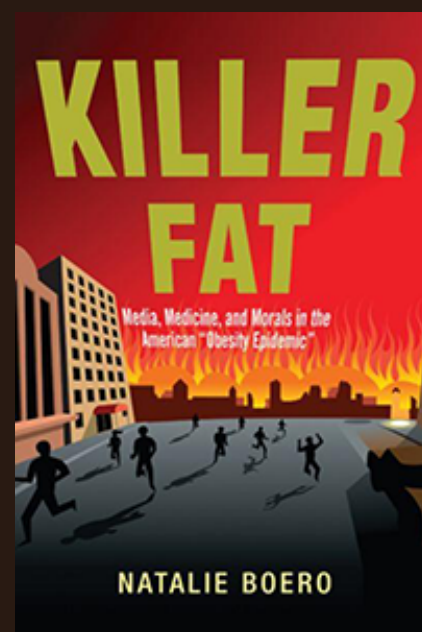

Her book, *Killer Fat: Media, Medicine, and Morals in the American "Obesity Epidemic,"* examines how and why obesity has emerged as a public health concern and national obsession in recent years.
