pop-counter culture of the 1950's and 60's. Shepard is heavily influenced by rock & roll in his writing and in 1971 said "I don't want to be a playwright, I want to be a rock and roll star . . . I started writing to keep from going off the deep end." In addition to a rock and roll texture permeating his plays, Shepard dwells on dirt and dishevelment which represents the death of the mythical American dream.
