This report serves to establish baseline data of the socioeconomic profile of the diverse Hispanic Communities in Lee and Collier County and to generate further inquiry.

This project was conducted in 2008-2009 by Dr. Aysegul Timur, and funded by Hodges University. Using the data from the 1990 and 2000 Census and the 2005-2007 American Community survey, a comprehensive and comparative overview is provided on a variety of statistical indicators including population growth, national origin, age, gender, language, household composition, poverty, employment and education.

This information should prove useful to a range of individuals and organizations concerned with issues that impact the Hispanic community: policy-makers, advocates, community-based organizations, businesses, and the media. The report illustrates that the Southwest Florida's Hispanic population is much younger than the overall general population, educational achievement gaps are wide in comparison to non-Hispanics and while the economic situation for Hispanics appears to be improving, it still lags behind the population as a whole.

We are confident that this report will provide a better understanding of the Hispanic population in this region and will serve as a foundation from which future scholars may build.

Summary

Purpose

The main goal of the Hispanic Institute's first research project is to establish a base line of information about the Hispanic community in Lee and Collier counties. This report is aimed at providing an up-to-date socioeconomic profile of the diverse Hispanic Community in Lee and Collier counties and generating a comprehensive comparative historical overview of a variety of data on population, national origin, age, gender, education, employment, income and household composition.

To this end, this report seeks to present useful information to a range of individuals and organizations concerned with issues that impact the Hispanic community: policy-makers, Hispanic leaders, advocates, community organizations, businesses, and the media.

Data and Methodology

This report is based on statistical data retrieved and compiled from the United States Census Bureau, which provides the best combination of timeliness, relevancy, quality, and cost for the data. The data is customized and calculated for the United States, the State of Florida, Collier and Lee Counties.

For the purposes of this report, Hispanics or Latinos are used interchangeably and are defined as those people who classified themselves in one of the specific Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino categories listed on the Census 2000 questionnaire - "Mexican, Mexican Am., Chicano," "Puerto Rican," or "Cuban"- as well as those who indicate that they are "other Spanish/Hispanic/Latino." Persons who indicated that they are "other Spanish/Hispanic/Latino" include those whose origins are from Spain, the Spanish-speaking countries of Central or South America, the Dominican Republic or people identifying themselves generally as Spanish, Spanish-American, Hispanic, Hispano, Latino, and so on. Origin can be viewed as the heritage, nationality group, lineage, or country of birth of the person or the person's parents or ancestors before their arrival in the United States. People who identify their origin as Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino may be of any race (*Source: U.S. Bureau of the Census, County Population Estimates by Demographic Characteristics - Age, Sex, Race, and Hispanic Origin; updated annually for states and counties. <http://www.census.gov/popest/counties/asrh/>. 2000 Census of Population and Housing for places; updated every 10 years. <http://factfinder.census.gov>).*

Summary

Data Tables are retrieved from:

1. Decennial Census: The decennial census is taken every 10 years and is a collection of data about households, income, education, home ownership and more. This data is used for appointment of the seats in the House of Representatives.
2. American Fact Finder – Fact Sheet: The Fact Sheet is a collection of data from the latest decennial census and provides Demographic Profile Highlights for a selected geography or ethnicity. The American Fact Finder is accessible over the Census Bureau web site
3. The American Community Survey (the “ACS”): It is a nationwide survey designed to give communities a fresh look at how they are changing. Over the past years, the ACS has been released in the form of one-year estimates. The data is based on data collected in a single calendar year and describe the average characteristics for that specific year. December 2008 the Census Bureau published for the first time the ACS multiyear estimates; specifically three years (2005-2007). This data set is based on data collection over three years and describes the average characteristics for that period. The ACS is also available using the American Fact Finder, which is accessible over the Census Bureau web site.
4. Population Projections Program: Some Tables utilize data from the Population Projections Program. This program provides projections on population in all 50 states and the District of Columbia through the year 2100.
5. CensusScope: This site was developed by the Social Science Data Analysis Network (SSDAN), which is a university-based organization that maintains demographic media. In this report, data from CensusScope has been used in Chapter 1.1 and includes historic census data.

Organization of the Data by Sections and Their Definition

I. Population Growth and National Origin

This section utilizes data from the CensusScope, Census 1990 and 2000, and the American Community Survey (2005-2007) to illustrate the growth in the Hispanic or Latino population, as well as changes in the origins of Hispanic or Latino population. Estimates of change in population by race and ethnicity, foreign born statistics, and the U.S. Population are also provided in this section.

II. Demographic Profile Highlights of Hispanic or Latino

This section contains data from the Census 2000 in the form of the fact sheets filtered for the Hispanic population in the U.S., Florida, Collier and Lee counties.

III. Demographic Profile Highlights by Hispanic or Latino Origin

This section is aimed at providing detailed information by Hispanic or Latino origin on the demographic profile highlights for the U.S., Florida, Collier and Lee counties. The data was retrieved from the Census 2000 database by accessing the American Fact Finder Fact Sheet.

