

LETTER from the DIRECTOR



Jesus is risen! Death has been conquered! No longer do the ways of sin and death reign in our world! We have the opportunity to belong to the new age of the resurrection! Our lives will never be the same! These declarations stand at the heart of our theme for the 87th Annual Bible Lectureship. This year's

theme, "Since You Have Been Raised With Christ," calls us to consider our lives in light of the resurrection. We believe that through our baptism we already participate in the resurrected life of Jesus. Resurrection not only guarantees a life beyond our physical deaths, it also guarantees power for life here and now. Jesus did not escape death to retreat into the safety of heaven. Rather, the Risen One lives with us and in us. The reality of the continuing presence of Jesus with His church calls us to live in distinctive ways. This year, we want to focus on the kind of life empowered by the resurrection.

We cannot talk about resurrection without acknowledging the variety of ways we experience God in our daily lives. Perhaps no topic requires more serious attention than religious experience. To some, God is experienced in every traffic light or restaurant menu choice. To others, God is only a distant actor, residing almost exclusively in the pages of Scripture. The vitality of our churches surely depends on God's movement among us. Discerning that movement is one of the church's most urgent tasks.

Our theme book is Colossians. Paul's confession of Jesus as "the first-born from the dead" stands behind every verse (1:18). The descriptions of the resurrected life in Colossians are rich and provide compelling pictures of the Christian life. It is our prayer, that by opening Colossians together we will experience the presence of the Risen One in powerful ways.

ACU BIBLE LECTURESHIP

PURPOSE

Abilene Christian University serves Churches of Christ through its Lectureship by bringing interested men and women together for instruction in the Bible, encouragement for missional engagement with the world, dialogue for the sake of unity, participation in worship, formation for discipleship, and exhortation to continue the work of restoration.

COMMITMENTS

Because of our high regard for the authority of Scripture, Lectureship will always feature sermons, lectures and other opportunities for in-depth Bible exploration.

- Each Lectureship features a book of the Bible to provide theme and focus. The lectures are Scripture assignments, not topics.
- Classes focus on the explanation of Scripture and are often taught by the best Bible scholars among Churches of Christ.
- Worship at ACU's Lectureship is characterized by extensive reading of Scripture.

In relation to our commitment to participating in the Great Commission, Lectureship will feature sermons, lectures and other opportunities to better understand the task of mission in the contemporary setting.

- A full slate of classes will help us understand the challenges of our context in missions, both foreign and domestic.
- Particular attention will be given to cultural analysis of North America so that we can minister effectively in a rapidly changing setting.
- Special focus will be given each year to the task of church planting so that the ACU Lectureship will be known as a resource for those interested or involved in church planting.
- We will honor exemplary missionaries each evening during the theme lecture gathering.
- Special focus will be given each year to vocation and ministry so that church members will be better equipped to view their homes and workplaces as opportunities for participating in the mission of God.

Unitor

In relation to our commitment to the restoration plea for unity among those professing Christ, Lectureship will always feature sermons, lectures and other forums devoted to breaking down human barriers that divide the people of God, be they racial, doctrinal or spiritual. This work, by its very nature, requires both risk and discernment. Christ's prayer for the unity of believers demands that we be open to both.

- Regular forums will bring groups together in dialogue to promote better understanding, illumine points of agreement, and delineate points of disagreement subject to further dialogue.
- Recognizing that those things that cannot be talked about are those things that enslave us, the lectureship will foster a climate of respectful dialogue. Participants will be selected in part in relation to their respect and loving treatment of those with whom they disagree.
- Because ACU cannot speak for the church, the Lectureship must represent in some way the vast spectrum of teaching found within our churches. This will mean that nearly everyone will find classes or teachers on the program with which they disagree. In light of this, Lectureship hopes to promote unity by keeping us talking to each other rather than about each other.

Formation

In relation to our commitment to forming persons into the image of Christ, Lectureship will always feature sermons, lectures and other forums devoted to the spiritual formation of disciples.

- A variety of worship opportunities will be provided to draw participants deep into the practices of worship: praise, contemplation, prayer, attention to Scripture, lament, etc.
- Because faith and imagination are partners in the work of spiritual formation, Lectureship will encourage artists to assist our spiritual pursuits through drama, music, visual arts and literature.



In light of our affiliation with Churches of Christ, Lectureship will always feature sermons, lectures and other forums that focus on the restoration ideal.

- Each year we will host specific lectures on restoration history so that we might gain an ever-increasing informed appreciation for those upon whose work we build.
- In all classes and forums we will encourage respectful and critical engagement with the restoration plea as it has been understood historically. We will seek to be neither "bashers" nor "rose-colored glasses" apologists. By being both loving and critical, we will insist that the work of restoration be ongoing.

In expressing these commitments, we hope to introduce standards of evaluation that move beyond divisive labels such as "liberal" or "conservative." Our goal is not to serve change or the status quo. Our goal is to contribute to the health and growth of our churches through constructive engagement and dialogue. We invite all participants to join us in upholding these commitments.
