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

Brian Hill

Brian is an accomplished theatre performer and director, with his work appearing on stage at the Stratford Festival, the Shaw Festival, the Charlottetown Festival and on various national tours. He has worked as the coordinator and head instructor of the Charlottetown Festival Young Company on Prince Edward Island. Brian's most recent production was as assistant director for the US national tour of *The Sound Of Music.*

When How To Succeed in Business Without Really Trying opened on Broadway on October 14, 1961, the Times declared: "Big business is not likely to be the same again." Thirtyeight years later, one glance at a Dilbert comic strip tells us that things have not changed as much as the Times would have thought. Based on the tongue-incheek manual of the same name by Sheperd Mead, How To... garnered seven Tony Awards (including Best Musical) and a Pulitzer Prize, and was considered a biting and uproarious satire of the corporate world with its nepotism, yes-men and old school ties. It remains so even by today's standards. Though the innocent confidence of Leave it To Beaver has been replaced by the self-centred neuroses of Ally McBeal and JFK's Camelot may seem naive in the wake of Monica Lewinsky's antics, the business world still retains its characteristically brash and caffeinated drive. It's no wonder that the 1967 film version and the 1995 revival of the show proved to be immensely popular. How To... is the story of two kinds of people: those who follow the rules and those who don't. We all have a little of both in each of us. Oh, and let's not forget, underneath all of this... it's also a pretty wacky musical comedy.


