## I. THE HISTORY OF LINGUISTICS

Bill Sturtevant calls to our attention a review in the June issue of Language 53:383-405 by W.K. Percival of a book by E.F.K. Koerner on Saussure-- which (the review) contains interesting information on the history of linguistics. In this context, we would note also the journal edited by Dr. Koerner, <u>Historiographia Linguistica</u>, which first appeared in 1974, and has contained various materials relevant to the history of anthropology, as well as its companion series, <u>Studies in the History of Linguistics</u>. A recent history of sociolinguistics by Francisco Sánchez-Marco, <u>Acercamiento histórico a la sociolinguistica</u>, (Mexico, 1976), contains a considerable body of material on Boas, Sapir, and Kroeber.

## II. OXBRIDGE ANTHROPOLOGY

A recent number of <u>Cambridge Anthropology</u>, <u>a Journal of the</u> <u>Department of Social Anthropology</u>, <u>Cambridge University</u> (III, no. 3) contains several items of historical interest: "Cambridge and the Torres Straits, 1888-1920," by Peter Gathercole, and "An Unpublished Paper by A.R. Radcliffe-Brown on 'The Study of Social Institutions', with a letter in reply by W.H.R. Rivers," edited by Meyer Fortes. Interested readers may wish to consult other numbers of the Cambridge journal, as well as the <u>Journal of the Anthropological Society of Oxford</u>, which also frequently carries historical pieces. In subsequent numbers of <u>HAN</u> we will attempt to cull comprehensive listings.