A Fact Sheet might not have been available for all selected areas and Hispanic or Latino origins. This is so because of data filtering rules aimed to protect the confidentiality of Census respondents. As a result, the U.S. Census Bureau will not publish demographic data if the geographical area has a population less than 100; the selected, ethnic or ancestry group has a population of less than 100 within the selected geographic area; or less than 50 un-weighted sample cases were available for the specific geographic area or ancestry group.

The demographic data on the local Hispanic or Latino population have been analyzed by origin: Mexican, Puerto Rican, Cuban, Other Hispanic or Latino. The Other Hispanic or Latino is then further divided into Dominican, Central America, South America, and Spaniards and all other Hispanic or Latino. Central America and South America are also divided by the country of origin. The following diagram lists the groups of “Hispanic or Latino Origins” utilized.

IV. Age and Gender

The data in this section were retrieved from the 2007 American Community Survey for the U.S., Florida, Collier County and Lee County.

V. Households and Families

This section presents data retrieved from the 2007 American Community Survey for household composition and average household and family size for the U.S., Florida, Collier County and Lee County.

VI. Economic Well Being

This section presents data from the 2007 American Community Survey for labor force participation sorted by gender, occupation type, median household income and poverty statistics.

VII. Education and English Language

This last section utilizes data from the 2007 American Community Survey related level of education, ability to speak English or Spanish for the US, Florida and Lee County, and ability to speak English for Spanish speaking Hispanics or Latinos in the United States and Florida.

Excerpt for the United States

I. Population Growth and National Origin

- In the 1980's, the Hispanic population in the United States was 7%, followed by 9% in the 1990's. According to the Census, the Hispanic Community accounted for 13% in year 2000 [*Census2000 analyzed by the Social Science Data Analysis Network (SSDAN)*, [http://www.censuscope.org/us/chart_race.html](http://www.censusscope.org/us/chart_race.html)]. In 2005, Hispanics or Latinos represented 15% of the total United States Population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*]. In 2007, this percentage remained the same [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2007 - Table B03002*].
- The Hispanic population increased significantly from the year 1990 to 2000 by 61%; however, that figure changed to 19% from the year 2000 to 2005 [*Census 1990 - P011, Census 2000 –QT-P9, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*] and to 9% between 2005 and 2007 [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 and 2007-Table B03002*]. Hispanic foreign born population was 40% in 2000, and remained the same in 2007 [*U.S. Census 2000, Summary File 4, Table PCT45, American Community Survey 2007, Table B06003&B06004*].
- Based on 2005-2007 estimates, by the national origin, Hispanics represented 64% Mexican, 9% Puerto Rican, 3% Cuban, 24% other Hispanic or Latino, which is distributed by 3% Dominican, 8% Central American, 5% South American and 8% All other Hispanic or Latino populations, of the total Hispanic Community [*American Community Survey 2005-2007 – B03001*].
- According to the United States Hispanic or Latino National Origin estimates between 2005-2007, Mexican population represented 10%, Puerto Rican 1%, Cuban 0.5%, Dominican 0.5%, Central American 1%, South American 1% and Other Hispanic or Latino 1% of the total United States population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005-2007, Table B03001*].

II. Demographic Profile Highlights of Hispanic or Latino

- According to the 2000 Census [*U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000 Summary File (SF 2) and Summary File 4 (SF4)*]:
 - Males were 51% and females were 49% of the Hispanic population in the United States.
 - Median Age was 26 in the Hispanic Community, compared to 35 in the total population of the United States.
 - 65% of the Hispanic population was 18 years and over; only 5% represented 65 years and over, and 11% was under 5 years.
 - Average Hispanic or Latino household and family size was 4. Owner-occupied housing units were 6%, whereas renter-occupied housing units were 14% of the total occupied units in the United States.

Excerpt for the United States

- Of the total population 25 years and over in the United States, 10% accounted for Hispanics or Latinos.
- In the population of 25 years and over, 52% were high school graduates or higher and only 10% received a bachelor's degree or higher in the Hispanic Community.
- 11% of the total United States labor force (16 years and over) represented by Hispanic or Latino labor force.
- Hispanic median household income in 1999 (dollars) was \$33,676, compared to \$41,994 in the total population, whereas Hispanic per capita income in 1999 (dollars) was \$12,111, compared to \$21,587. Of the total population of families and individuals below poverty level, Hispanics represented 23%.

III. Demographic Profile Highlights by Hispanic or Latino Origin

IV. Age and Gender

- The medium age in years by sex is almost the same in the Hispanic Community: Male is 27, female is 28 [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B01002*].
- The age distribution in the Hispanic population has more concentration between 35 to 44, then under 5 years and then 45 to 54 years in the United States [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B11001, B11001*].

V. Households and Families

- Total Hispanic or Latino households accounted for 11% of the total households in the United States.
- Total number of families was 9%; family with male householder - no wife present 21%, and family with female householder, no husband present 16% of all the families that were Hispanic or Latino [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B11001*].

