Hispanic Career Conference Successful

Grand Valley State University's Fifth Annual Hispanic Career Conference, held March 19 in cooperation with Muskegon Community College, drew more than 250 Hispanic students interested in learning about career choices.

The conference, held at the community college this year, was funded by the King-Chavez-Parks program. Mercedes Toohey, a counselor in GVSU's Educational Connections program, coordinated the event. Rick Thompson, director of the Lakeshore Center, and Helen Anderson, Minority Partnership coordinator, were members of the planning committee.

Grand Valley State's Hispanic student organization, El Renacimiento, contributed to career discussions and helped organize the conference. Participating faculty and staff included: Secundino Garcia, physical plant supervisor; Julia Guevara, visiting instructor of the School of Social Work; Carmen Nochera, assistant professor of health sciences; Christina Rodriguez, productions supervisor at WGVU/WGVK-TV; and Jill Sullivan, director of Educational Connections.

Faculty and Staff Sketches

Patricia Clark, assistant professor of English, had her poem "Bill of Sale" chosen by the Poetry Society of America as the 1989 winner of the Lucille Medwick Memorial Award.
