## HOUSING INFORMATION

Since Pepperdine’s Bible Lectureship occurs during the spring break, dormitory space will be available to our lectureship guests. 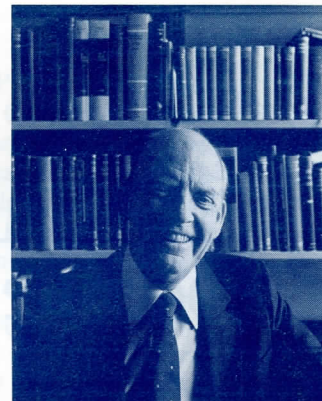

Frank Pack's keen intellect began to manifest itself in his early youth as he graduated from grammar school as valedictorian and from high school as salutatorian. He attended David Lipscomb College, received his B.A. from the University of Chattanooga, and his M.A. from Vanderbilt University. His Ph.D. was awarded by the University of Southern California.

In his remarkable forty-six year teaching career at three Christian colleges, Dr. Pack has helped to prepare a great host of young preachers who now proclaim Christ around the world. Frank has taught at David Lipscomb College (1940-1944), George Pepperdine College (1945-1949), Abilene Christian College (1949-1963), and Pepperdine University (1963-1986). In addition to his teaching at Pepperdine, he served as Dean of the Graduate School from 1967 until 1978. He was promoted to Distinguished Professor of Religion in 1978.

Along with his academic work, Dr. Pack has served as preaching minister for Churches of Christ in Tennessee, Texas and California. He has preached for the Culver Palms Church of Christ in Los Angeles for the past twenty-three years. Frank has preached in over 300 gospel meetings and has been a featured speaker in college lectureships throughout the nation.

Not content to confine his efforts to the pulpit and classroom, Frank is also a prolific writer. He has published nine books and more than 300 articles in his productive career.

In *Who's Who in America* for 1984-85, Dr. Pack is quoted as saying: "From my youth I have been committed to New Testament Christianity. This faith I have shared with others. By Christ's standards I have endeavored to live and to serve."

### HOUSING INFORMATION

Since Pepperdine's Bible Lectureship occurs during the spring break, dormitory space will be available to our lectureship guests. If you wish to reserve space, please include \$15.00 per bed with your registration form when you send it in. This charge covers the entire week (Tuesday through Friday nights). Due to the great demand for on-campus housing, dorm beds are reserved for adults only. Children may be housed free of charge, provided they bring sleeping bags and sleep on the floor.

Regardless of how many nights you will be staying, the fee remains the same. However, if you are planning on coming to the lectureship for only a day or two, we strongly suggest that you provide for your own sleeping accommodations by staying with a friend in the Los Angeles/Malibu area, or by making a motel reservation by calling one of the motels listed on the back page of the insert. Due to the limited number of beds on our campus, we must give preference to those who are staying the entire week (Tuesday through Friday nights).

**Please bring your own bedding.** Linens are available (\$10.00 per set) only to those who are either arriving by plane or are from out of state and make arrangements in advance. Dorms are open from 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 22 through 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 26. Please do not plan to check into your dorm room before 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday the 22nd. We will not have available staff to assist you until noon. When you arrive on campus, please go directly to your pre-assigned dorm where you will obtain a packet of materials and your dorm room key. Housing check-in will begin promptly at 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 22, and end at 6:00 p.m. If you arrive after 6:00 p.m., please go to Firestone Fieldhouse for the evening lecture. Following the evening lecture, your housing materials will be available in the lobby of Heritage Hall.

**Dorm room reservations must be received by March 1.** Rooms will be preassigned and no changes will be made. Be sure to indicate special housing requests, such as rooming close to a friend or with a particular church group, on your Housing Form. A confirmation postcard will be mailed to you upon receipt of your reservation form and dorm fee. **We must advise you that, should you decide to cancel your reservation, dorm fees are nonrefundable.** For those Lectureship guests who are staying in the dorms,



check-out time will be no later than 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, April 26. Please return your key to the dorm lobby. There is a \$10.00 charge for all unreturned keys. Linens must be collected and placed in your dorm lobby.

### RECREATIONAL VEHICLE PARKING

Recreational vehicles must be parked in the main dormitory parking lot. There is a one-time \$5.00 fee for parking an RV on campus during Lecture Week. There are no hookups available. Please remember to get your temporary parking pass at the guard gate.

### MEALS

**Cafeteria:** The Pepperdine cafeteria will be open during the lectureship. In order to keep the lines moving, please purchase your meal tickets in advance at Lectureship Central or before and after the lectures in Firestone Fieldhouse. The cafeteria schedule and prices are listed below:

A seven-meal ticket costs \$16.00 (a savings of \$4.25).

This ticket entitles the purchaser to all seven meals served in the cafeteria during the lectureship, except for the banquet meals. The seven meals include 4 breakfasts (Wednesday-Saturday) and 3 lunches (Wednesday-Friday).

