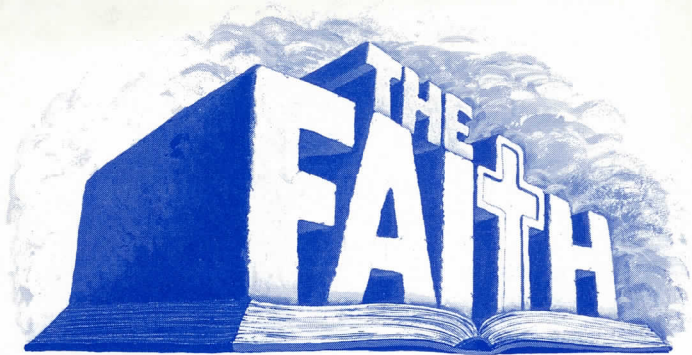

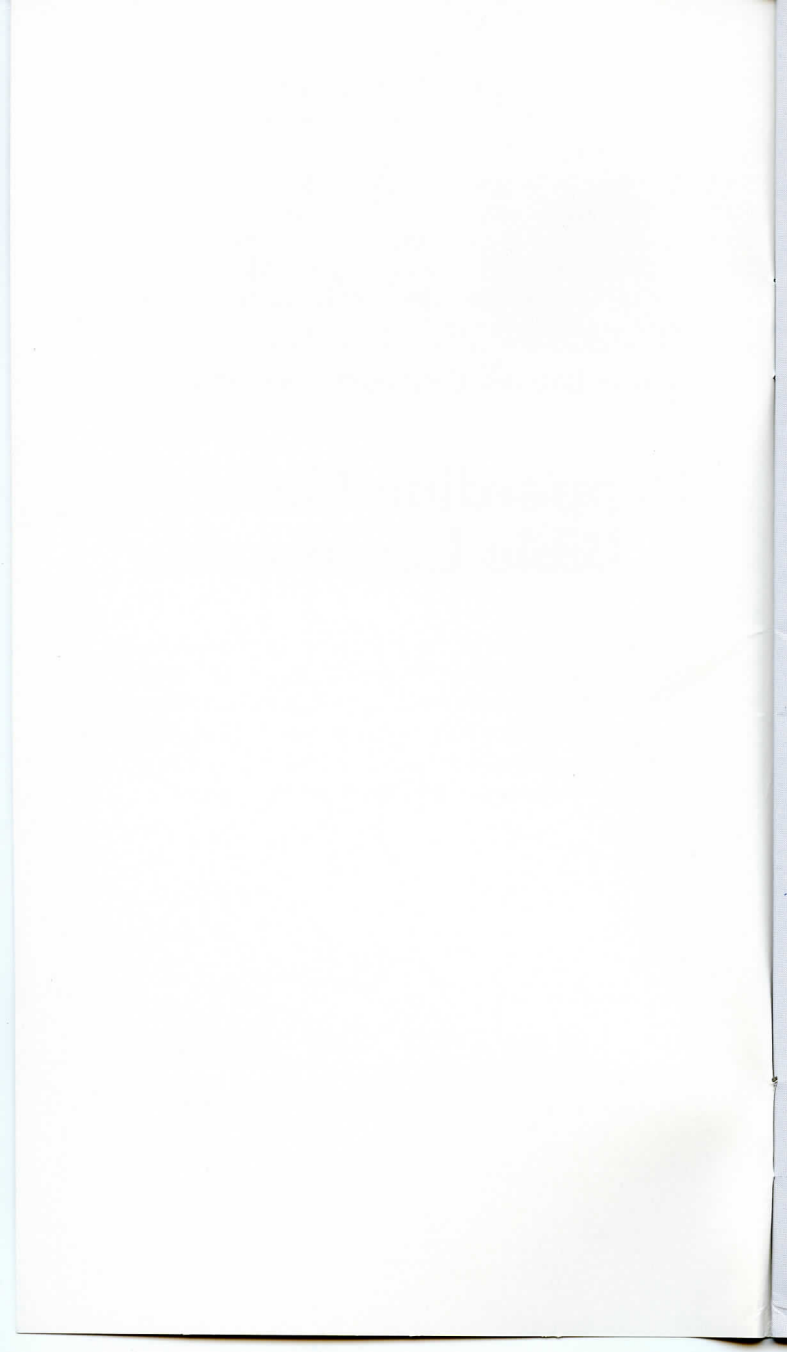

EXHIBIT TENT

...This huge, attractive tent is set up on the main parking lot of the University. In the tent, congregations and representatives have set up displays. This is an excellent way to find out what other congregations are doing and see new teaching materials. Be sure to visit this central hub of the Lectureship. CHILD CARE

...will be provided in Dorm 1 and in Firestone Field House, rooms 122-123-124. A planned program of supervised activities similar to a Vacation Bible School is scheduled, and light refreshments will be served. A cost of \$1.00 per day will help defray expenses (payable at the Child Care facility). The following suggestions are made in order that the children may have the best care:

- (1) A child must be signed both in and out by a **parent**.
- (2) Bring an ample supply of the child's needs (bottles, diapers, training pants etc.) with his/her name taped to the bottle, diaper bag, and other belongings.
- (3) Pick up your child **promptly**

(4) If possible, bring a few of your child's favorite toys with name taped to them.

(5) The Session Schedule is as follows:

Second Session: 1:45 a.m. - 5:45 p.m.

Third Session: 7:00 p.m. - 9:30 p.m.

THE W. W. PACE AWARD

...Brother Pace was a pioneer preacher in California, arriving from Texas in 1918. In 1965, Pepperdine University awarded him the Christian Service Award. At the time of his death, brother Pace was completing his 50th year of full-time ministry. It is in honor of this ministry that in 1973 Pepperdine established the W. W. Pace Ministerial Award.

A number of fine young people have been assisted financially from the Pace Award. One of the best ways we have of attracting high quality Christian students is to be able to assist them financially. For this reason, contributions to the Pace Award are excellent investments in the future of the Church.

TRANSPORTATION ON CAMPUS
