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HCL

1. Hennepin County has 1.2 million residents, 45 cities and 22 independent school districts
2. HC is 611 miles and includes dense urban, suburban and rural communities
3. We have 41 locations and 64% of residents have an active library card.
4. HCL has an advisory Library Board (11 members) appointed by the seven member elected County Board.
5. HCL is a department within HC

Hopkins Public Schools

Hopkins Public Schools serves the community by welcoming all learners, honoring culture, and inspiring remarkable growth and achievement.

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1. HPS is to the west of Minneapolis in the center of Hennepin County
2. Most of our schools are in the city of Minnetonka, we serve 7 cities in the western suburbs.
3. HPS serves 7,369 students in grades K-12. 41% SOC, 38% FRL, 11% ELL, 46 different home languages spoken
4. 6 elementary (K-6), 2 Junior High (7-9), one High School (10-12).
5. Each HPS school has a full time media specialist. Hopkins has always had a strong Library-Media Program.

Getting Started

The ConnectED Library Challenge calls upon library directors to work with their elected officials, school leaders, and school librarians to create or strengthen partnerships.

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Saying yes all along. The partnership has been a priority at the highest levels of both organizations. The School Board, the Library Board, and the County Board have been supportive from the beginning.

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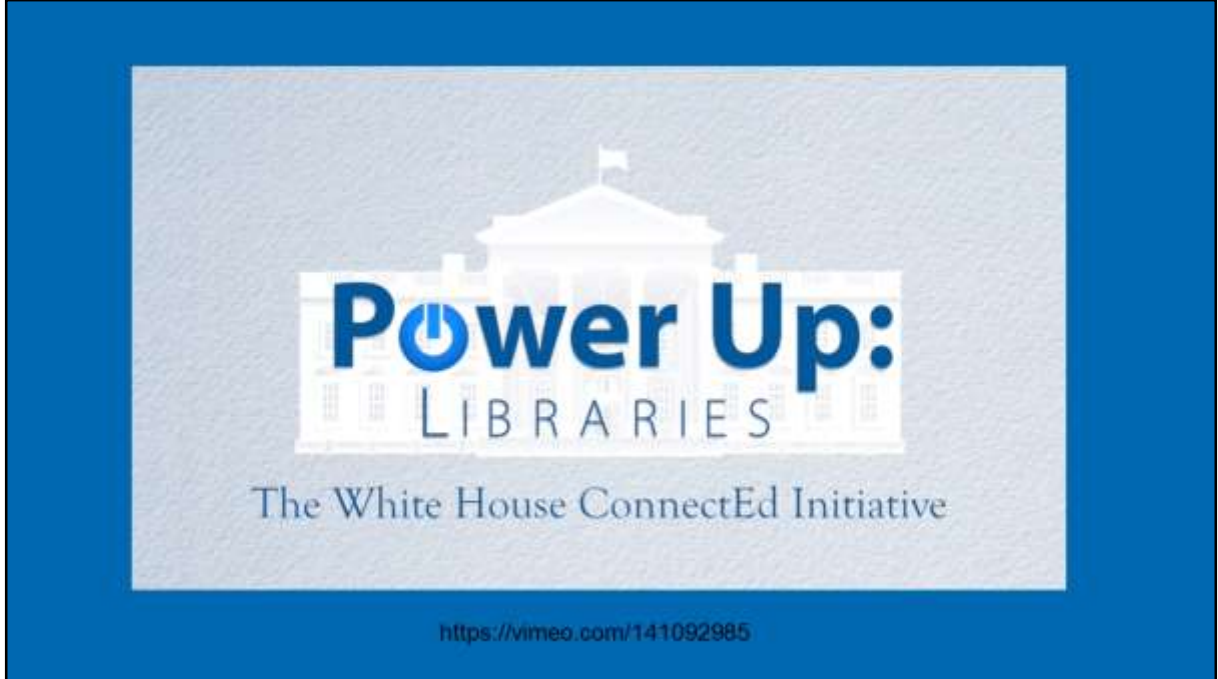
Day 1 was about years four and five.

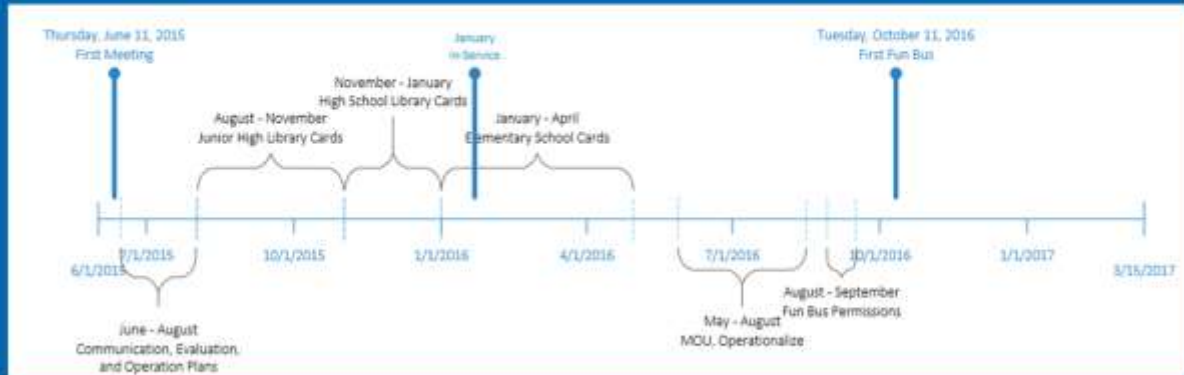
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Year one was to issue library cards to all students and operationalize the provision of those accounts.

Challenge: Rethinking tradition



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Library cards is what we do – how do we organize ourselves differently?

Challenge: 100%

Every student enrolled in the district
has a library card that they can access each day

Every teacher is aware of HCL resources
and how they can use them in the classroom

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Reaching 100% of the students is critical.

Challenge: Rolling out the cards



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The first 85% of students are easy to distribute to, the second 15% require more follow up.

Lessons Learned

Involve elected, executive, and senior leadership early and often

Be prepared to be flexible

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Executive leadership commitment makes a difference, as does administrative

- Take a moment to imagine what it means when all college freshmen are comfortable and familiar with public library systems, because it was integrated into their k-12 lives.

Be prepared to be flexible

- Rethink the rules, the traditions, the roadblocks
- Distribution is likely to look different for each grade band
