
Just a word of explanation as to this much publicized "flanker" attack formation which Pacific uses. The Tigers, revolve out of their huddle co ing out loud and together in rythm (They may have eliminated the outloud part by now). After a number of counts (During which time they are shifting around) they arrive in formation

This formation consists of a simple anced line and backfield, only the backfield appears to have three men backfield appears to have three men in it. The fourth, the quarterback, is standing out ten or fifteen yards to-ward the side line facing the team. From this position he shouts signals to his team-mates and is eligible for passes which are frequently thrown to

We're certainly glad to see Jack Wilson back out in gridiron togs. Jack is a letterman and should be a great help to Dud's convalescing line. Dur-ing spring practice, Wilson was the victim of misfortune, getting a foot planted in his face and breaking his nose. This kept him out of the rest of spring work and the first of the season this fall. However, with a specially constructed helmet, Jack is back in harness and should see a good deal of action from now on.

Another lineman, Mel Hornbeck of 1932 All-Conference fame, is working out in an effort to be in shape for the Pacific game.