VI. Economic Well Being

- 63% of the total Hispanic Population was employed, 5% was unemployed and 32% was not in labor force. By gender, male unemployment was much higher than female unemployment [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B23001*].
- Median household income for the Hispanic Community grew by 21% from 2000 to 2007 and increased to \$40,766, compared to \$50,740 in the United States [*U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000, Summary file 4 (SF4) – Sample Data, Table PCT89; American Community Survey 2005-Table B19013 ; American Community Survey 2007-Table B19013*].
- In 2007, Hispanic people living in poverty decreased to 21% in 2007, compared to overall 13% in the United States [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B17001*].

VII. Education and English Language

- Hispanics represented 24% of less than 9th grade, 16% of 9th to 12th grade, no diploma, 28% of high school graduate(includes equivalency), 15% of some college, no degree, 5% of associate degree, 9% of bachelor's degree and 4% of graduate degree of the total Hispanics [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B15002*].

Excerpt for the State of Florida

I. Population Growth and National Origin

- In the 1980's, the Hispanic population in the State of Florida was 9%, followed by 12% in the 1990's. According to the Census, the Hispanic Community accounted for 17% in year 2000 [*Census2000 analyzed by the Social Science Data Analysis Network (SSDAN)*, [http://www.censuscope.org/us/s12/chart_race.html](http://www.censusscope.org/us/s12/chart_race.html)]. In 2005, Hispanics or Latinos represented 20% of the total State of Florida Population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*]. In 2007, this percentage changed to 21% [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2007 - Table B03002*].
- The Hispanic population increased significantly from the year 1990 to 2000 by 73%; however, that figure changed to 28% from the year 2000 to 2005 [*Census 1990 - P011, Census 2000 –QT-P9, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*] and to 10% between 2005 and 2007 [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 and 2007-Table B03002*]. Hispanic foreign born population was 55% in 2000, and decreased to 52% in 2007 [*U.S. Census 2000, Summary File 4, Table PCT45, American Community Survey 2007, Table B06003&B06004*].
- Based on 2005-2007 estimates, by the national origin, Hispanics represented 16% Mexican, 19% Puerto Rican, 29% Cuban, 36% other Hispanic or Latino, which is distributed by 3% Dominican, 11% Central American, 16% South American and 6% All other Hispanic or Latino populations, of the total Hispanic Community [*American Community Survey 2005-2007 – B03001*].
- According to the State of Florida Hispanic or Latino National Origin estimates between 2005-2007, Mexican population represented 3%, Puerto Rican 4%, Cuban 6%, Dominican 1%, Central American 2%, South American 3% and Other Hispanic or Latino 1% of the total State of Florida population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005-2007, Table B03001*].

II. Demographic Profile Highlights of Hispanic or Latino

- According to the 2000 Census [*U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000 Summary File (SF 2) and Summary File 4 (SF4)*]:
 - Males and females were 50% of the Hispanic population in the State of Florida.
 - Median Age was 33 in the Hispanic Community, compared to 39 in the total population of the State of Florida.
 - 74% of the Hispanic population was 18 years and over; only 10% represented 65 years and over, and 7% was under 5 years.
 - Average Hispanic or Latino household and family size was 3. Owner-occupied housing units were 11%, whereas renter-occupied housing units were 20% of the total occupied units in the State of Florida.

Excerpt for the State of Florida

- Of the total population 25 years and over in Collier County, 15% accounted for Hispanics or Latinos.
- In the population of 25 years and over, 63% were high school graduates or higher and only 17% received a bachelor's degree or higher in the Hispanic Community.
- 17% of the total State of Florida labor force (16 years and over) represented by Hispanic or Latino labor force.
- Hispanic median household income in 1999 (dollars) was \$34,333, compared to \$38,819 in the total population, whereas Hispanic per capita income in 1999 (dollars) was \$15,198, compared to \$21,557. Of the total population of families and individuals below poverty level, Hispanics represented 25% and 24% respectively.

III. Demographic Profile Highlights by Hispanic or Latino Origin

 - Puerto Rican – 18% of the total Hispanic population, 3% of the total State of Florida population
 - Cuban – 31% of the total Hispanic population, 5% of the total State of Florida population
 - Other Hispanic or Latino – 37% of the total Hispanic population, 6% of the total State of Florida population
 - Dominican – 3% of the total Hispanic population in the State of Florida.
 - Central America – 8% of the total Hispanic population in the State of Florida.

- The medium age in years by sex is: Male is 32, female is 35, in the Hispanic Community [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B01002*].
- The age distribution in the Hispanic population has more concentration between 35 to 44, then 45 to 54 and then 5 years and under in the State of Florida [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B11001, B11001*].

V. Households and Families

- Total Hispanic or Latino households accounted for 17% of the total households in the State of Florida.
- Total number of families was 19%; family with male householder - no wife present 27%, and family with female householder, no husband present 35% of all the families that were Hispanic or Latino [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B11001*].

