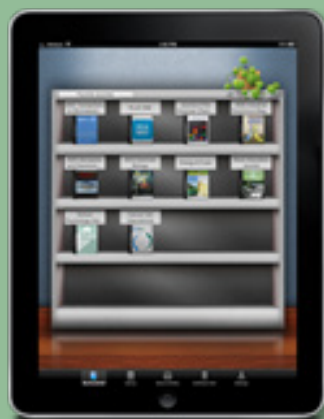
RESTRICTED ACCESS - FINAL EXAMS

GSU LIBRARY'S DIGITAL COLLECTIONS

The Feminist Postcard collection was selected for digitization from the Archives for Research on Women and Gender. The collection consists of one hundred and twenty-three picture postcards and two greeting cards from the 1960s through the late 1980s; most of the postcards represent feminist women and activities, though some depict anti-feminist attitudes. The Digital Projects Unit of Digital Library Services digitizes the library's archival, rare, and unique resources for public access through the Digital Collections website.