To attend breakfast or lunch programs, simply get your tray, select your food and proceed to the room designated for the particular program you want to attend.

Children 12 years of age and under will be charged half price on both the multi-meal and individual meal tickets.

**Galley:** The Galley Cafe will also be serving food and drinks in the Exhibit Hall every day.

### CHILD CARE INFORMATION

1. Children must eat all meals with their parents, except for the Tuesday and Thursday dinners when a picnic of hamburgers and hot dogs is planned for all children for a \$2.00 fee. Parents of infants are to bring necessary bottles and baby food jars so our staff can feed their children.
2. Register your children at the Child Care registration desk at Appleby Center. You must sign your children in and out each time you use our Child Care Program.
3. Play clothes should be worn at all times, since we are planning many outdoor activities.
4. Wholesome snacks will be provided. Please do not send sugar snacks, candy or gum with your children. Be sure to notify the registration person of any food allergies.
5. Label all items to be left in Child Care including toys, blankets, and extra clothes. Take special care in labeling baby items (baby food jars, bottles, etc.)
6. A nap area will be available. You may note on your registration form the preferred nap time.

### EXHIBIT HALL

## PARKING INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

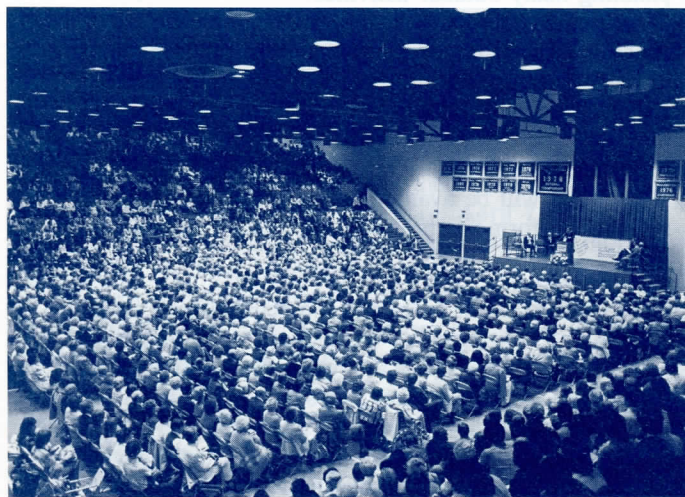

No parking is allowed in the fire lanes next to the dormitories (this is an official regulation). Reasonable stops for loading and unloading, however, are allowed.

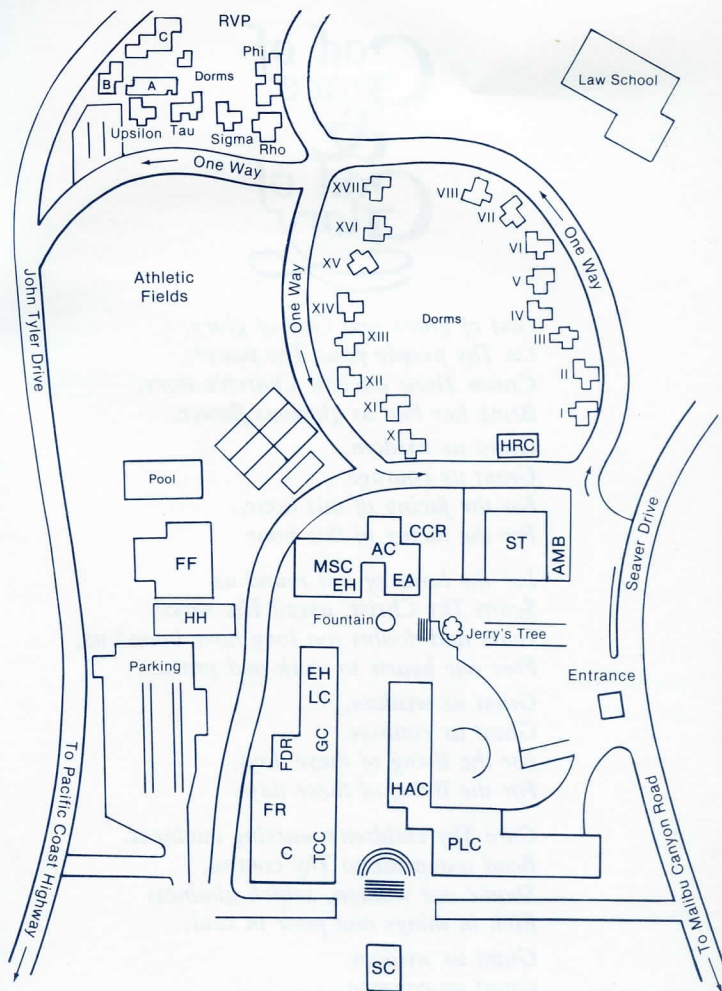
## TAPES
