RESUME OF PETER C. FREDERIKSEN

Peter C. Frederiksen was born in Bristol, England on October 15, 1943. He graduated from Clifton College in 1960, worked at Harvey's of Bristol (Wine Merchants) until 1964 and emigrated to the United States.

He graduated from Golden Gate College in 1967 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Economics, from California State University (San Francisco) in 1969 with a Master of Arts degree, and from Washington State University with a Doctor of Philosophy degree in 1974. Dr. Frederiksen's primary fields of specialization during graduate work were industrial organization, economic theory, and international economics. His dissertation dealt with the prospects for foreign competition in four major U. S. manufacturing oligopolies.



Professor Frederiksen joined the faculty of the Naval Postgraduate School in 1974, and is currently assigned to the Defense Resources Management Education Center. He is currently Assistant Director for Academic Programs. He was promoted to Associate Professor and granted academic tenure in 1980. While at the Center, Dr. Frederiksen has acted as visiting professor in the Department of National Security Affairs on two occasions. In May 1982, he was a visiting lecturer at the Royal Military College of Science in England and also at the Royal Danish Defence College.

His professional publications have appeared in the Intermountain Economic Review, The Antitrust Bulletin, Armed Forces Comptroller, Defense Management Journal, Economic Development and Cultural Change, Regional Studies, Texas Business Review, Journal of Developing Areas, Armed Forces and Society, and The International Journal of Transport Economics. He is a member of the Editorial Advisory Board of The Texas Business Review, and an article referee for the Journal of Developing Areas.

Dr. Frederiksen has been a California State Fellow, and is currently a member of the American, Western, and Atlantic Economic Associations.