VI. Economic Well Being

- 69% of the total Hispanic Population was employed, 6% was unemployed and 25% was not in labor force. By gender, male unemployment was much higher than female unemployment [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B23001*].
- Median household income for the Hispanic Community grew by 23% from 2000 to 2007 and increased to \$42,094, compared to \$47,804 in the State of Florida [*U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000, Summary file 4 (SF4) – Sample Data, Table PCT89; American Community Survey 2005-Table B19013 ; American Community Survey 2007-Table B19013*].
- In 2007, Hispanic people living in poverty decreased to 16% in 2007, compared to overall 12% in the State of Florida [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B17001*].

VII. Education and English Language

- Hispanics represented 16% of less than 9th grade, 11% of 9th to 12th grade, no diploma, 29% of high school graduate(includes equivalency), 15% of some college, no degree, 8% of associate degree, 15% of bachelor's degree and 7% of graduate degree of the total Hispanics [*American Community Survey 2007- Table B15002*].

Excerpt for Collier County

I. Population Growth and National Origin

- In the 1980's, the Hispanic population in Collier County was 11%, followed by 14% in the 1990's. According to the Census, the Hispanic Community accounted for 20% in year 2000 [*Census2000 analyzed by the Social Science Data Analysis Network (SSDAN)*, http://www.censusscope.org/us/s12/c21/chart_race.html]. In 2005, Hispanics or Latinos represented 24% of the total Collier County Population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*]. In 2007, this percentage changed to 26% [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2007 - Table B03002*].
- The Hispanic population increased significantly from the year 1990 to 2000 by 145%; however, that figure changed to 48% from the year 2000 to 2005 [*Census 1990 - P011, Census 2000 –QT-P9, American Community Survey 2005 –Table B03002*] and to 11% between 2005 and 2007 [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005 and 2007-Table and B03002*]. Hispanic foreign born population was 56% in 2000, and increased to 61% in 2007 [*U.S. Census 2000, Summary File 4, Table PCT45, American Community Survey 2007, Table B06003&B06004*].
- Based on 2005-2007 estimates, by the national origin, Hispanics represented 53% Mexican, 5% Puerto Rican, 17% Cuban, 25% other Hispanic or Latino, which is distributed by 1% Dominican, 11% Central American, 10% South American and 3% All other Hispanic or Latino populations, of the total Hispanic Community [*American Community Survey 2005-2007 – B03001*].
- According to the Collier County Hispanic or Latino National Origin estimates between 2005-2007, Mexican population represented 13%, Puerto Rican 1%, Cuban 4%, Central American 3%, South American 3% and Other Hispanic or Latino 1% of the total Collier County population [*U.S. Census Bureau, American Community Survey 2005-2007, Table B03001*].

II. Demographic Profile Highlights of Hispanic or Latino

- According to the 2000 Census [*U.S. Census Bureau, Census 2000 Summary File (SF 2) and Summary File 4 (SF4)*]:
 - Males were 58% and females were 42% of the Hispanic population in Collier County.
 - Median Age was 26 in the Hispanic Community, compared to 44 in the total population of Collier County.

