

Swords Into Plowshares

At the heart of the book, Micah 4 offers a stunning vision of God's ultimate purposes for creation. As a part of that vision, Micah proclaims that "swords will be beaten into plowshares, and spears into pruning hooks." This vision of peace will be explored by three of ACU's academic departments: art, theatre and music. These special programs will help us imagine a world where swords are beaten into plowshares.

The Word in Motion

A theatrical exploration of Micah 4 presented by faculty and students in the ACU theatre department. Connect to God in a new way by witnessing His Word through story telling and imagination in this dramatic presentation.

Art and Design Department

The justice language of the prophets rarely shows up in our church hymnals. Yet these powerful poetic images continue to live on. One place they have found continuing expression is in folk music. The ACU music department will host an evening of music and discussion featuring the prophetic spirit found in the tradition of American protest music.
