A NEW SUBSPECIES OF TYPOCERUS BRUNNICORNIS LE CONTE


The following form differs enough from the type of *Typocerus brunnicornis* Lec. to warrant a name.

Typocerus brunnicornis inflatus n. subsp.

This subspecies differs by having pronotum more inflated in front of middle, surface more sparsely and lightly punctured.

Length 10 mm; width 3.2 mm.

Male holotype labeled Southern Pines, N. C., May 20, 1916, A. H. Manee, collector in H. W. Wenzel Collection, Ohio State University.
