## St. Louis, Cincinnati Stage Six-Man Trade

NEW YORK (UPI)—Cincinnati Redlegs and St. Louis Cardinals have played checkers with six players.

Redlegs moved first baseman George Crowe, southpaw Alex Kellner and infielder Alex Grammas to St. Louis. The Cardinals countered with infielder Eddie Kasko, pitcher Bob Mabe and outfielder Del Ennis. General Manager Gabe Paul and field skipper Mayo Smith handled negotiations for Cincinnati. General Manager Bing Devine and Manager Solly Hemus okayed the Cardinal end.

Crowe is key man so far as the Cardinals are concerned despite having slumped to only seven homers and 61 runs batted in last season. Crowe slammed 31 homers and had 92 R-B-I's in 1957.

### Practice Sessions Continue for SJS Gridiron Team

Spartan footballers continue, after a two day rest period, bending their backs in practice sessions under the watchful eye and taut whip of Coach Bob Titchenal this afternoon.

Titchenal stated last week that the squad was not bearing down much as possible but wrote this off because there was no game. This week Coach Titchenal expects the players to be more "fired up" during scrimmages.

The team will have to remain mentally ready for the big Cal Poly line and backfield. The Mustangs could possibly field a backfield with an average of 192 lbs. Line play could be the deciding factor with the blockers from Cal Poly having a possible edge in this department.

SJS and Cal Poly first met in 1923 with the Mustangs blanking the Spartans, 14-0. Since then, the Spartans have won eight times while losing three. Six of the 11 tilts have resulted in shut-outs, with the Spartans winning four via this route.

Hopes for the Spartans also center around what the coaches saw of Cal Poly last Saturday's game against the Idaho State College Coyotes. If the game was close (score not available at press time) and Mustangs may have had to open their bag of tricks and allow Spartan mentors, Titchenal, Marty Feldman, and Gene Menges to get a good look at their sleight-of-hand winning style.

Emmett Lee and Mike Jones will probably share quarterback duties this Saturday.

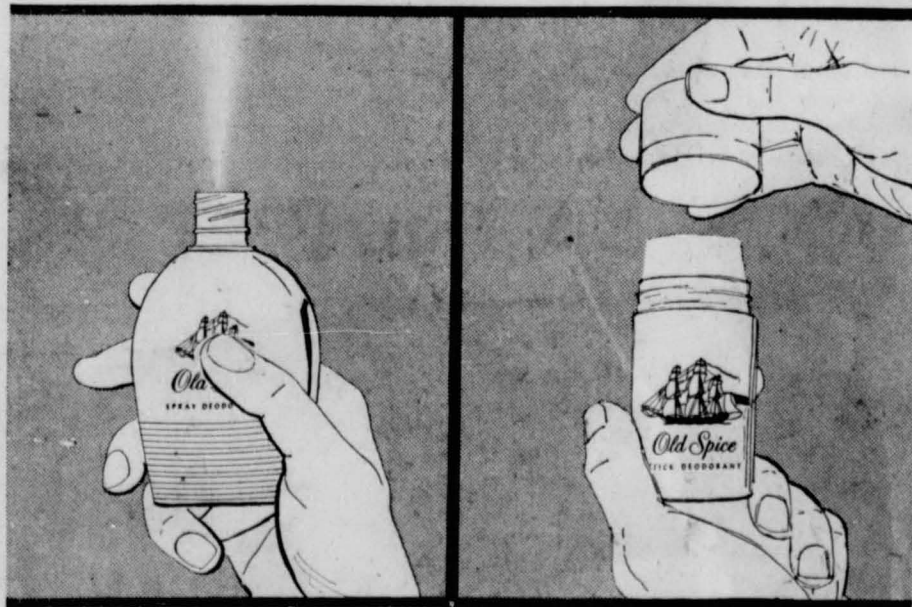

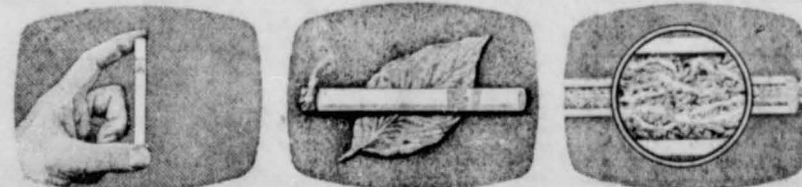