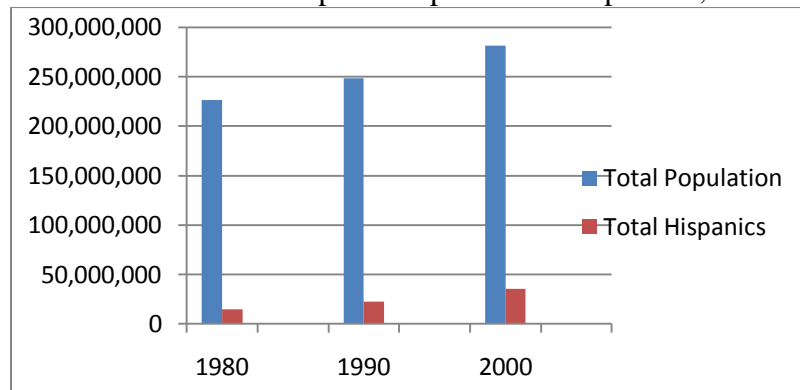

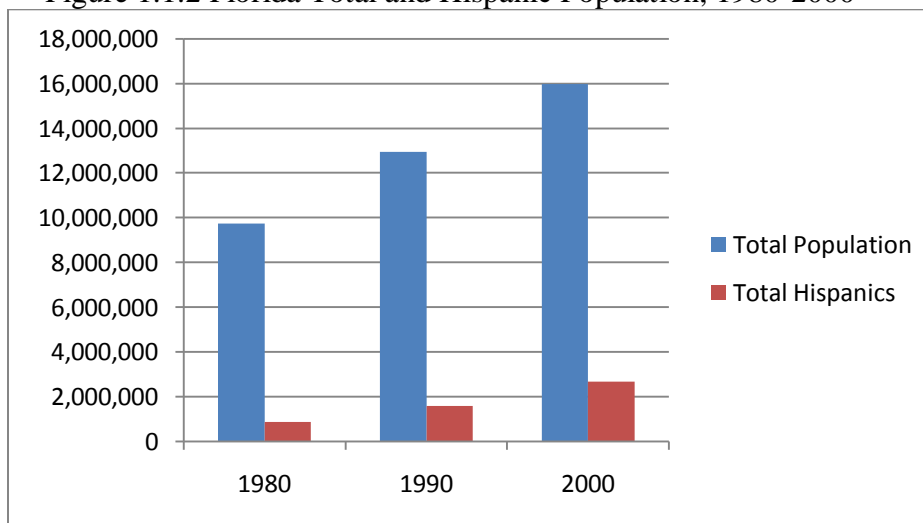

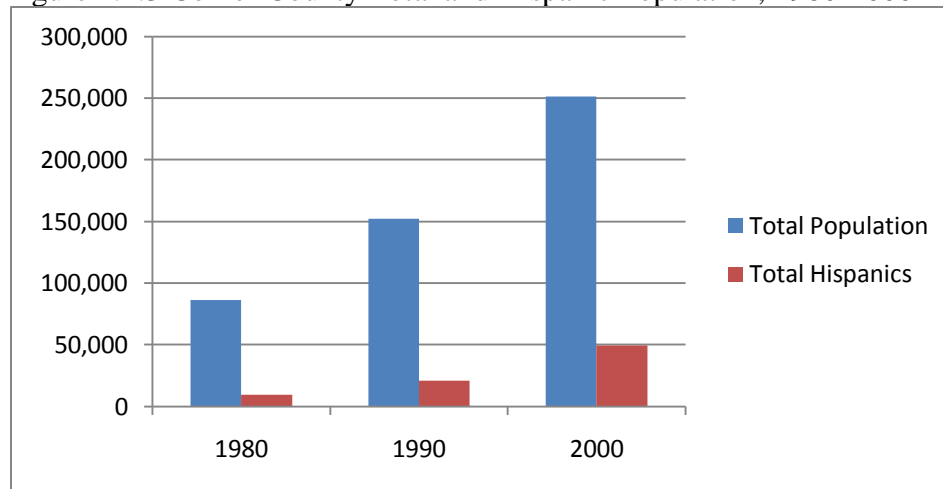

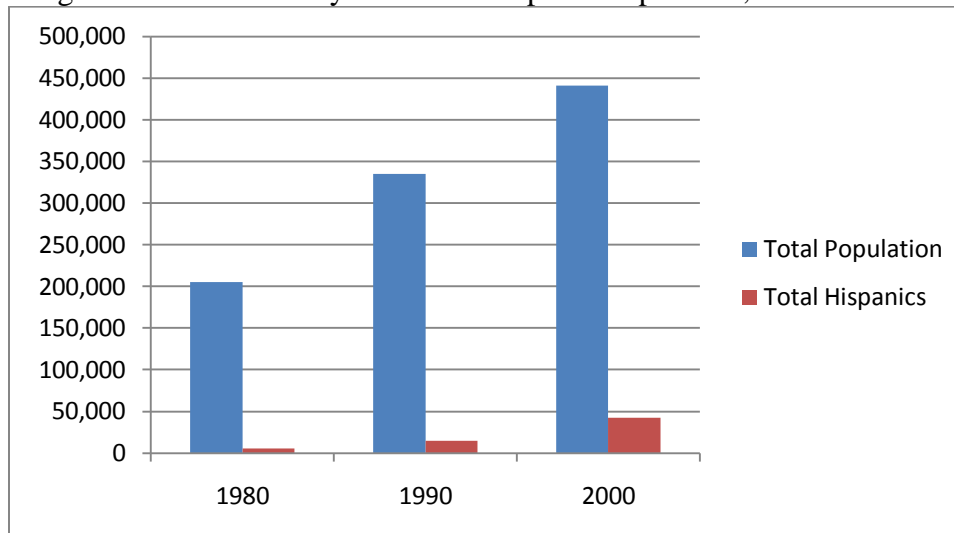

The United States of America is home to approximately 44,019,880 Hispanics, which number has more than doubled in just twenty years. One might attribute that growth to the abundant array in terms of diversity of origin of the Hispanic population. Table 1.2.1 discerns the many different origins of Hispanics; but for the purposes of this report we will be examining their relevant percentage change in regards to population. The Hispanic or Latino Origin with the greatest percentage change is Uruguayan, with 173.65% from the year 2000 to 2005; followed by Honduran and Guatemalan with 128.36% and 125.30%, respectively. It is also important to note that even though Uruguayans have the greatest percentage change; it is Mexicans that have a greater population density with 28,165,623 people. The second highest population density is Puerto Rican with 3,998,264 people, followed by Cuban with 1,535,236 people.

