

'CHRIST, OUR CONTEMPORARY' KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Batsell Barrett Baxter comes to the climax program of the Lectureship with many years of experience as a gospel preacher, educator, radio and television evangelist and author of articles and books.

He was born in Cordell, Okla. on Sept. 23, 1916, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Batsell Baxter. His father was the first president of Pep-

perdine College.

Mr. Baxter, who began preaching in 1933 at Nashville, Tenn., received his education at David Lipscomb and Abilene Christian Colleges, the University of Southern California and Vanderbilt University.

1956, he formerly was chairman of the Speech Department there and at Pepperdine, and prior to that he served as minister of churches in Whittier and Burbank, Calif. and in Nashville.

He has written extensively for the Gospel Advocate and Twentieth Century Christian magazines and is author of several books, including Heart of the Yale Lectures, Speaking for the Master, If I Be Lifted

Up and Preachers of Today.



FRANK PACK

Frank Pack, a member of the Bible Department faculty at Abilene Christian College, has accepted an invitation to be the keynote speaker at next year's Sports Arena program, March 20, 1964.

We feel very fortunate in having this great gospel preacher for next year's Lectureship program, and are happy to be able to announce his coming at this time.

Mr. Pack, who is familiar as a featured speaker in college lectureships over the years, is no stranger to the Pepperdine College campus, having served as a member of the Bible faculty during 1945-49. With his work at Pepperdine and ACC, plus teaching at David Lipscomb, 1940-44, he has been in Christian education nearly a quarter of a century.

Born in Memphis, Tenn., March 27, 1916, Mr. Pack started preaching in 1933 at the Reid Avenue church of Christ in Nashville, Tenn. He received his education at David Lipscomb College, the University of Chattanooga, Vanderbilt University and the University of Southern California. He has served churches in Tennessee, California and Texas

Mr. Pack is a regular contributor to such church magazines as Gospel Advocate, Twentieth Century Christian and Restoration Quarterly and is author of the book, Our Bible.
