# Preface

This, our first postwar Road School, really got back to normal, functioning in a surprisingly satisfactory manner. The total registration of 1,047, in view of the shortage in rooming accommodations, brings us back approximately to normal prewar attendance.

The usual peacetime Road School coverage of four days was resumed this year. Approximately half the time was devoted to general sessions and half to separate session programs for the various cooperating groups.

Under the leadership of Luther Tex, Indianapolis Street Commissioner, the Indiana Street Commissioners' Association was organized, and this group will participate as a cooperating organization in future Road Schools.

The Road Show (sponsored by the Highway Materials and Equipment Association) was revived this year after having been discontinued during the war years. It attracted some 55 exhibitors of road equipment and materials in the Purdue Armory. This was the best Road Show we have ever held. Apparently it was the first of its kind since the close of the war. This supplementary function of the Road School is of very considerable interest and value to the roadmen of Indiana.

The Highway Materials and Equipment Association provided a complimentary chicken dinner in the armory on Tuesday night which was enjoyed by 600 roadmen. They also sponsored an outstanding complimentary program in the Hall of Music, on Wednesday night, at which Al Stewart and his Purdue Musical Organizations put on a very

After the Road School, a check for \$100 was received from the Highway Materials and Equipment Association as an additional contribution to their long-established Student Loan Fund. This fund has now built up to a total of over \$1800. It has been the means of putting several worthy students "over the hump". The loans are paid back with interest; therefore, a continuous and growing fund is provided for a most worthy cause. This association is to be congratulated on its generosity.