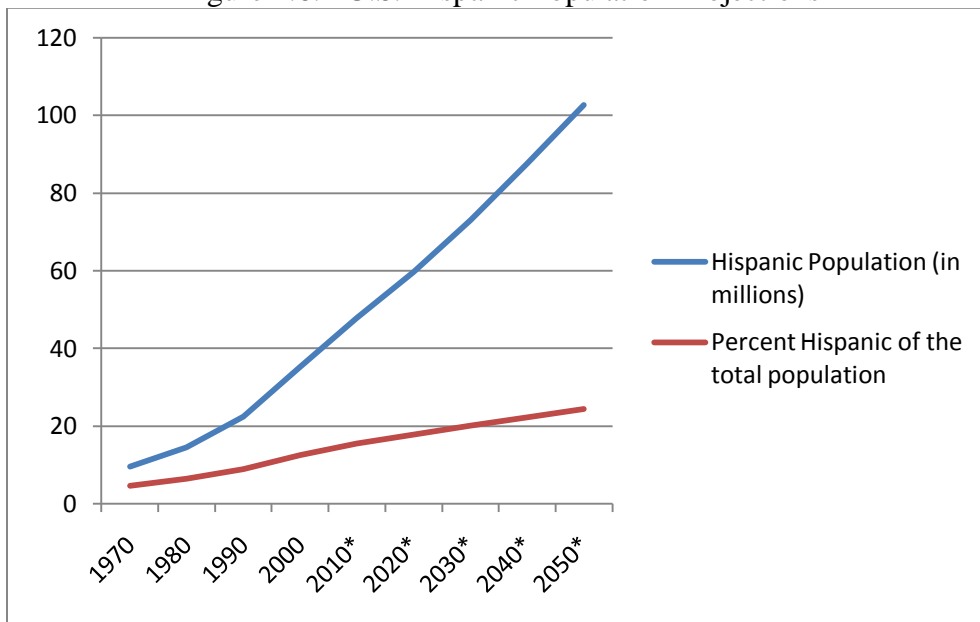

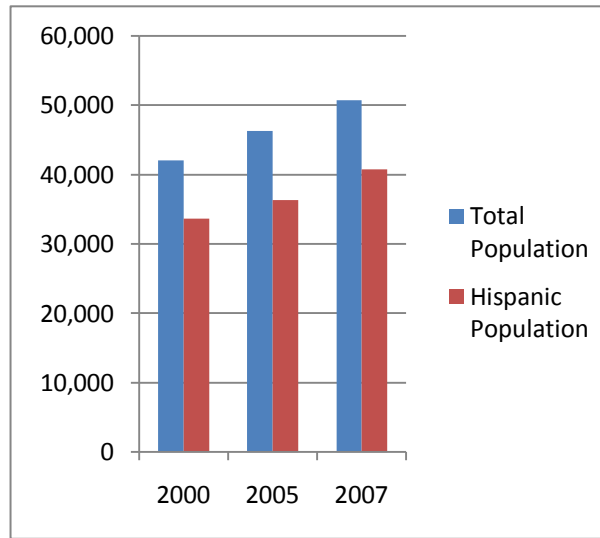

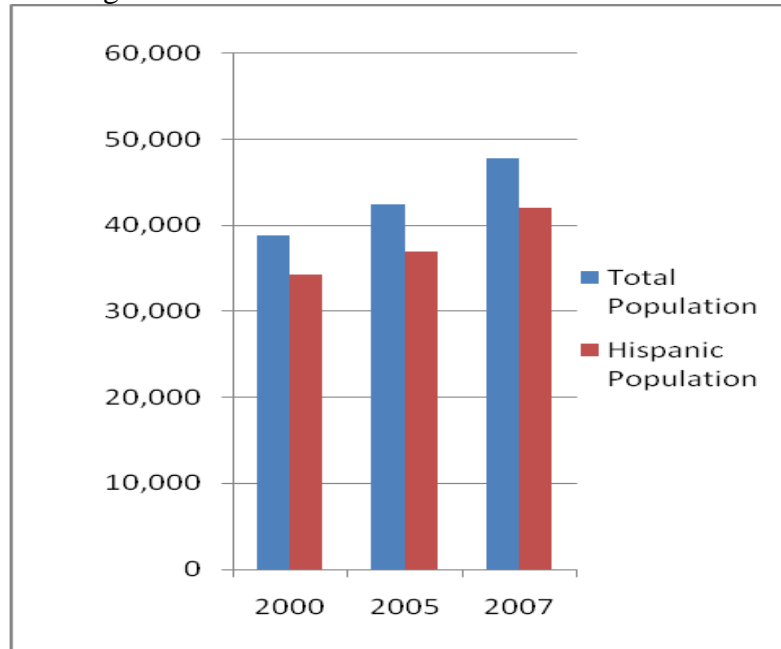

