The Spartans include: Bill Pas sey. in the high hurdles; Roger Smythe in the low hurdles; Frank Knight in the 880; Dick Kaufman. sprints; and Stu Inman in the 440. Passey has been a consisient winner in the high hurdles, while Smythe captured three first places against Santa Clara High. and two against Bellarmine. Other colleges which have entered the 6th Army's relays include: San Francisco, Santa Rosa san Mateo Junior colleges, and Nan Mateo Junior
