# African American Men Survey

#### **Methodology**

The Washington Post/Kaiser Family Foundation/Harvard University Survey Project is a three-way partnership and an experiment in combining survey research and reporting to better inform the public. The Post, Kaiser, and Harvard jointly design and analyze surveys examining public knowledge, perceptions, and misperceptions on major issues. The Post then reports the results as well as facts to dispel myths and misperceptions. Our hope is that this project contributes to a better understanding of public knowledge on major issues facing the country as well as more effective efforts by the media to educate, inform, and engage citizens in national debates.

Representatives of The Washington Post, The Henry J. Kaiser Family Foundation, and Harvard University worked together to develop the survey questionnaire and analyze the results. Each organization bears the sole responsibility for the work that appears under its name. The project team included Richard Morin, The Washington Post director of polling and Claudia Deane, assistant director of polling; Drew E. Altman, president of the Kaiser Family Foundation, Mollyann Brodie, vice president and director of public opinion and media research, and Elizabeth Hamel, associate director of public opinion and media research; and Robert J. Blendon, professor of health policy and political analysis at the Harvard School of Public Health and the John F. Kennedy School of Government, and John M. Benson, managing director of the Harvard Opinion Research Program in the Harvard School of Public Health. Michael Dawson, the John D. MacArthur professor of political science at the University of Chicago, served as a consultant on this project.

The *African American Men Survey*, the 15<sup>th</sup> in this partnership series, was conducted by telephone from March 20 to April 29, 2006 among 2,864 randomly selected adults nationwide. The survey included large oversamples of African American men and women (see table below) in order to allow for accurate analysis of subgroups of this population. Results shown in the total column represent the opinions of the country as a whole, including respondents of all races, and are adjusted so that black respondents are represented in proportion to their actual share of the population. Hispanics and Asians were interviewed along with white and black respondents, but because of the actual size of those populations, there were not enough respondents to break out separately. Telephone interviews were conducted by ICR/International Communications Research.

(4) Sampling error is only one of many potential sources of error in this or any other public opinion poll.
