A native of Bowling Green, Sue Lynn McDaniel completed a master's degree in history at Western Kentucky University, focusing her research on nineteenth-century social and cultural history. Her thesis topic, "Expressions of Grief in South Central Kentucky, 1870-1910," allowed her to delve into resources and a region largely neglected by previous historians. 
