**2002 Policy:** AACCP supports interdisciplinary and interprofessional education for health professions education.

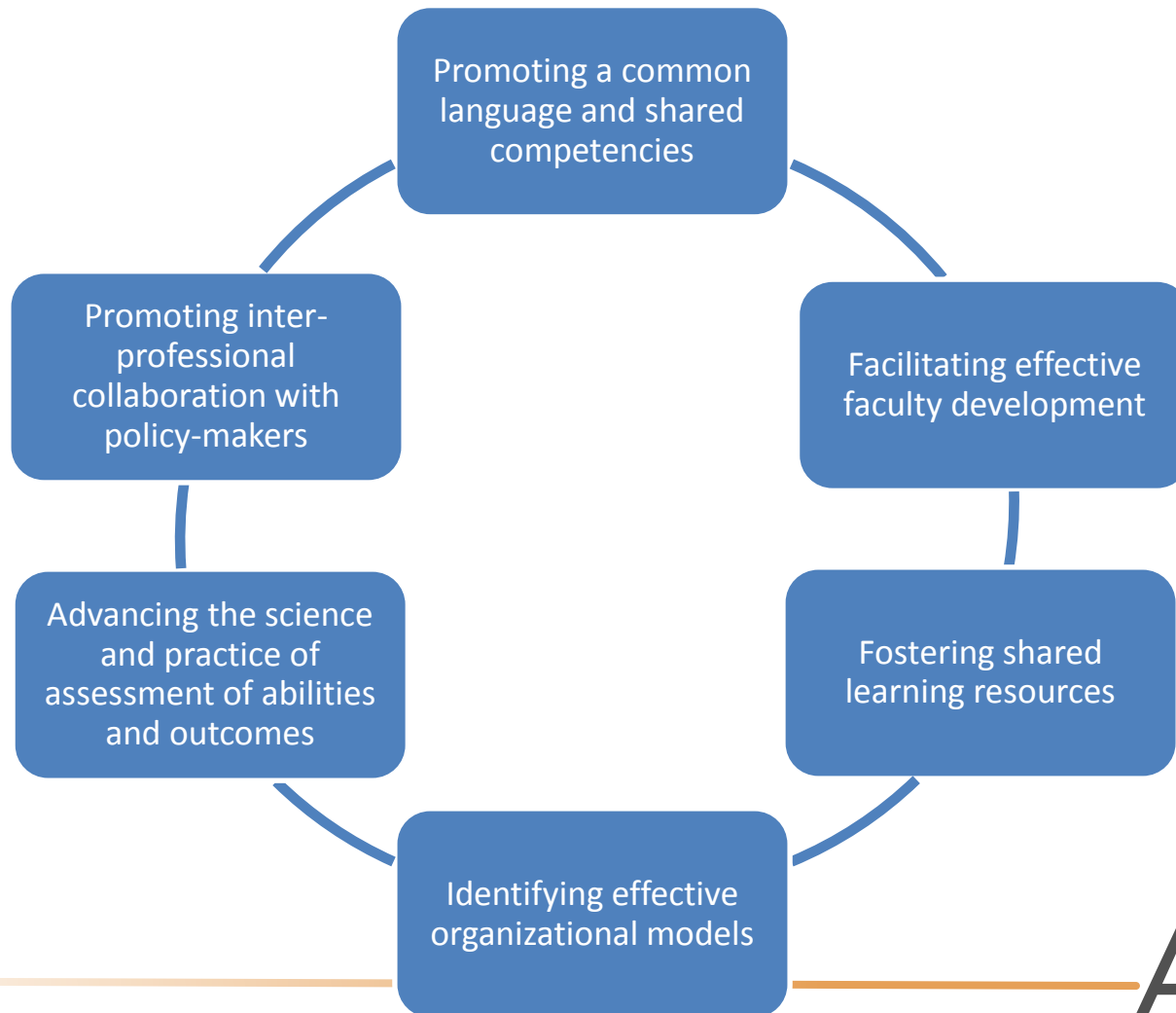



- Stimulate evaluation and research
- Spur dialogue about fit for practice
- Inform regulatory bodies

# IPEC Faculty Development Institutes 2012-2016

- Each institute is a 2½ day faculty development program
- Universities send a team of 3 to 5 participants from at least 3 different disciplines (sometimes from more than one institution)
- Meeting includes plenary sessions, workshops and substantial time for team planning
- Team returns home with a plan of action for IPE
- IPE Fundamentals, Quality and Safety, Public and Population Health
