Phase I of the International Student and Scholar Management (ISSM) software implementation is nearing completion. All enrolled and newly admitted degree-seeking international students at SCU's main campus are up and running in the new system, and the International Students and Scholars Program has utilized the tool to improve efficiency in advising, immigration document processing, and strategic student communication. The final step of Phase I will be the inclusion of international alumni who continue to be sponsored by SCU and are working in the U.S. to gain practical experience in their field.

The Global Engagement Office continues to work with key campus partners to lay the ground work for Phase II of ISSM which will incorporate the immigration record management of degree seeking JST students, as well as exchange students and visiting scholars at both JST and the main Santa Clara campus.

## Family Weekend Study Abroad Update

On February 27th, the Global Engagement Office hosted two panels for Study Abroad families as a part of Family Weekend, a Center for Student Leadership program. The presentations included information regarding how parents and families can help their student throughout the Study Abroad Process.