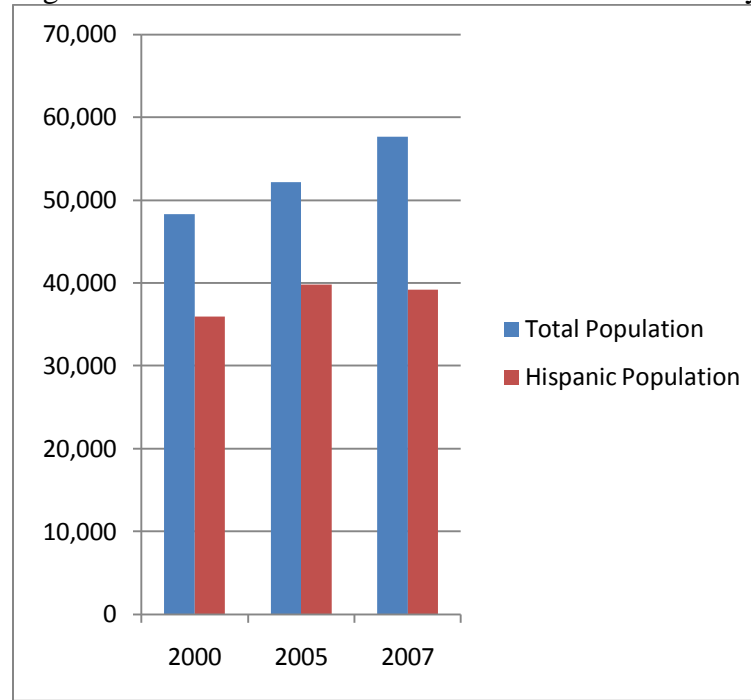

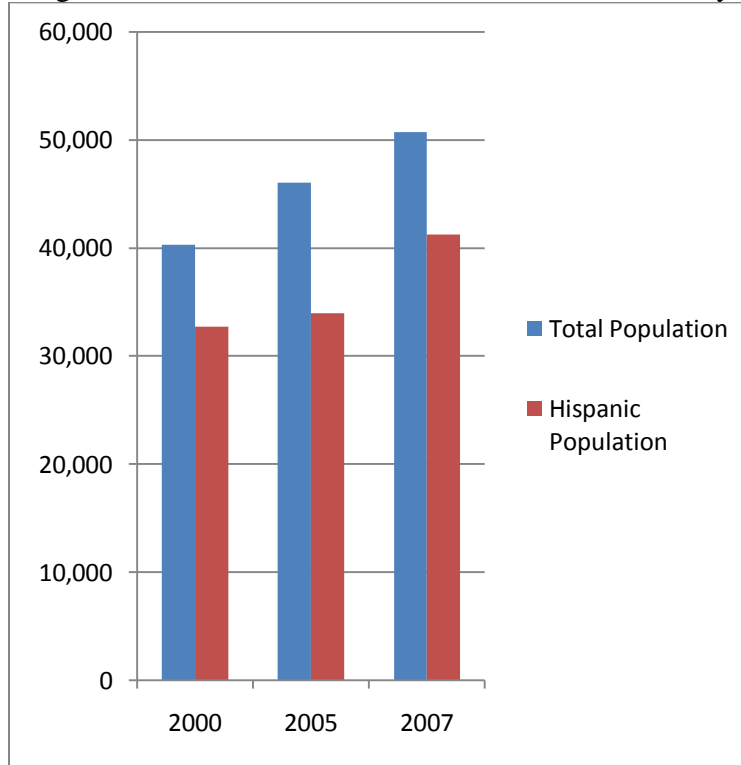

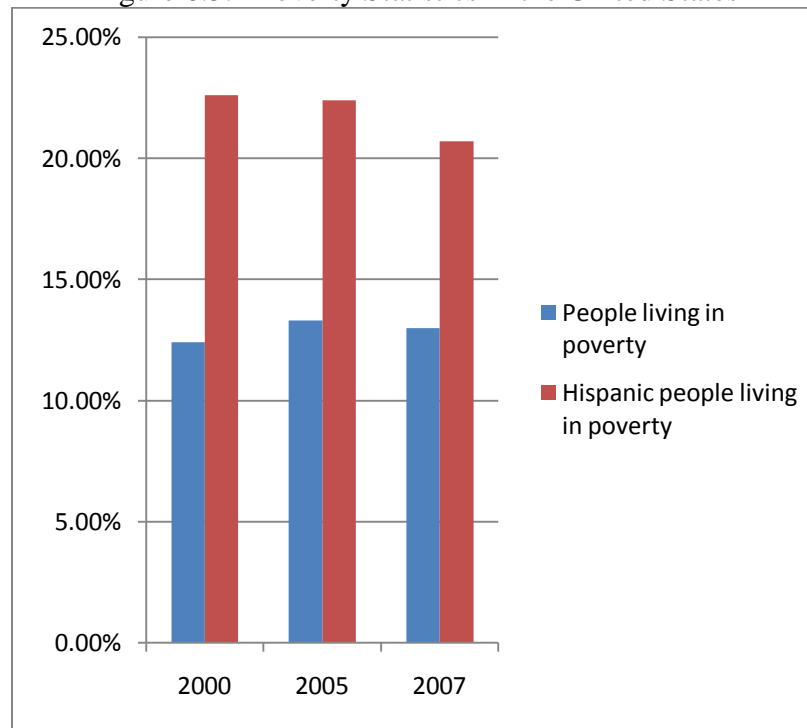

