Alex W. Lam was born in Hong Kong. He received the B.S., M.S., and Ph.D. degrees in electrical and computer engineering from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, IL, in 1982, 1984, and 1987, respectively.

From August 1987 to August 1990, he was an Assistant Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. Since September 1990, he has been with the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, CA, where he is presently an Assistant Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering. His research interest has been in communication theory, spread-spectrum multiple-user communications, optical communications, coding theory, and digital signal processing.