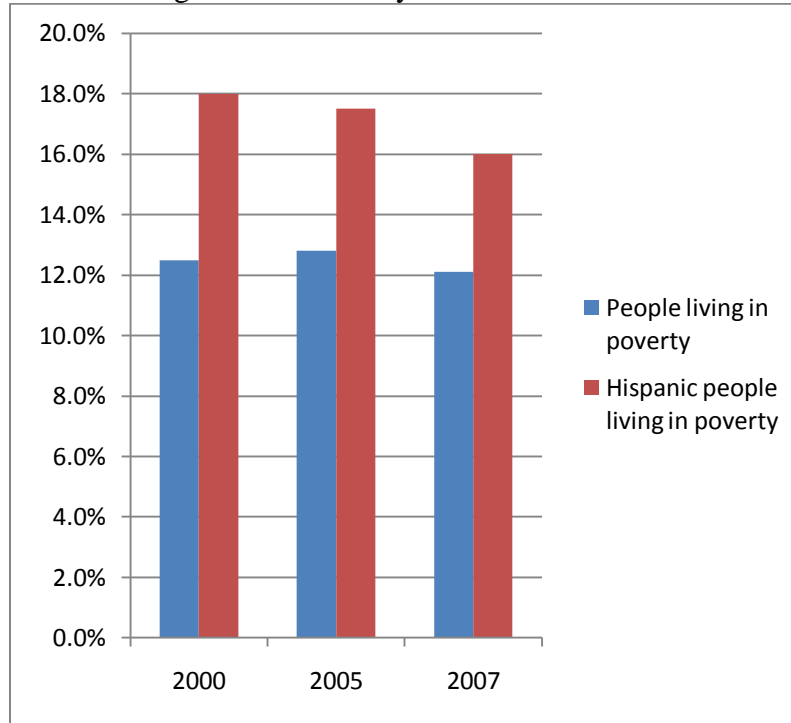

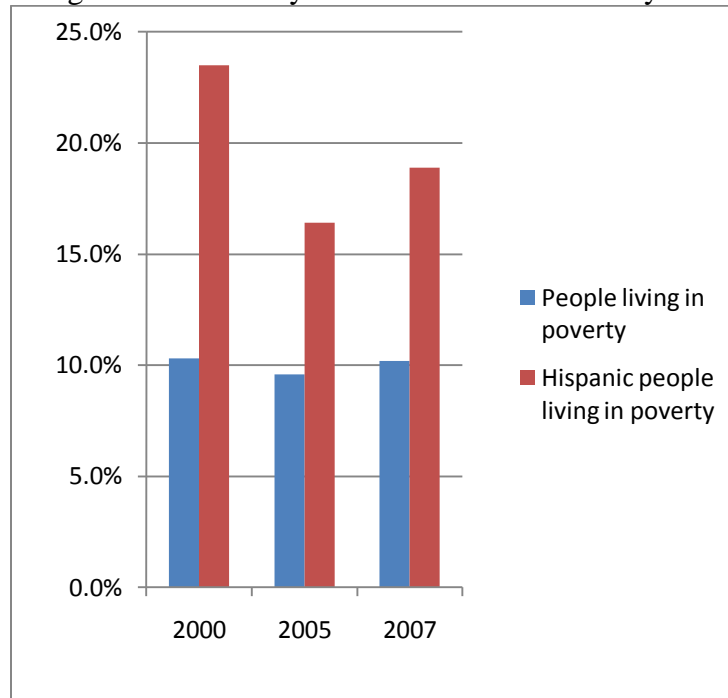

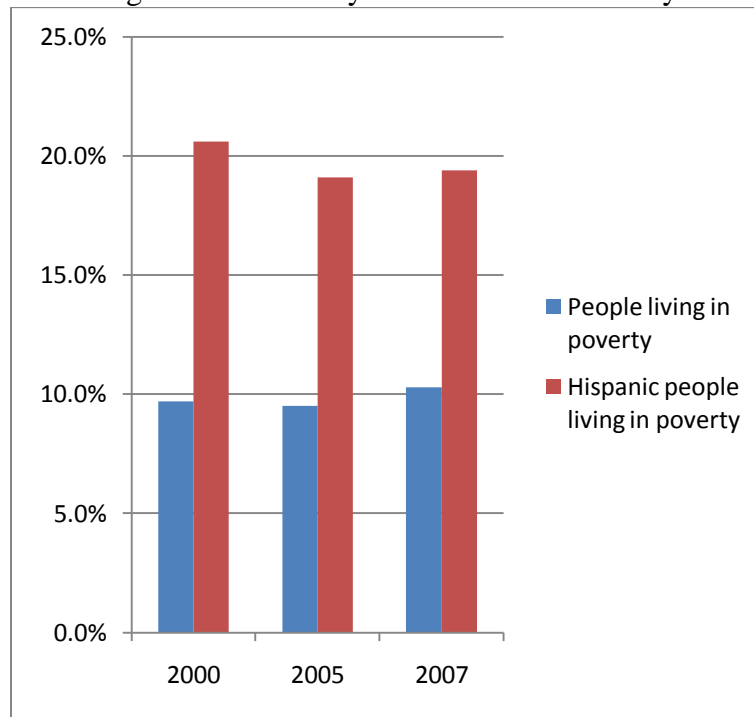
